MANCHESTER - An agreement reached Thursday by the town and Eighth Utilities District settled a protracted dispute over taxing rights to an apartment complex straddling their boundary, but may have done little to resolve a legal suit which lists both governments as codefendants.

In fact, the suit brought about two years ago by Charles Ponticelli, owner of the Charles Apartments,

seeks a court ruling to establish which government has authority to tax him for services to his property. Ponticelli has traditionally paid a sewer tax to the district, into whose lines effluent from the 65-unit complex runs. In addition he had been paying the town's separate tax for

fire protection services. But about two years ago, the district also levied a fire tax against Ponticelli's property, charging that its volunteer fire department was being called to fires in the the complex. It was at that point when Pon-

ticelli and his attorney. Rolland Castleman, sued both the town and district to establish which government rightfully had taxing authority. In the meantime, Ponticelli has

withheld payment to either government. "I'm not paying anybody yet, the payments are being held up until it's (the lawsuit) settled," said Ponticelli

"I don't care who I pay," he said, "I'm obligated to pay one but not both. I was making double payments. The problem is that I don't want to pay both of them.'

According to the agreement hammered out by town and district attorneys in eighth months of negotiations, the district will continue to tax Ponticelli for sewer service but the town will assume all rights to his fire taxes.

Still. Ponticelli is seeking a clear boundary for the town and the district, and his suit might again send attorneys thumbing through volumes of antiquated land records in search of what has proven to be an elusive

The company said the laid-off workers would be recalled if and when production requirements increased.
