



Big storm hampering rescue try

By United Press International

today hampered the attempted rescue of one person stranded since a Christmas Eve plane crash and complicated the search for a lost cross-country skier. Storms rocked the northern and central Pacific Coast region with up to 8 inches of snow.

On the East Coast, a winter storm swept into New England Tuesday, dumping up to 8 inches of snow in parts of Vermont. Some areas were buried under 2 feet of snow during a 48-hour span.

Southern Oregon was hit with a combination of rain and snow, triggering a heavy snow warning and travelers' advisories along the northern Pacific Coast into the Central Rockies. The National Weather Service predicted up to 8 inches of new snow for the area. An Army helicopter late Tuesday flew three of four people stranded since Christmas Eve on a mountain near Buena Vista, Colo., to safety after mountaineers on snowshoes waded through waist-deep snows to the wreckage of their small plane

Maj. Jerry Cassidy of the Colorado Civil Air Patrol said the belicopter was "chased out by snow" before rescuers could load the fourth survivor. It was not immediately known when the helicopter would be able to make a second airlift to pick up the remaining survivor and a ground rescue party at the

Warnings were issued by the National Weather Service for storms that could dump another 18 inches of snow in the area. Another military helicopter was called in to ferry teams of searchers into the windblown Colorado backcountry between Crested Butte and Aspen to search

"The winds have been blowing hard in the area," said Jo Anne Stone, search coordinator, "It has blown the snow into 10-foot drifts in places and the avalanche

In all, three plane crashes in Colorado since Christ-mas Eve have been blamed on the severe weather. Authorities Sunday recovered the bodies of three holiday skiers from a plane crash near the Steamboat Springs ski resort in the northern Colorado mountains, and five Dallas men survived the crash of their light plane near Gunnison in the central mountains Monday. The four frostbitten survivors from the Christmas Eve crash included two adults and two teenagers, all believed to be from Texas. A fifth person tried to walk out of the mountains brough the waist-deep snows and was unaccounted for today.



As was its predecessor, the year 1981 brought concern over the health of the state's governor and the continuation of corruption investigations that brought along a new twist in the state's largest city. The year opened on a solemn note as the state

welcomed a new governor who was sworn in during a somber ceremony held in the state Capitol's historic Hall of Flags on New Year's Eve 1980 William Atchison O'Neill, a political veteran and bar owner from East Hampton, moved up from his job as sutenant governor to succeed Ella Grasso, who was tling cancer of the liver.

or three decades, as secretary of the state, a congresswoman and as the nation's first woman governor elected without succeeding her husband. She never lost On Feb. 5, 1981, Ella Grasso lost her last battle. With family members at her side, she died in Hartford

Thousands of people stood for hours for a chance to pay their last respects to Mrs. Grasso, whose body lay in state at the Hall of Flags. Her funeral at Hartford's St. Joseph's Cathedral drew hundreds of political leaders. Ella Grasso was gone from the state she had served.



By James Beard

There is no doubt in my mind that to learn to cook fish properly is to learn to love it. Most people who are indifferent about the culinary delights of fish are that way because it has been served to them indifferently cooked. It's as simple as

The tax strategy is called "income splitting." Once used primarily by the rich to reduce their tax bite by ransferring funds from their estate to a lower-taxed relative, it can be a valuable tool for meeting tuition bills. 


