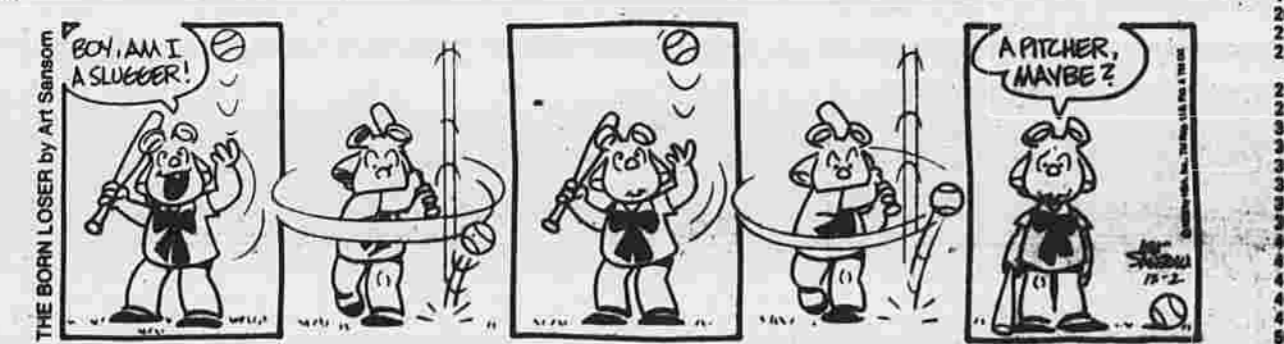

Wild turkeys are no turkeys

Last Thursday, after watching the Road Race, I sat down to another traditional Thanksgiving Day turkey dinner with all the trimmings. For me, this is a really super holiday. Especially the dinner, I just love eating turkey all year 'round, but it always tastes so much better on Thanksgiving Day.

After dinner, sitting in my easy chair, in that kind of stupified state known as "after goodnights," I got to thinking about turkeys, and more especially, wild turkeys.

HERE I AM a bird hunter, a lover of the outdoors, a person interested in all kinds of wildlife, and my knowledge of wild turkeys was just bits and pieces of stuff I had heard from friends who had hunted for them in Vermont. The state of Connecticut had instituted, I heard, a wild turkey restocking program, or I should say, revitalization program.

To go along with the latter, my exposure to this came about one day last year when a friend and I were driving on the other side of the river. He pointed out some indistinct shapes in the distance. They were scurrying, and I do mean scurrying, from some fields into a nearby wood. "Those are wild turkeys. Look at them go," he exclaimed.

"You couldn't prove it on my side of the car, but I took his word for it because he's a game warden.

Anyhow, after musing about this I decided to do a little research and came up with some interesting facts that I thought I would pass on to you.

First, the turkey that we eat at holiday time is not a descendant of the wild beasts we were taught the Pilgrims and the early settlers sat down to feast on. Believe it or not, the bird that we eat is a descendant of one of the Pilgrims ate all right.

But they brought it from Europe. And it, in turn, was brought from Mexico back to Europe by Cortez and then spread throughout that continent as a domestic bird. It was strictly a domesticated turkey. My fifth grade teachers were all wrong.

Melagris Gallapavo, the wild turkey, is a relative of the domestic bird and is a member of the pheasant family. Another item that surprised me.

THE DIFFERENCE between a native wild bird and the barnyard variety is mostly in color and shape. The wild turkey is rangier, slimmer, has longer legs and a longer neck. The color of the barnyard variety is lighter, and the plumage is more somber in appearance. The wild bird has a plumage of almost metallic iridescence. The head of the wild bird is actually blue, while that of the domestic type is red.

All the other physical characteristics such as the wattles and extra chins are the same.

Benjamin Franklin opted for this bird to be our national emblem instead of the eagle. And after reading about it, I can see why. It is a truly wonderful animal. It can run like the wind, is a good flyer, and believe it or not, is a darn good swimmer.

With the settlement of this country, and the disappearance of forests for farmlands and cities, the wild turkey started to disappear too. Eventually as more and more forest land was clear cut, the birds either disappeared, or moved to remote forest areas where the bird population teetered on the verge of extinction.
