Young signs \$40 million pact

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. - The Los Angeles Express of the US Football League, offering "the market price, not overpaying," Monday signed All-American quarterback Steve Young to a 4-year contract considered the richest pact in the history of professional sports.

Financial terms were not disclosed at a news conference, but reports have indicated the Brigham Young University quarterback's pact is worth up to \$40 million, including deferred payments and charitable donations.
Young, who set more than a dozen NCAA records at BYU and was runnerup in the Heisman Trophy, halting behind Nebraska's Mike Rozier, signed with the USFL after rejecting an offer by the NFL's Cincinnati Bengals.

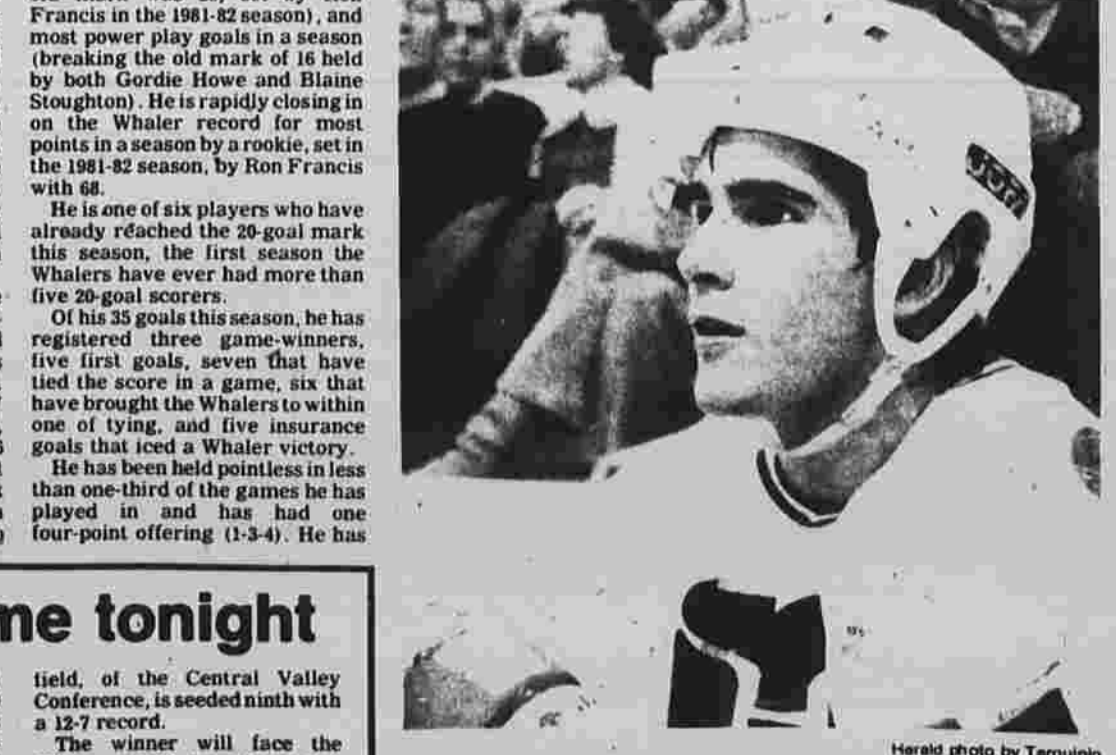
