Bailey defends plea-bargaining

HARTFORD - The state's atorney Tuesday defended the pleabargaining in the Manchester irebombing of a black family's ome, but one of the victims today challenged the state's prosecution. Lucendia Harris, whose four children were in her Manchester nome the night it was firebombed said she plans to consult with her at torney to determine what appeal, it any, she might file against the state's

prosecution of a local suspect. The state Monday signed a six-page agreement with one white suspect in the Oct. 2 firebombing. Under terms of the agreement. Eugene R Gilliland Jr. pleaded guilty to a reduced charge of accessory to arson in return for his cooperation with state and federal attorneys who are prosecuting a second suspect.

'I plan to file a complaint all the way to the White House," Mrs. farris said. Her attorney is away on vacation but Harris said she would



Town officials to discuss plan for Meadows strike

Herald Reporter MANCHESTER - Directors of three town agencies will meet Thursday afternoon in the general manager's

at the Meadows Convalescent Home. The health care union representing workers at the Meadows has filed a Nov. 25 strike notice with the home's owners and federal labor officials. At the same time the town's assistant manager, Charles McCarthy, said th town has a "responsibility to oversee the delivery of

health services to needy residents." Expected to attend tomorrow's meeting are Police Chief Robert Lannan, Health Director Dr. Alice Turek, Human Services Director Hanna Marcus and Town Manager Robert Weiss.

Weiss said Tuesday the meeting had been arranged by the town health director, Dr. Turek. The state Health Department has been developing its own contingency plans to cope with similar strikes in 18 other homes across the state. McCarthy said the town health director had the copy of a report distributed by state health of Thayer Baldwin, director of health systems regulation

for the state, said last week the department was "realistically planning" for the strike but declined to comment on details of the plan. Chief Lannan yesterday said the police department's role would be that of maintaining order in the event of a strike. Lannan said strikers have the right to picket but at

the same time said the home's administrators have the

right to care for geriatric patients. Weiss said the town was concerned over the possible strike, and said the department heads would discuss their appropriate roles in the event of a strike. McCarthy said the town was preparing a response to "all sorts of contingencis." Should the strike come to

pass. McCarthy said people might bring their relatives Nurse union fights limit on picketing

WATERBURY (UPI) - The union representing 520 striking nurses at Waterbury Hospital has vowed to battle a court order aimed at limiting picket lines, while the facility pledged to see the temporary ruling made perma-

The nurses marched peacefully through the slush and snow Tuesday. Their union, Connecticut Health Care Associates, said the only troublemakers were officials of

the 515-bed hospital. Superior Court Judge Ronald Fracasse issued the ruling limiting the number of pickets after six persons. including two policemen, were hit by cars Monday in the first day of Connecticut's largest nurses' strike. Strikers ignored the limits most of Tuesday since the union hadn't been served formal notice of the order by sheriffs. The union also said it would seek to have the ac-

tion-revoked at a hearing scheduled for Thursday. "My impression is that we'll be having a hearing date on Thursday at which time we'll press for that to be lifted," said Robert Rinker, the union's field organizer. "The picketing up there has been peaceful.

"The only commotion that's been caused was caused by the hospital management," he said, referring to the arrest Monday of the hospital's public affairs director for allegedly striking two policemen and a picket when he drove through a picket line.

No new talks were scheduled and both sides admitted they were far apart on several issues, including wages. pensions and non-economic contract items. Administrator Richard Derr said the hospital will seek a permanent version of Fracasse's order, which limited to six the number of pickets allowed outside each of five entrances and to 12 the number at the main entrance. "With the restraining order I think things will be much



Review deadline waived HARTFORD- Veterans Administration chief Max Cleland said applications and a free information

has been waived until April 1, 1981, giving these veterans hranch of service. an extra six months to apply.

Cleland said applications for a discharge review, or for correction of a veteran's records, may lead to eligibility for VA benefits in cases where former servicemen and women were previously ineligible.

VA benefits eligibility is based upon discharges from the service under conditions other than dishonorable. Cleland said, however, that upgraded discharges do not lead automatically, in all instances, to eligibility. For example, discharges awarded as a result of unauthorized absence in excess of 180 days can result in ineligibility for VA benefits regardless of discharge review

Boards for the Correction of Military Records, or VA itself, may assist veterans to overcome this restriction if the veteran can show compelling circumstances is extenuation of such absence. Discharge Review Boards and Correction Boards are

maintained by the Army, Air Force and the Navy, and applications for such reviews may be obtained from any VA regional office and from national veterans service organizations in each community.

when the public defender's office said it could not represent Thomas because of a conflict of interest. Thomas, of Los Angeles, was charged with shooting and killing Miss Ribicoff during a robbery outside a Venice restaurant last week. Miss Ribicoff, an editorial writer for the Los Angeles

Herald Examiner, and a companion were approached by two men as they left the restaurant following dinner. The two men robbed the companion, John Shoven, of his wallet and one of them shot Miss Ribicoff in the chest. She died at the scene Police are looking for the second robber.

The capital charge against Thomas carries with it a "special circumstance" - murder committed during a robbery - which could lead to a death sentence for Thomas if he is convicted. Thomas remained in custody without bail.

FBI helped oust Vesco

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The FBI says it may have helped convince the Bahamian government to oust fugitive Robert Vesco by providing intelligence information alleging he has dealt in drugs and tried to bribe U.S.

With Vesco ordered to leave the islands by Dec. 11, the bureau now will try to find a way to force his return to the United States to face long-pending criminal charges. Reached in the Bahamas Tuesday, Vesco said the administration was engaged in "the last desperate efforts

Of the drug-dealing allegations, he said, "Anything they have is something they've manufactured." Vesco. 44, has been dodging prosecutors for eight years, avoiding trials on charges he gave Richard Nixon an illegal \$250,000 campaign contribution and plundered a mutual fund of \$224 million. In a move that apparently came as a surprise to the

Justice Department, Clement Maynard, Bahamian minister of home affairs, disclosed Monday Vesco has been ordered to leave his Nassau hideaway by Dec. 11 or face deportation.
