**Israeli couple returns for second look at States**

Tami and Amir Wertheim, who came to America from Israel on the first Friendship Flight in 1978, liked this country so much they're back to take another look. The couple is staying with Michael and Jane Winchowski of 94 Cambridge St., the same couple they stayed with in 1978. The Winchowskis, meanwhile, visited "We Wertheims in Israel in 1981."

LAST WEEKEND they went to Niagara Falls with their host family. They will leave Manchester this week for Washington, D.C. where they plan to visit the space museum and other points of interest. From there they will go to New York City, where Mrs. Wertheim's brother lives. They will return to Israel on May 21.

Mrs. Wertheim said this is their big trip. "It's expensive to come here. We each had to pay \$50 just to leave the country. This is something new that started on April 1," Wertheim said.

The couple lives in Rishon-LeZion. It's near Tel Aviv and has a population of about 100,000. "It's called a sleeping (bedroom) town to Tel Aviv," Mrs. Wertheim explained.

Wertheim is a bus driver for the largest bus company in Israel. He's also a member of the bus corporation. Mrs. Wertheim is a cosmetician. "I'm not concerned with telling how to put on makeup, I learned it, but I don't like it. I'm involved with the cleansing of the skin, giving facials and treatment of skin problems," she said.

THEY BOTH AGREED that everything in Israel is expensive. "We have many taxes. They're the highest in the world. Out of my salary I pay about 70 percent in taxes and most of it goes into defense," Wertheim said.

If you think the Connecticut sales tax is high, listen to this — the sales tax in Israel is 15 percent. Inflation increases there at the rate of more than 100 percent a year.

Wertheim said that the average salary is from \$500 to \$1,000 a month, after taxes. He said that the necessities of life, such as bread, cheese and milk, are much lower than they are in this country because the government subsidizes them.

What do the Wertheims especially like about this country? "A lot of things, it's so large and beautiful and every place you visit is different," Mrs. Wertheim said. "We enjoy the people in America. They are very kind and almost always want to help," she added.

Mrs. Wertheim also commented on the fact that this country is so clean. "We have a lot to learn in Israel. But we are a lot younger than America," she said.

The Wertheims will return to their country on May 21 to rejoin their two children, a boy and a girl, who are being cared of by Mrs. Wertheim's parents.

Israel has developed since then and we now have all of those things. But the meat here is cheaper," Mrs. Wertheim said.

Real estate is expensive in Israel too. The Wertheims said there are very few apartment complexes there and the apartments are sold, not rented. It costs about \$50,000 for a three-room apartment. And the interest rate on a mortgage is a whopping 200 percent. The Wertheims said they bought a house "just before the big inflation."

They also commented on the crime rate. "We have crime, but not as much as America. Most places it has been safe to walk the streets," Mrs. Wertheim said. Her husband added that it isn't so safe any more.

**Soviets clearing out of Lebanon**



**Rumors of war increase**

A Soviet airliner left Beirut today carrying the second group of Soviet Embassy dependents out of Lebanon, adding to fears of a new war sparked by reports of fresh Syrian and Palestinian troops pouring into the country.

The sudden departure of the Soviets was reminiscent of the evacuation of Soviet Embassy personnel in other countries on the eve of the 1973 Middle East War when Egypt attacked Israeli positions across the Suez Canal and Syria thrust into the occupied Golan Heights.

The Soviet move came as Beirut emerged tense but calm after two late-night explosions that left seven people injured. One of the explosions, apparently a car bomb, rocked the Hamra sector of west Beirut, damaging a clothing boutique and injuring three passersby, witnesses and security officials said.

Earlier in the morning, Scott Kent, another hospital spokesman, had said Brandon's "blood pressure continues to drop. His vital signs are still unstable and he's extremely critical."

State bonds help Gerber build

The Connecticut Development Authority voted Tuesday to allow Gerber Scientific Products to issue \$1.85 million in tax-free bonds to finance its planned new plant at the town's Buckland Industrial Park.

With the bonds approved, Gerber needs only the permission of the town's Planning & Zoning Commission to begin construction of the 40,000 square-foot facility. The Board of Directors and the Economic Development Commission have already granted their approval.

Gerber Products, a division of Gerber Scientific Inc. of South Windsor, is a designer and manufacturer of high-technology products now located in a rented facility at 261 Broad St. The company employs 93 workers and is expected to employ 110 once it moves into its new plant, according to company president David Logan.

Gerber will pay the town \$234,000 for a 9.3-acre parcel in the industrial park, Logan said. He said the company plans to expand the plant from the initial 40,000 square feet to at many as 200,000 square feet, and employ up to 300 workers.

There were no waning windows or dully doubles at the Forum Tuesday night, but 17,000 people showed up to watch the Los Angeles Lakers, the self-proclaimed greyhounds-of the NBA.

# Toast greening of Spring with tantalizing mint julep

For me, the Kentucky Derby, the greening of the country and the establishment of spring on a solid footing always bring forth tantalizing images of a mint julep. My wonderful friend Mary Hamblet, whom I have known for well over 70 years, is in my mind the premier julep maker. Her julep is powerful, pungent, extraordinarily pleasant to the nose and palate and disastrous if more than three are consumed.

When we were younger and perhaps braver, we would get together on a balmy afternoon and proceed with a julep festival. Occasionally we included our mothers, whom we knew would provide entertainment because after two juleps with added sugar, which they preferred, they became red-cheeked, reminiscent of an extremely amusing! What else should a julep do? It should exhilarate you and refresh you.

good, fresh mint. If you are a leaf crusher, as we have always been, you take 6 or 7 leaves of really fresh, dewy mint, place them in the bottom of a glass with perhaps 1 or 2 teaspoons of sugar (this depends on how sweet you like your drinks), and crush the mint leaves with the sugar. A good long bar spoon is ideal here. Then you spread the crushed mint and sugar mixture around the glass so that it's somewhat perfumed. Then add about 2 jiggers of the best bourbon.

Now, MIND YOU, this is Mary Hamblet's and we don't follow the hal- lowed traditions of the first mint julep ever perfected in Kentucky or Virginia, that's quite all right. We have been happy all these years with this version, and we expect to continue to be! The other day I received a note from a Scotch whisky firm that rather shocked me at first and then made me think, well, why not? The company was recommending a version of a mint julep that was a far cry from our

traditional one, as it calls for scotch. Now, I love Scotch whisky. As a matter of fact, it's my tipple, but I had never considered it as julep fuel before. This recipe has another great difference from the classic mint julep in that instead of sugar it uses a small amount of Drambuie, the liqueur made from Scotch. I bravely commenced, proceeding the way I'd make a bourbon julep, stirring in 1/4 ounce of Drambuie, crushing the mint leaves and dribbling the mixture down the sides of the glass. I then filled the glass with fine ice and added 1 1/2 ounces of good Scotch whisky and stirred like mad. I placed the glass in the refrigerator for 10 minutes or so until it developed a beautiful frost, and then I plunged a sprig of mint into the glass, having dusted the leaves with a little powdered sugar. Then I tried it. The taste was extraordinarily interesting. I continued tasting and decided that I was really quite pleased with the suggestion sent to me by the Scotch whisky people. It was fun, and it was not nearly as sweet as some juleps I have tasted.

Years ago I came across a treatise on juleps in which it was stated very firmly that julep is a word for which there is no plural. One did not make four mint juleps, or you drank julep twice or thrice in an evening — you didn't drink three juleps. Well, now you know!

**MARY'S THEORY** has always been that you should use 14-ounce glasses. These are sometimes hard to find, so Mary believes 12-ounce glasses can be substituted. I agree with her, except that if you can find glasses with a little handle on them, they're even better. The next thing is the ice. It must be very fine. In the days before processors and ice crushers, a huge canvas bag would be filled with ice, placed on the floor and beaten with a mallet until the ice within was fine and powdery. That is extremely important! Next in importance is

holding on to the glass, stir madly with your bar spoon until you begin to get a frost on the glass and it has the chill that you want. Then, if there's a room, you can add a little more ice and, if you need to, a little more bourbon. Then, and this is very important, take a good sprig of mint and dip it lightly in powdered sugar and place that in the glass so that it touches the olfactory nerve before the taste of the julep touches your lips. This does something very important to the drink. If you can bear to wait, after stirring and adding the bourbon and addi-

tioned ingredients in a blender, except sesame seeds. Blend for one minute. Add sesame seeds. Use 1/2 cup on chef's salad and store remaining in refrigerator for use on other salads.

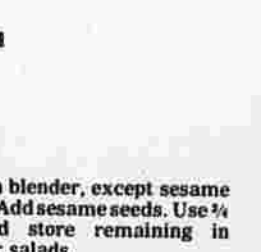

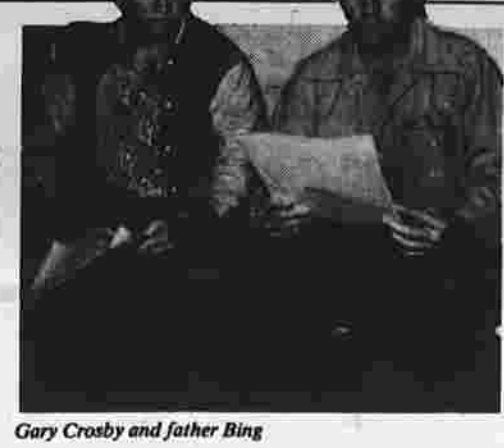
