### Sentencing delayed

**HARTFORD (UPI)** — Sentencing for the first defendant to plead guilty to charges in the New Britain municipal corruption scandal has been delayed until early next year, court officials say.

Frederick P. Haddad, who was due in court for sentencing Monday, had his case on three counts of conspiracy to commit bribery and one count of perjury continued until Feb. 10, the Superior Court clerk's office said.

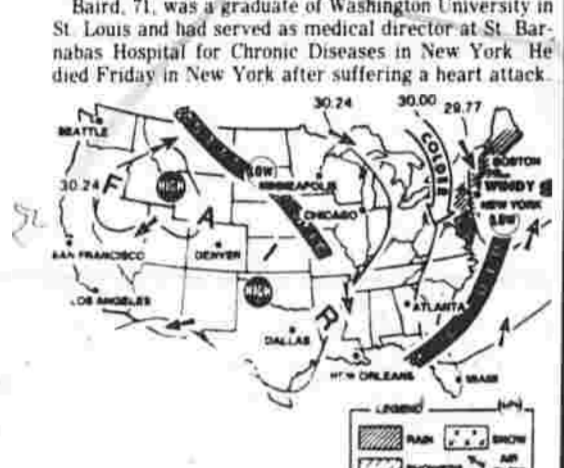
Haddad, a former chairman of the New Britain Civil Service Commission, was the first of 24 persons charged in the alleged sale of municipal promotions to plead guilty to charges. He entered the plea on Sept. 20.

He was originally scheduled to be sentenced on Nov. 2, but the case was continued to allow him to testify in a trial stemming from the scandal. His possible testimony at another trial in the scandal was believed the reason for Monday's delay.

## Doctors awaiting results of latest Grasso tests

**HARTFORD (UPI)** — Doctors awaited test results today to determine if nausea afflicting Gov. Ella Grasso was related to liver cancer which led to her decision to resign at the end of the month.

Mrs. Grasso had been X-rayed immediately after her admission but results of the tests would probably not be known until today, he said. She was released from the hospital last week routine tests during treatment of phlebitis indicated that Mrs. Grasso, the nation's first woman governor to be elected without succeeding her husband, had cancer of the liver.

Hospital spokesmen James Battaglio said the Democratic governor was admitted at her request Monday for "a diagnostic evaluation of a possible gastro-intestinal problem following three days of nausea."

He said the governor, who announced plans Thursday to cut her second term in half effective Dec. 31, was feeling better by Monday afternoon and would remain in the hospital "for a few days anyway."

**WASHINGTON (UPI)** — With proponents struggling to hold together a fragile alliance, the fair housing bill that has kept the Senate paralyzed for days comes up for a crucial test.

Democratic leader Robert Byrd, D-W.Va., scheduled the test vote for today. It could either keep the debate going or kill the House-passed bill outright and bring the lame duck 96th Congress closer to adjournment.

## Dilemma of discounts

**HARTFORD (UPI)** — Owners of all-electric homes have claimed they are being unfairly penalized by an energy-saving decision to eliminate discounts for large residential electricity users.

A group called Connecticut Electrical Consumer Alliance met Monday with state legislators to fight what they called the Department of Public Utility Control's discriminatory decision.

The DPUC ordered Northeast Utilities to abolish the discount, or declining block rate, saying it encouraged wasting electricity.

The huge utility told its 70,000 electric heat customers their monthly bills may increase by more than 40 percent this winter — and many customers were angered.

"We are the ones who supported the utilities over the last 15 years and yet they are slapping it on us because we did this," said homeowner Paul Masley of Ellington.

"We were locked in and all of a sudden they're changing the ground rules on us," he said.

Rep. William Rogers, R-Southbury, said several of his constituents living in all electric heat homes felt they were "being penalized."

Herb Ask, an electrical engineer, said the small electric users were being subsidized while the electric heat customer bore all the burden.

## Murder suspect bought gun in Hawaii

**HONOLULU, Hawaii (UPI)** — An unemployed security guard bought a .38-caliber handgun in Hawaii six weeks before his arrest in the slaying of former Beatle John Lennon outside the musician's New York City apartment, police said.

Honolulu police said Mark David Chapman, 25, applied for a gun permit in October and bought the weapon at a shop just a block away from the Honolulu police station.

Chapman had no criminal record, so the permit was granted, police said.

Chapman, who lived in Alabama at one time, bought what police described as a Charter Arms undercover handgun, similar to the Smith & Wesson short-barreled "Chief's Special" used by police detectives.

The suspect, described as a "wacko" by New York City Chief of Detectives James Sullivan, lived with his wife in the high-rise Kukul Plaza.

Mrs. Chapman, who spoke with reporters by phone and from behind the closed door of her apartment, said her husband had lived in Hawaii for four years, was unemployed and out of town but would not say where. She said she had heard of the shooting but had not been contacted by police.

Lennon, 40, was shot five times in front of his home, the Dakota cooperative apartments on Manhattan's Upper West Side, as he stepped out his limousine after a recording session late Monday. His wife, Yoko Ono, was with him but was not hurt.

Police said the young man apparently had been stalking Lennon for days and had asked for his autograph a few hours earlier.

Chapman was described in the police firearm purchase records as 5-foot-11, 195 pounds with brown hair and blue eyes.

Police said Chapman obtained a drivers license in the island state in 1977 and originally lived in nearby Kauai. Police did not know when he moved to Honolulu but said he complained of a burglary in his apartment in August.

Bob Connell, manager of the complex, said Chapman and his wife had lived there for a year and a half.

He said Chapman had worked as a security guard for Freeman Guards Inc., liked "nappings and stuff like that" and had just bought a popular Salvador Dali painting.

Upon learning the suspect was from Hawaii, a local fireman said, "It kind of makes us look bad. A lot of people come here to live, but they're not from Hawaii. Not real."

The news director of a Honolulu radio station said, "People call and ask, 'Why do you tell that he's from Hawaii?' and I tell them, cause it's news, that's what."

**WASHINGTON (UPI)** — With proponents struggling to hold together a fragile alliance, the fair housing bill that has kept the Senate paralyzed for days comes up for a crucial test.

Democratic leader Robert Byrd, D-W.Va., scheduled the test vote for today. It could either keep the debate going or kill the House-passed bill outright and bring the lame duck 96th Congress closer to adjournment.

Supporters of the bill met Monday night with a handful of wavering senators in an effort to keep alive the fair housing enforcement bill, the most significant civil rights legislation of the waning congressional session.

They scheduled another meeting today. "It's close," Sen. Edward Kennedy, D-Mass., said Monday in assessing the bill's chance for survival. "There are still about a half dozen senators who haven't made up their minds. They are the decisive ones."

Kennedy, Byrd and other supporters of the bill met with a group of moderate Southern senators who threatened to withdraw their support unless the enforcement mechanism was modified.

The senators, who had joined with liberals and supported a move to block a filibuster by conservatives last week, included Bennett Johnston, D-La.; David Boren, D-Okla.; Howell Heflin, D-Ala.; and Jim Sasser, D-Tenn.

Boren told reporters the talks had not broken down. "I'm still hopeful," he said.

The group's concern was that the Department of Housing and Urban Development would play too great a role in enforcing the 1968 Fair Housing Act against discrimination in housing.

They apparently hoped to reach a compromise with their more liberal colleagues that would allow the courts, rather than the executive branch, to play the greater role.

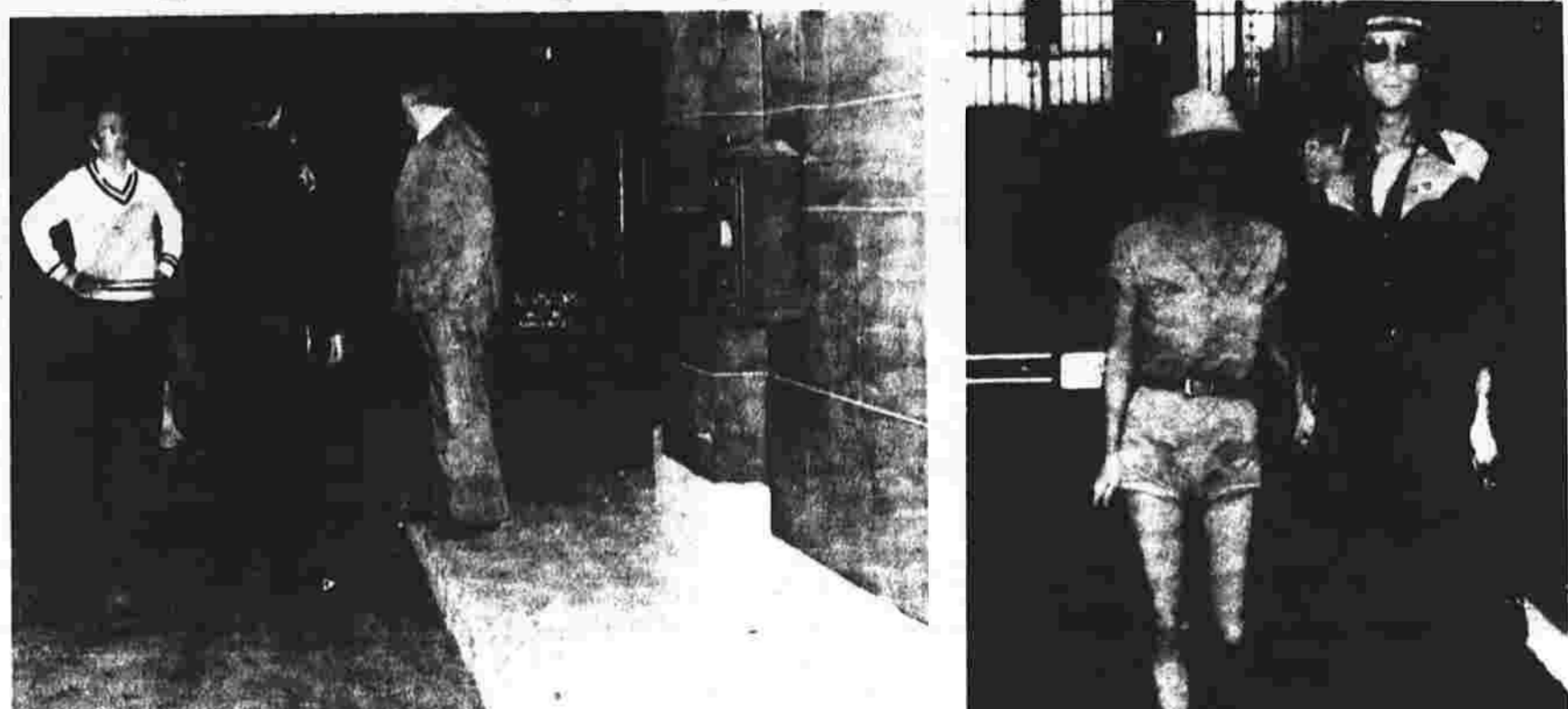

## State mourns Lennon

**HARTFORD (UPI)** — Sobbing, disbelieving fans flooded Connecticut radio stations with calls while disc jockeys sent two decades of Beatles music over the air waves eulogizing slain rock star John Lennon.

Stations across the state reported being swamped with callers who pleaded with them to tell them the ex-Beatle hadn't been gunned down Monday night.

Carol Lanquette, news director for WHCN-FM in Hartford, said callers pleaded, "Tell me it's not true. You've got to be lying to me. People have been sobbing and crying." "It's a state of shock," said Lanquette. "That's the best way I can describe it."

A number of broadcasters compared public grief to the assassination of President John Kennedy. "People are saying it's like when Kennedy was shot," said disc jockey Peter Delloro of WHCN. "There's a feeling of incredible despair."

"One guy called and said he wanted the telephone number of New York police so he could hunt down the guy that did it."

"They just can't believe it," said Delloro. "They don't want to believe it."

They celebrate Ronald Reagan's victory with fireworks in Central America.

Elsewhere in Latin America, elation was not so exuberantly public but, in the inner authoritarian circles that run the governments of most of the region, no less heartfelt. The Republican victory in the American election has been widely read as writing finis to the emphasis on human rights and political liberalization that dominated Latin policy during the Carter administration.

With excellent reason on the part of the generals who run many of those governments and are doing the reading, The President-elect made a frequent campaign point of criticizing the Carter policy. His view that the "people" of Nicaragua should be assisted in replacing the present revolutionary government was nailed into the

Republican platform. He reaffirmed his belief that the United States should not "turn away from some country because here and there they do not totally agree with our concept of human rights."

As promising as the future looks to the Latin juntas, they are not biding their time until it officially arrives on Jan. 20. There are signs that a drive is already under way to cripple if not eliminate the liberal and leftist opposition before the new administration takes over in Washington.

This is particularly apparent in Central America where military operations are being stepped up in Guatemala. And in El Salvador, a "here and there" where a largely right-wing terror campaign has taken some 9,000 lives so far this year, the extremist military faction that increasingly con-

WASHINGTON - NEA - Largely overlooked in news reports about the 52 Americans taken hostage 13 months ago at the U.S. Embassy in Tehran is the fact that the Iranians are holding a 53rd American captive.

She is Cynthia Brown Dwyer, who to the best of anyone's knowledge has been confined to an Iranian prison for the past seven months. She appears to have simply been the wrong person in the wrong place at exactly the wrong time.

It's a long way from the quiet tree-lined street in Buffalo, N.Y., where Mrs. Dwyer lived with her husband and three children to the teeming jail

outside Tehran where she is presumably being held.

Mrs. Dwyer, a full-time homemaker who frequently wrote for the Humanist magazine. Her husband, John, an English professor at Buffalo State University. The couple was popular on campus.

Mrs. Dwyer is said to have been associated with Iran's Islamic Revolution and to have spoken in glowing terms of the Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini.

She thought the media was missing the real story in Iran by concentrating on the hostages and their revolutionary guards. The real story, she often said, concerned the com-

pany she is being held. Since her situation is so different, we have no idea if she might be released with the other hostages or whether she will continue to be held.

But as far as her husband and her children are concerned, Cynthia Dwyer is as much a hostage as the other 52. The Dwyers' suffering is no different than that of the other hostage families.

"The children miss her quite a bit," says Dwyer. "I do what I can, but obviously there is so much more I hope and pray she will come home. She is not an employee of the U.S. government. We don't even know

### Washington Merry-Go-Round

#### Will Reagan alter U.S. policy if Ulster violence explodes?

WASHINGTON - Genealoists have traced Ronald Reagan's family tree back to King Brian of Ireland - a royal distinction the president-elect shares with virtually every Irish-American of whatever social or political eminence.

What makes Reagan's heritage interesting is that his parents were married in a Roman Catholic ceremony but his mother had been raised as Protestant and saw to it that her children were also brought up as Protestants.

Thus the new president is, in effect, a personal embodiment of the religious conflict that has torn Northern Ireland for centuries; and underlies the bloody battle that has gripped the six northern counties of Ireland for the past decade.

One of the first foreign policy problems that King Brian's descendant will have to come to grips with is whether or not to reverse Jimmy Carter's hands-off policy toward Ulster. Reagan will take office at a time when tension is building and the conflict could once again explode in a

rescendo of violence.

At the heart of the renewed turbulence, which includes provocative political demonstrations and vicious assassinations, is a controversial wing of the Long Kesh "Maz" prison near Belfast. Known as I-Block, it is the scene of a determined hunger strike by seven Irish Republican Army protesters which has now lasted a month.

Last year I reported how 350 Irish Republican Army members and sympathizers - called "blanket men" for their refusal to wear prison uniforms - conducted a "filthy protest" by spreading excrement on the walls of their fetid cells.

The long-haired, bearded protesters, mired in their own waste in the midst of a modern prison, claimed they were political prisoners and deserved that status, which the British reserved in 1976. British officials now privately concede they blundered when they originally granted special political status.

My associate Jack Mitchell was refused admittance to the I-Block, but, from outside sources, he pieced together the story of the stubborn refusal of either side to compromise. The calculated off-duty killing of 17 prison guards by IRA gunmen over

the past two years have turned an already tense situation into an almost unbearable one.

In a desperate, last-ditch attempt to gain international attention for their cause of a unified Ireland, the IRA leaders have ordered seven fanatical partisans in I-Block to starve themselves to death.

Equally hard-nosed, Britain's conservative prime minister, Margaret Thatcher, has taken a tough line against the "I-Block Seven."

The hunger strikers will get medical attention and "concessions" such as are necessary, "in the words of Britain's minister for Northern Ireland, Hugh Rossi. But the prisoners will not be forced, nor will the British be budged on the issue of political status for convicted terrorists. "The choice must be theirs," insisted Rossi.

Although seemingly caught in a no-win situation, the British are far from faultless. Earlier this year, the European Commission on Human Rights rejected the protesters' claim for political status as unjustified, but lashed out at the British for not trying hard enough to find a solution to the 60-year dilemma.

The Beatles were the more dramatic - than Elvis Presley's first appearance on the same popular than Jesus' "Consider their impact on the era, he had a persuasive argument.

What is called "The 60s" really began in 1963 with the dawn of Beatlemania.

The Beatles played music no one else was playing, in a way no one else was playing it. They didn't even look like anyone else. And they became the single most important influence on the youth of the time.

And they had long hair. Eventually, so did millions of teen-age boys.

The soul of the Beatles was Lennon, even though he shared top billing with McCartney. As the group grew, it was clear that Lennon was behind that growth.

The first major change came in 1965 with the album "Rubber Soul," laced with puzzling lyrics, more complicated instrumentation and even the screaming, weeping teenage girls but also the musical establishment. As American composer Aaron Copland noted, "When people ask to re-create the mood of the 1960s, they will play Beatles music."

Their arrival in the United States created a sensation that temporarily overshadowed American rock 'n' roll stars. Teen-age girls in America as well as in England, screamed, cried and fainted during their concerts.

Their appearance on "The Ed Sullivan Show" interest in Eastern music was only one manifestation of the group's interest in Eastern thought that led them to create "Revolver" and even more revolutionary "Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band," perhaps the most important rock album ever recorded.

By this point the Beatles had stopped touring. "Sgt. Pepper" was clearly influenced by the band's use of hallucinogenic drugs.

"There were many reasons," Lennon told Playboy magazine in explaining his change in lifestyle.

"I had been under obligation or contract from the time I was 22 until well into my 30s," he said. "After all those years it was all I knew. I wasn't free. I was boxed in."

"My contract was the physical manifestation of being in prison... I chose not to take the standard options in my business, going to Vegas and singing your great hits, if you're lucky, or going to hell, which is where Elvis went."

"The youth culture figure who turned 40 on Oct. 9, recently recorded and released his first album in years, "Double Fantasy," featuring both Lennon and Miss Ono.

And last Tuesday, his producer said, he put the finishing touches on yet another album.

## Exodus from Manchester shown in decade figures

More people have moved out of Manchester than into it in the past ten years and the same is true of Andover, Coventry, East Hartford, Hartford and Vernon.

Just the opposite is true of Bolton, Columbia Ellington, Glastonbury, South Windsor, Tolland and Hebron. Those population change conclusions are part of a study conducted by the Connecticut Public Expenditures Council, which determined that the state as a whole had a net out-migration of 2 per cent in the 1970's.

The study indicated that in 1970 Manchester had a population of 47,994, that 6,496 persons were born during the decade, that 4,352 died, and 336 more left town than came to it, leaving an estimated population in 1980 of 49,802.

Here are the comparable figures for Hartford and for other towns in the area:  
Hartford 158,017 in 1970 with 28,597 births, 15,622 deaths, and 32,528 net out-migration for a 1980 estimated population of 156,319.  
Andover 2,909 in 1970, 273 births, 134 deaths, 94 net out-migration; 2,144 now.  
Coventry 8,146 in 1970, 1,226 births, 462 deaths, 14 net out-migration; 8,890 now.  
East Hartford 57,583 in 1970, 6,936 births, 4,239 deaths, 7,726 net out-migration; 52,594 now.  
Vernon 27,237 in 1970, 4,961 births, 1,809 deaths, 2,382 net out-migration; 28,007 now.

## The end of a musical era begins

A wave of Beatles music resounded across the country today, slight solace for tearful fans who felt John Lennon's death marked "the end of an era."

The news of Lennon's shooting Monday night spread fast. Many people were stunned — unwilling to believe the electrifying and irreverent '60s songwriter and performer was dead.

Station switchboards were jammed with calls from fans pleading, "Tell me it's not true... It can't be true."

"Oh no! Jesus God, oh Jesus God no!" cried a young man who phoned the UPI Frankfurt, Ky., bureau.

London music publisher Dick James, who first signed the Beatles, was having a morning cup of tea at his home in London when the phone rang with the news of Lennon's death.

"It's not possible," he said, shocked. "What a great loss to popular music. He was a genius in his way and together with McCartney gave the world a good deal of the music it will still be playing in the next century."

## Liverpool has no plans for Lennon memorial

LIVERPOOL, England (UPI) - The dour working people of the grimy industrial seaport home of the Beatles and their "Liverpool sound" have not come up with the money for a statue to immortalize the group, and John Lennon's slaying is unlikely to change them, city fathers said today.

The city's major newspaper, the Post and Echo, which normally publishes in the afternoon, brought out a special edition this morning, but although the city council is going ahead with a plan to name a new welfare housing project after Paul McCartney, Liverpool has no plans for any memorial ceremony for Lennon.

"There will be no civic ceremony," city spokesman David Marlow said. "Why the reluctance to pay homage to the young men from Liverpool who revolutionized popular music?"

"There has been criticism of them," Marlow said. "They did not always make the best impression. And there is a feeling they did not do something for the city."

But to mark the 100th anniversary this year of its incorporation as a city, the council did not explain why it chose McCartney to honor rather than all the Beatles.

The city, which sits at the head of the Mersey River facing the Irish Sea, has prided itself in the world-wide reputation of its favorite sons, but city officials see no sign that people are going to raise \$60,000 to erect a statue proposed more than three years ago.

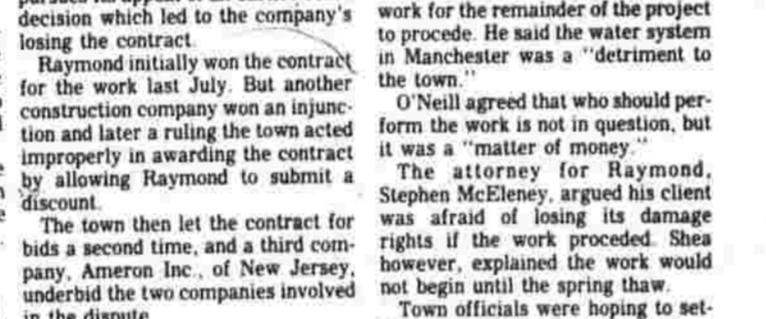

# Cardinals after Bruce Sutter

DALLAS (UPI) — The St. Louis Cardinals are still trying to put together a package for relief pitcher Bruce Sutter and Commissioner Bowie Kuhn is still of the opinion that the free agent marketplace is driving baseball to a hazy future.

Which means they were fairly routine at the winter baseball meetings Monday.

Following an early state of trading activity, including the biggest deal ever cooked up involving the San Diego Padres, the shopping slowed in a hurry.

But the Cardinals, who had already signed free agent Darrell Porter and dealt seven players away to the Padres, hoped they were not through yet.

The Cardinals and the Cubs have apparently agreed privately to a deal

in which Sutter, the former Cy Young winner, would go to St. Louis in exchange for third baseman Ken Reitz, outfielder Leon Durham and infielder Ty Waller.

Sutter, 27, has been on top of the Cardinals' shopping list for some time. He saved 37 games for the Cubs in 1979 and won the Cy Young Award and led the National League again last year with 29 saves.

Reitz initially vetoed the trade but now has decided to accept the move if he is rewarded with a signing bonus in the range of \$150,000 to \$200,000, the Chicago Tribune said in today's edition. The two clubs tentatively agreed to split the bonus and deal seven players away to the Padres, hoped they were not through yet.

The prime official business Monday was the draft of minor league players and Kuhn's annual assessment on the state of baseball.

Kuhn, in brief, said baseball's state was bad.

The commissioner said a firm of certified public accountants had assisted his office in studying the financial statements of baseball's 26 franchises in order to make some "conservative projections for the years immediately ahead."

"The results are not encouraging," he said.

"The analysis shows that even before free agency, player salaries were increasing at a more rapid rate than revenues. With the onset of free agency in 1976 this continued. The percent of increase in player compensation has been running nearly double that of operating revenues."

"For the seasons 1974 through 1979 baseball's operating statements have reflected a combined loss before in-

come taxes amounting to many millions of dollars. During 1979, only 11 of our clubs operated in the black. Published reports show that the Atlanta Braves, for instance, lost \$3.4 million in the last fiscal year.

"These figures are disturbing because they are not what is normally seen. It can't be that the simple reason that most of the clubs have behaved quite rationally. But there will be no solution until the players, along with the clubs, recognize that corrections in the system must be made.

"If that light doesn't begin to shine, soon a lot of players, and especially those who are not in the financial loss, are going to be among the financial losses."

"There does come a point where the most buoyant urge to win must give ground to sanity. I think that time has come."

Other than the San Diego-St. Louis deal — in which relief pitcher Rolfe Fingers and catcher Terry Kennedy were the main names — Houston traded away third baseman Enos Cabell to San Francisco, chiefly in exchange for left-handed pitcher Bob Knepfer.

In addition, the Astros released veteran second baseman Joe Morgan so he can make a deal for himself with another club.

There were 18 players taken in the draft of minor league players in the most selected since 1969. Jodie Davis, a catcher from Springfield, was the No. 1 player selected — chosen by the Chicago Cubs. Four other players were selected off the Philadelphia Phillies' Oklahoma City farm team.

# Kuhn issues warning franchises in trouble

DALLAS (UPI) — Baseball Commissioner Bowie Kuhn warned Monday the sport's 26 franchises could lose 10 times as much money during the next five years as they did in the previous five and that club owners and players needed to recognize a trend could not continue.

"The buoyant urge to win must give way to sanity," said Kuhn. "I think that time has come."

Kuhn's remarks came in his annual "state of the sport" address at baseball's winter meetings. He painted a gloomy portrait of the financial condition of baseball backed up by a study ordered from an accounting firm.

"The undeniable fact is that the game has tough problems," Kuhn said.

Kuhn's chief target as usual, was the free agent market and the changes he feels it has made on baseball. To offset the escalating cost of player contracts, Kuhn said, an agreement must be reached concerning compensation to teams that have lost players as free agents.

"There are those who argue that increased revenues and increased ticket prices are enough to cover increased operating expenses," the commissioner said. "That is not so."

His analysis shows that from 1974 to 1979 the combined loss of the franchises ran into the many millions of dollars. There is one report that the Atlanta Braves lost \$3.4 million in their last fiscal year.

And even more disturbing is the study of potential profit and loss for the years ahead.

"For the five-year period of 1980-1984, the projected loss of the major league clubs is nearly 10 times greater than the total loss in the preceding five years. The projected compensation for the average player in the major leagues in 1984 is \$320,000.

"Unless it is discovered under second base or some other miracle comes along, what is to become of the cost of the family-sized ticket? Our current average ticket price of \$4.50 is the best buy in entertainment in the country."

Although Kuhn did not identify any club other than Atlanta, he said 11 franchises made money last season. But on top of that, he said, he was concerned about the competitive balance of the sport.

"More and more you hear players saying, 'there are only certain clubs I will play for,' or 'I don't want to go there because they aren't a contender,'" Kuhn said. "Who is to blame? Not the players. The system is to blame and it is time the system was changed."

He said compromise on some sort of compensation was vital to the continued growth of the sport.

"People must recognize that if there are no changes, then the players as well as the clubs will be the losers," he said.

"And we can no longer count on new owners coming along and bailing out clubs. The economies will not make it feasible."

On the positive side, Kuhn said, was the continued increase in attendance and the popularity of television baseball coverage.

"There were 140 million who followed the television coverage of the World Series," said Kuhn. "That's two-thirds of the population of this country."

It was the 53rd World Cup victory for Stenmark, who is aiming this year to beat the record 63 wins held by Austria's Anne-Marie Moser-Pierrat.

Stenmark now shares the lead in the overall World Cup standings with 11 Spess of Australia, who won the season's opening downhill at Val d'Isere, France, last week. Both have 25 points.

Stenmark is unlikely to hold the No. 1 spot for long, however, since he refuses to race in the downhill to concentrate on the slalom and giant slalom.

Stenmark was competing for the first time this season, since a scheduled giant slalom was canceled last week because of bad weather.

"I trained a lot in September and October, and about one week in November," Stenmark said after the race. "But I haven't skied at all this last week."

He agreed that lack of practice did not seem to affect his skills.

"That's the way it looks," he said.

# Mistrial declared

CHICAGO (UPI) — A federal judge has declared a mistrial in a lawsuit brought against Charles O. Finley, former owner of the Oakland Athletics, seeking the return of a \$100,000 downpayment on an American Basketball Association franchise.

U.S. District Court Judge Joseph Berry Monaghan declared the mistrial after a jury deliberated for nine hours without reaching a verdict.

The suit was filed in 1975 by Paul Lynch, Providence, R.I. Lynch sought the return of \$100,000 he had given Finley in an attempt to purchase the Memphis Tams of the now defunct ABA.

Finley's attorney, Robert Boyle, said Finley kept the money because Lynch failed to purchase the entire agreement was voided when the Lynch failed to receive league approval for the purchase.

# Georgia after national title Fighting Irish only obstacle

NEW YORK (UPI) — Only one obstacle now stands between the Georgia Bulldogs and their first national championship — a group of Fighting Irish in New Orleans on New Year's Day.

Georgia, the nation's only major undefeated team, held on to the No. 1 spot in the final regular-season ratings Monday for the fifth straight week. With a victory over No. 8 Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl on Jan. 1, the Bulldogs ran clinch the national title and become only the second unbeaten team in Georgia history.

Georgia loses, a number of teams can lay claim to No. 1, provided they win their bowl games. The best of those choices is Florida State, which advanced one spot in the SEC Saturday.

Other possibilities for the national title in the event of a Notre Dame Irish triumph, are the Fighting Irish themselves, Pitt, which plays on New Year's Day in the Gator Bowl in Michigan, which plays 16th-ranked Washington in the Rose Bowl, and Baylor or Alabama, who tangle in the Cotton Bowl.

The second 10 consisted of: No. 11 North Carolina, No. 12 UCLA, No. 14 Ohio State, No. 15 Brigham Young, No. 17 Mississippi State, No. 18 South Carolina, No. 19 SMU and No. 20 Maryland.

Eighteen of the top 20 teams are participating in bowl games. UCLA, along with Southern Cal, was ineligible for any post-season action because of disciplinary actions imposed by the Pac-10.

The final ratings will be released on Sunday, Jan. 4, 1981.
