MANCHESTER- The two lots Jay Giles, public works director, has spotted for the construction of a twomillion gallon water tank are in the Brookside Acres subdivision off Ver-

Giles previously told The Herald he was negotiating with the owners of two potential sites but would not identify them. The potential sites are nearly opposite Scott Drive, Giles

The two sites should be less controversial than the first site he proposed as the nearest house is about 400 feet away from the tank.

Building the tank at 608 Vernon St. was strongly opposed by area residents who said the tank would be a "big concrete pillbox" stuck in the middle of the neighborhood. The Zoning Board of Appeals refused to grant the town's variance request for the tank, saying sufficient hardship could not be proven.

The 1.8 acre parcel on Vernon Street was left over from condominium construction of Green Manor Corp.

The two potential sites were discovered through Gile's map searching and the publicity surrounding the ZBA hearing. One of the lot owners contacted Giles after seeing the news accounts. The public works director said he



PARIS (UPI) - Henry Kissinger says he has no permanent job with the administration of President-elect Ronald Reagan, but he touched off a furor by flying to Paris for a private neeting with South Africa's foreign
