







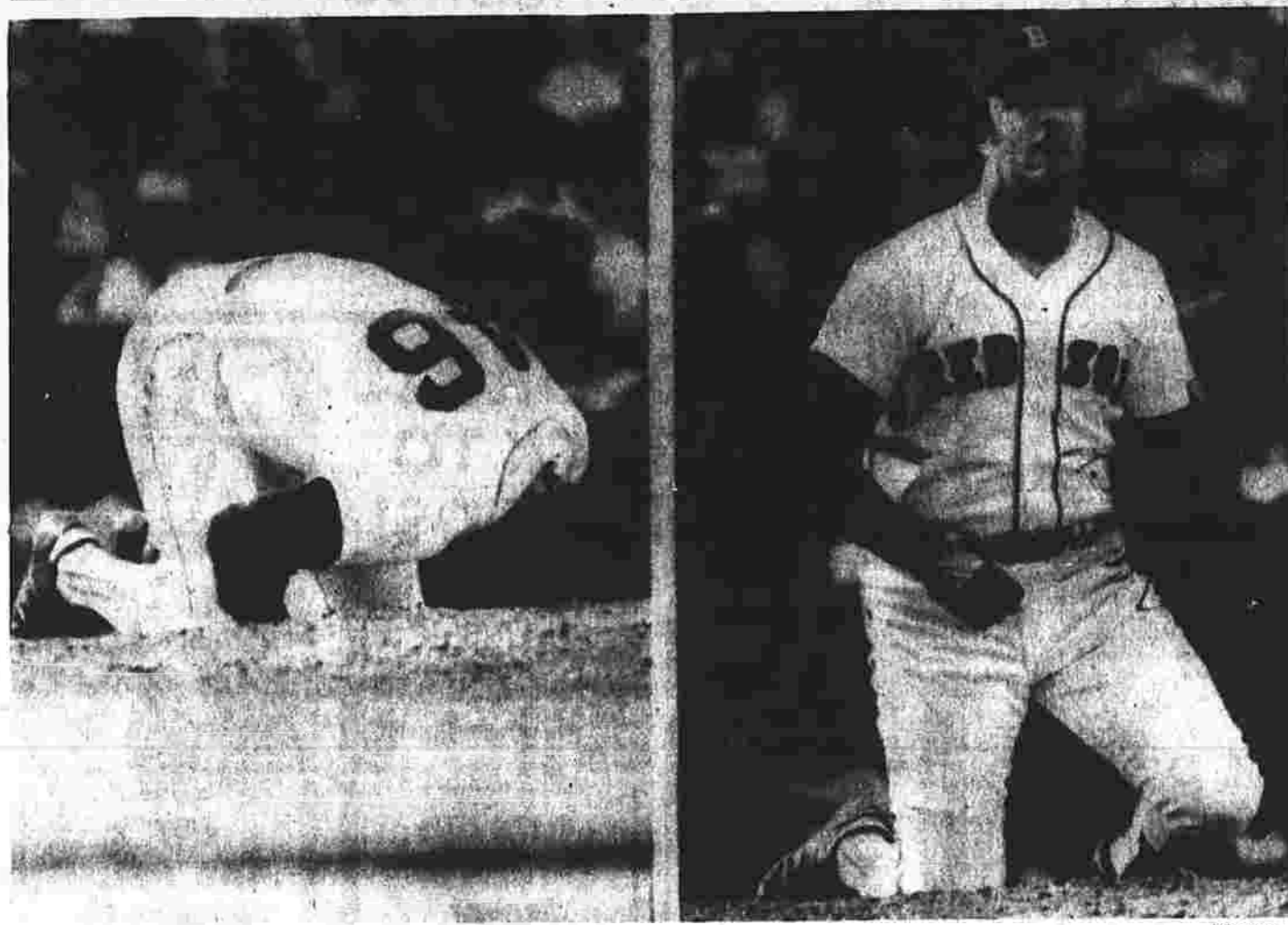

Rod Laver, 44, an Australian, dominated tennis in the 1960's. He won the Grand Slam — the U.S. Wimbledon, French and Australian titles — in 1962 and 1968. He is currently doing sports promotions for Dry Shack Sherry.

A lot of casual or weekend tennis players seem to prefer doubles. How does strategy in doubles tennis differ from singles? Doubles is totally different from singles. It's a game of angles instead of brute force. In doubles there are more angles instead of speed.

What should you do when you're paired with a new doubles partner? I think that the most important thing to remember is to respect your partner. Let him play his half of the court. He's out to play, too.

How important is the return of serve in doubles? Strategy should be the returner's eye. I feel that the return of service is the most important part of doubles play.

How can a doubles team counter a pair of opponents who play a strong set game? It's a good idea to try to keep the server guessing and beat him with a soft chip shot at the server's feet, a lob over his partner's head, a sharply angled cross-court will keep the other team guessing.
