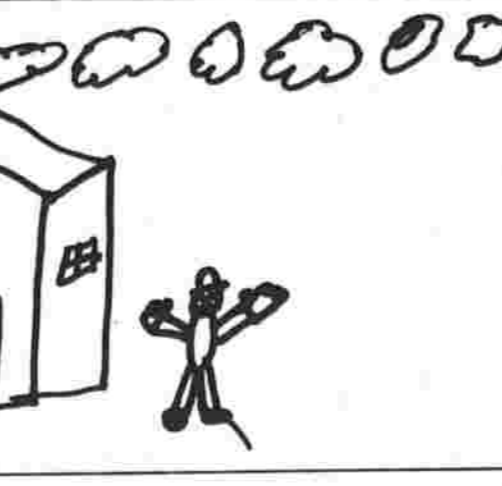

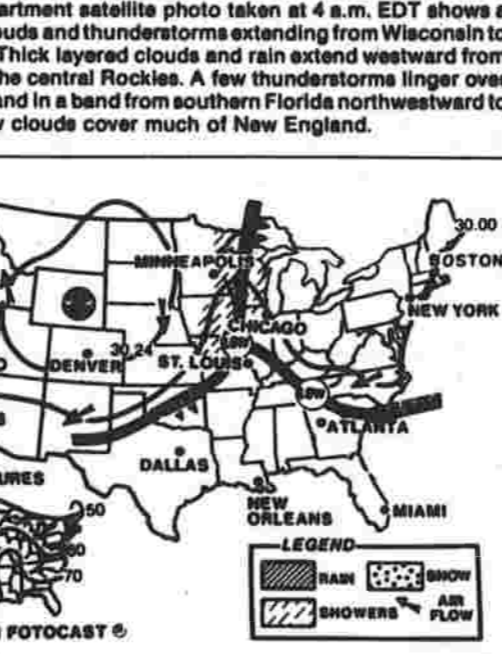
Across the nation

Mariners to stay put
SEATTLE — The financially troubled Seattle Mariners have agreed to stay put in the Kingdome at least through 1987. However, there are no guarantees that the American League club will remain in the Pacific Northwest beyond that date. In a deal that settles the club's long-standing dispute with its landlord, the Mariners reached agreement Tuesday with King County on a revised Kingdome stadium lease. Although the club's lease still runs through 1996, the new agreement contains a key provision that allows the Mariners to leave Seattle if certain attendance standards aren't met. The escape clause would go into effect after 1987 if: —the club has drawn less than 1.4 million in two straight seasons. —the club has sold less than 10,000 season tickets. —and no local owner is found to buy the club. The agreement, hammered together by a three-member mediation panel over the past 12 days, also gives the financially ailing Mariners free rent through 1987 and relief from a city admissions tax applied to ticket sales.

Hawerchuk signs lucrative pact
WINNIPEG, Manitoba — Winnipeg Jets center Dale Hawerchuk was signed to an 8-year, \$3.2-million contract Tuesday. "I consider it a lifetime contract," said Hawerchuk, the Jets' captain. "It secures me for life. I was never concerned I'd have to play anywhere else. The negotiations went smoothly with no bickering. We said what we wanted and they said what they could afford. I'd be crazy to want to leave this team. It's a team with a good future because we're that close to the Stanley Cup. Hawerchuk, runnerup to the Edmonton Oilers' Wayne Gretzky in voting for the NHL's most valuable player award, tied or broke 19 Jets scoring records last season. He had 53 goals and 77 assists for 130 points, third best in the league.

All's marriage down the tubes
LOS ANGELES — Three-time heavyweight boxing champion Muhammad Ali and his wife, Veronica, Tuesday announced they mutually decided to dissolve their 8-year marriage. It was the third marriage for Ali, and the third to end in divorce.

Leaden wings the hope of new Courageous III

BOSTON (UPI) — A pair of leaden wings in place of a solid vertical keel is the magic formula the Courageous Syndicate hopes will recapture the America's Cup Trophy from the Australians who spirited it away in 1983. The syndicate's pride and hope for 1987, Courageous III — with sleek white hull gleaming — was lifted gently from murky Boston Harbor Tuesday to reveal its new vortex winged keel. Australia II, the challenger that won the America's Cup series off Newport, R.I. in 1983, pioneered a new keel with winged appendages that many held responsible for the 12-meter sloop's success. "It's the Cup snatcher's keel," Courageous Syndicate Chairman Leonard Greene said of his new keel, giving the thumbs-up sign and grinning from ear to ear. "Look at how streamlined it is," said Greene, who insists his new keel is really "wings." "There's never been a keel built anything like this he said. "There's nothing in the middle. There's nothing coming straight down. The water sluing between the wings strikes the flaps and makes the flaps more powerful." Greene, sporting the green tie of the Courageous Syndicate, insisted he began developing the new vortex wings for Courageous III in 1980, long before the Australian design became known. While secrecy has abounded design plans for other expected challengers, Greene said he decided to unveil his new keel in the interests of sportsmanship. "I'm willing to unveil it as a matter of principle," he said. "It's a big part of keeping this sport. I don't think we'll lose by unveiling it."

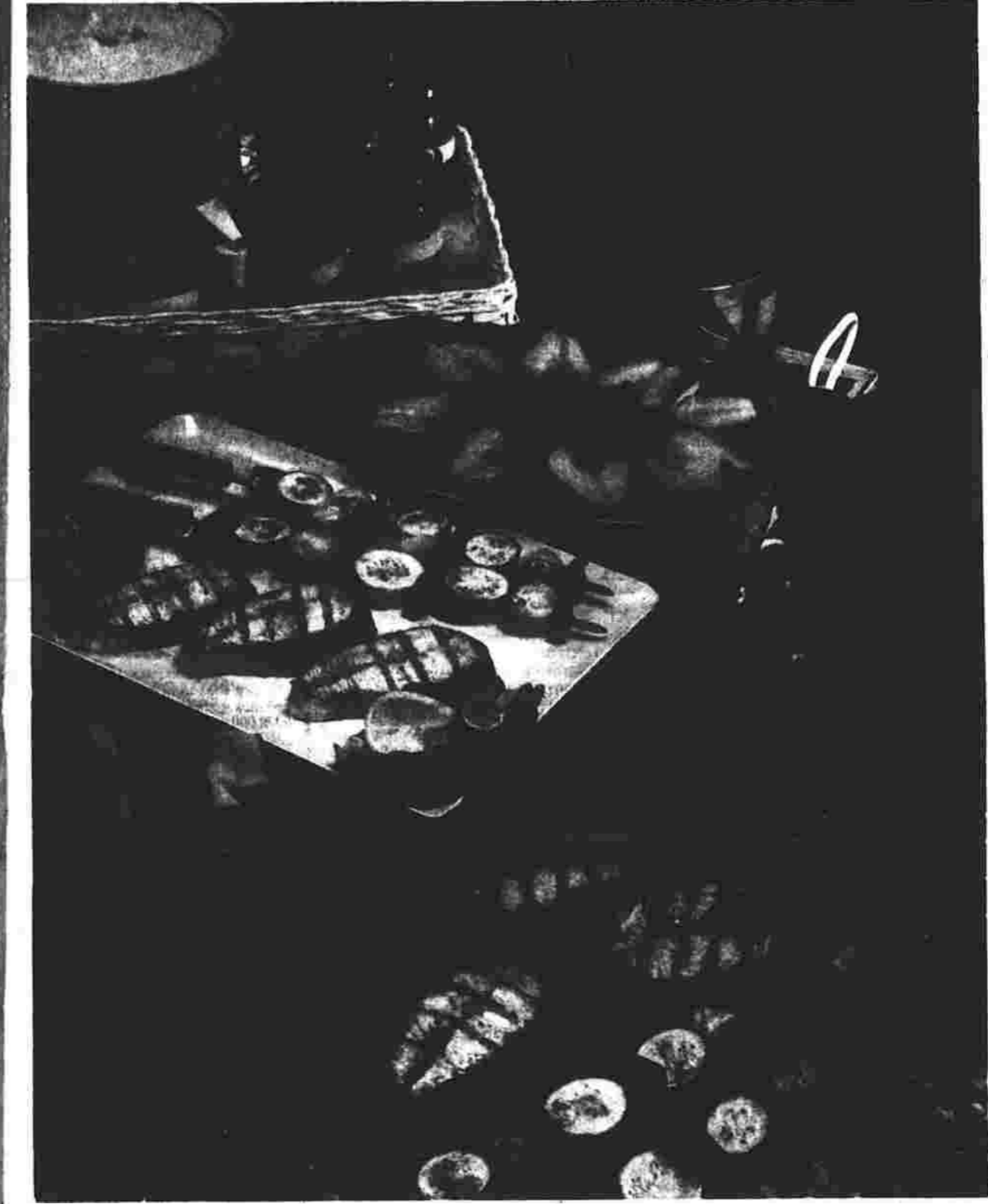

Charcoal Grilled Brunch

Experts of the Barbecue Industry Association suggest that a successful barbecue begins with a proper fire. For faster lighting, stack charcoal briquets in a pyramid; they'll light faster since air can circulate around them. Be sure to use a chimney-type starter or a high-quality liquid starter. The charcoal is ready when its ash is grey or glowing red at night. If you use instant lighting briquets or have a gas grill, just follow the manufacturer's directions.

In order to have perfect barbecued foods, it's important to know how to judge the temperature of the fire. You can judge the temperature by holding your hand at cooking height, palm side down. If you can keep your hand there for only 2 seconds, the temperature is high or hot; 3 seconds, medium-hot; 4 seconds, medium; 5 seconds, low. If your menu requires a lower heat, raise the cooking grid, spread out the coals and, in a covered cooker, close vents halfway. If you need to raise the heat, lower the cooking grid, push coals together and, in a covered cooker, open vents all the way.

BARBECUED ALASKA SALMON

1/4 cup each olive oil, butter or margarine and lemon or lime juice
 1 large clove garlic, minced
 1/4 teaspoon each salt, pepper, Worcestershire sauce and thyme or tarragon, crushed
 1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper
 6 Alaska salmon steaks (6 to 8 ounces each), thawed if necessary

Combine all ingredients except salmon steaks, mix well. Brush both sides of each steak. Place on cooking grid and grill over medium-hot charcoal briquets allowing 10 minutes per inch of thickness of salmon. Brush fish frequently with sauce, turning once halfway through cooking time. Brush steaks thoroughly before removing from cooking grid.
 Makes 6 servings.

GRILLED POTATOES ROQUEFORT

6 baking potatoes
 6 slices bacon
 1 cup sliced onion
 1/2 cup crumbled Roquefort cheese

Pierce potatoes with fork. Place potatoes on cooking grid of covered cooker over medium-hot charcoal briquets. Close grill cover and cook 60 minutes or until done. Move potatoes to outside edge of cooking grid or on to warming rack. Cook bacon in a skillet over charcoal briquets until crisp. Remove bacon from skillet and crumble. Add onion slices to bacon fat in skillet. Cook until golden brown. Split potatoes open. Spoon onions onto steaming potatoes. Sprinkle with crumbled bacon and top with cheese. Close grill cover and cook potatoes just until cheese melts.
 Makes 6 servings.

ORIENTAL SALMON KABOBS (not shown)

1/3 cup soy sauce
 1/4 cup oil
 2 tablespoons each minced green onion and sugar
 1 clove garlic, minced
 2 teaspoons sesame seeds
 1 pound Alaska salmon, thawed if necessary and cut into chunks
 1 small onion, quartered
 1 1/2 to 2 cups broccoli florets
 8 to 10 medium mushrooms

Combine soy sauce, oil, green onion, sugar, garlic and sesame seeds; mix well. Marinate salmon 30 minutes. Separate onion layers. Alternate onion, salmon, broccoli and mushrooms on each of 4 or 5 long-handled skewers. Brush with marinade. Place on cooking grid of covered cooker over medium-hot charcoal briquets 10 to 12 minutes; turn and baste every 2 or 3 minutes.
 Makes 4 or 5 servings.

PEAR SALSA SALAD

2-1/2 cups diagonally sliced zucchini
 1-1/2 cups diagonally sliced yellow squash
 1 red pepper, cut into 1-inch pieces
 1 can (8 ounces) artichoke hearts, drained
 1/2 cup olive oil
 1/4 cup freshly squeezed lemon juice
 1 large clove garlic, minced
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 1/8 teaspoon freshly ground pepper

Place vegetables in large shallow baking dish. Combine oil, lemon juice, garlic, salt and pepper; mix well. Pour over vegetables and marinate 1 hour, tossing frequently. Skewer vegetables on long wooden-handled skewers. Place on cooking grid of covered cooker over medium-hot charcoal briquets; grill 5 to 7 minutes, turning and basting with marinade.
 Makes 6 servings.

TANGY MARINATED VEGETABLE KABOBS

2-1/2 cups diagonally sliced zucchini
 1-1/2 cups diagonally sliced yellow squash
 1 red pepper, cut into 1-inch pieces
 1 can (8 ounces) artichoke hearts, drained
 1/2 cup olive oil
 1/4 cup freshly squeezed lemon juice
 1 large clove garlic, minced
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 1/8 teaspoon freshly ground pepper

Place vegetables in large shallow baking dish. Combine oil, lemon juice, garlic, salt and pepper; mix well. Pour over vegetables and marinate 1 hour, tossing frequently. Mariners to stay put

SEATTLE — The financially troubled Seattle Mariners have agreed to stay put in the Kingdome at least through 1987.

However, there are no guarantees that the American League club will remain in the Pacific Northwest beyond that date.

In a deal that settles the club's long-standing dispute with its landlord, the Mariners reached agreement Tuesday with King County on a revised Kingdome stadium lease.

Although the club's lease still runs through 1996, the new agreement contains a key provision that allows the Mariners to leave Seattle if certain attendance standards aren't met. The escape clause would go into effect after 1987 if:

— the club has drawn less than 1.4 million in two straight seasons;

— the club has sold less than 10,000 season tickets;

— and no local owner is found to buy the club.

The agreement, hammered together by a three-member mediation panel over the past 12 days, also gives the financially ailing Mariners free rent through 1987 and relief from a city admissions tax applied to ticket sales.

Hawerchuk signs lucrative pact

Leaden wings the hope of new Courageous III

BOSTON (UPI) — A pair of leaden wings in place of a solid vertical keel is the magic formula the Courageous Syndicate hopes will recapture the America's Cup Trophy from the Australians who spirited it away in 1983.

The Syndicate's pride and hope for 1987, Courageous III — with sleek white hull gleaming — was lifted gently from murky Boston Harbor Tuesday to reveal its new vortex winged keel.

Australia II, the challenger that won the America's Cup series off Newport, R.I. in 1983, pioneered a new keel with winged appendages that many held responsible for the 12-meter sloop's success.

"It's the Cup snatcher," Courageous Syndicate Chairman Leonard Greene said of his new keel, giving the thumbs-up sign and grinning from ear to ear.

"Look at how streamlined it is," said Greene, who insists his new keel is really "wings."

"There's never been a keel built anything like this," he said. "There's nothing in the middle. There's nothing coming straight down. The water sluing between the wings strikes the flaps and makes the flaps more powerful."

Greene, sporting the green tie of the Courageous Syndicate, insisted he began developing the new vortex wings for Courageous III in 1986, long before the Australian design became known.

While secrecy has shrouded design plans for other expected challengers, Greene said he decided to unveil his new keel in the interests of sportmanship.

"I'm willing to unveil it as a matter of principle," he said. "It's a big part of keeping this sport. I don't think we'll lose by unveiling it. Those who do copy will be strong contenders for second place."

Courageous III, which won the cup in 1973 and 1977, will spend the summer in Boston where the crew will practice. The vessel will then be shipped to Perth, Australia, in October, for practice in the rough waters where the 1987 challenge will be held.

However, the league's salary cap would force Boston to reduce their payroll in order to make the deal. Cedric Maxwell is rumored to be the man out, but an injured knee that forced the Celtics' forward to miss a good deal of last season has raised questions about his marketability.

The Clippers, who are looking to reverse last year's trade of Terry Cummings to Milwaukee for Marques Johnson because of a lack of medical information on Johnson, are having Maxwell thoroughly checked out.

Celtics general manager Jan Volk and president Red Auerbach met with Walton last Friday.

Picnic preparations easier if cook chooses microwave

The picnic season is upon us, so get out the picnic basket or cooler, grab the kids, the dog, and a bag of marshmallows, and be on your way.



Marge's Microwave Kitchen

A microwave can help you furnish all of the necessary foods for your picnic in short order. No more standing over a hot stove getting the food ready. Depend upon your microwave to help keep both you and your kitchen cool while the foods are being prepared.

Picnic foods should be easy to eat and easy to prepare. One traditional picnic food is cold fried chicken. This can be prepared in your microwave along with your other favorite picnic fare. Coatings give microwaved chicken pieces a crunchy exterior for an attractive finish. The coatings also add flavor and variety to the chicken.

To reduce calories, remove the chicken skin and fat beneath. The coatings will adhere to the meat and flavor it.

To microwave coated chicken pieces - approximately 2 1/2 to 3 pounds of chicken - follow these simple steps:

- Combine coating ingredients in a shallow dish or on waxed paper. Set aside while preparing dip.
- Dip chicken parts in mixture and dredge in coating. Press coarse coatings into place after dredging. Place pieces bone-side down on rack with the meatiest parts to the outside. Microwave on high for 10 minutes.
- Rearrange so less-cooked parts are to the outside of the dish, but not turn chicken over.
- Microwave on high for 8 to 15 minutes, or until juices are clear and meat is nearly brown in color.

Fried onion coating

- 2 cans (3 ounces each) fried onion rings, crushed
- 1 egg beaten
- 2 tablespoons milk

Light crumb coating

- 1/2 cup mashed potato flakes
- 1/2 cup seasoned bread crumbs
- 1 teaspoon parsley flakes

Herbed fettucine earns fan

Miki Altman lives in Stamford, a town noted for its continental restaurants. But on her frequent visits to Manchester, she has been impressed with the restaurants here, as well.

She has enjoyed the brunch served at Coney's Restaurants, the broccoli pies prepared by the Lafayette Escadrille and, most recently, the herbed fettucine prepared by Fattoria Restaurant & Lounge on Oak Street.

It's a dish created by Patricia Fialdi, a new cook at the restaurant. Officially it's called pasta Milanese, but it's actually a rich herb-and-cream sauce, served over herbed pasta.

Pasta Milanese

- 3 tablespoons clarified butter (see note below)
- 1 large breast of chicken, skinned, boned, cut into strips
- 2 large slices prosciutto, cut into thin strips
- 4 large mushrooms, sliced
- 1 small onion, sliced
- 1 tablespoon fresh tarragon
- 1 tablespoon fresh parsley, minced
- 1 teaspoon fresh garlic, minced
- Black pepper to taste
- 1/2 to 1/4 cup white wine
- 1/2 to 1 cup heavy cream
- 1/2 pound cooked herb-flavored fettucine

Freshly grated Parmesan cheese

Heat clarified butter in a large skillet. When butter is hot, add chicken strips. Cook briefly on one side, then turn and cook another few minutes. Add ham, onion, mushrooms, herbs and garlic. Sauté until everything is fully cooked, but the vegetables are still firm.

Heat the wine separately. When vapors are rising from the wine, pour it over the chicken mixture and light the vapors. When most of the alcohol has burned away, add the cream. This will put out the flames. Cook briefly, over medium-high heat, until the cream reduces slightly and the sauce thickens.

Four chicken sauce over cooked, herb-flavored fettucine noodles. Top with cheese and serve. A restaurant would serve this quantity to just two people. Home portions need not be so generous; it would amply serve three with a side salad and a cooked vegetable.

2 tablespoons fresh snipped parsley
4 hard-cooked eggs, sliced

Savory cracker coating

- 1 1/2 cups (30 to 35) round buttery crackers, finely crushed
- 1 teaspoon (1-ounce) onion gravy mix

I-park lots not for sale

Two unsold lots in the Buckland Industrial Park will be preserved by the town as open space and possibly used for recreation under resolutions adopted by the Economic Development Commission this morning.

The town has had trouble selling the two lots, which are the only ones remaining, because their natural features make much of them unsuitable for building, Planning Director Mark Pellegrini told EDC members at their meeting in Lincoln Center. The troublesome features include slopes, drainage culverts and wetlands, he said.

Pellegrini originally suggested that lot lines be redrawn around the unbuildable portions of the parcels and that the selling prices be reduced in an effort to attract buyers. The two lots contain a total of nearly eight acres.

Town General Manager Robert B. Weiss instead suggested the lots be used for ball fields. Weiss said the town wants to sell land adjacent to the former Buckland School on Tolland Turnpike, which includes a ball field that until recently was used by the town's Little League.

The former school is owned by One Buckland Square Associates. Officials have said the partnership, which includes architect Richard Lawrence, has expressed interest in buying the land.

The Planning and Zoning Commission has said the land should be used for recreation, but Weiss said construction of another ball field nearby would probably mitigate any opposition.

'A lot of us thought, this is it'

LONDON (UPI) — Jimmy Deil Palmer, composed and relieved to be released by his Shiite Moslem captors, said today Americans aboard TWA flight 87 thought they would be killed because the hijackers were "capable of anything."

Palmer and his wife, Sammie, talked about their ordeal on the CBS "Morning News" program from London. Palmer, 48, indicated that those who hijacked the plane on June 14 were more terrifying than the group headed by Shiite Moslem leader Nabih Berri, who took control of the hostages in Beirut.

"It was very scary, horrifying. These people were capable of anything," Palmer said of the initial hijackers, who beat up and killed one of the hostages, Robert Dean Stethem, 23, a Navy diver from Waldorf, Md.

Palmer said he thought all the American passengers would be killed by the militiamen.

"I suppose the most frightening time for me was and I think probably for the rest of the hostages, when we were taken off the airplane in the middle of the night, probably 3 o'clock in the morning. We were taken into Beirut by truck. We were placed in the basement of a building. It was pitch dark."

"We all had to hold hands and hold on to one of the militiamen who guided us down into this hole. We were all lined up against the wall. When they turned on the light there were half a dozen machine guns looking at us."

"A lot of us thought, 'this is it.'"

Shultz keys release deal to all captives

BEIRUT, Lebanon — A Moslem militia official said today France has accepted a proposal to transfer 30 American hostages to the French Embassy, but the French Foreign Ministry denied the report.

Secretary of State George Shultz demanded that, in addition to the 29 hijack hostages held for 14 days, seven other Americans abducted in Beirut and held for as long as 15 months must also be returned.

The new demand from Shultz and the comments from Amal and French officials came amid news reports Israel was ready to release the remaining 73 Lebanese detainees demanded by Shiite gunmen in exchange for the Americans.

In Beirut, an official of the Shiite Amal militia who asked not to be identified said French officials had agreed to take custody of the 28 TWA hijack hostages and two French kidnap victims for two days.

He said French officials had messaged Washington for the Reagan administration's approval.

But in Paris, a French Foreign Ministry spokesman said France had not agreed to anything and emphasized that France is "ready to accept free people, but not hostages."

"WE WILL NOT BE substitute jailers," the spokesman said. "The freedom must be unconditional. There is a question of participating in an operation that will become a commitment."

He said Foreign Minister Roland Dumas talked by telephone Wednesday night with Shultz and Israeli Prime Minister Shimon Peres but gave no details of the talks.

ABC News reported Wednesday that Dumas called Peres to determine the Israeli position regarding the Lebanese prisoners — mostly Shites — if the French did take control of the hostages at the French Embassy in Beirut.

French Charge d'Affaires Marcel Laugel visited Amal leader Nabih Berri today reportedly to discuss details of handing the hostages over to the French embassy.

But the Foreign Ministry spokesman, asked about the Laugel-Berri meeting, said only that French diplomats were keeping in touch "with all concerned parties."

Laugel said any move of the captives would take time to arrange but their accommodation would be "no problem."

"In principle the French government is always ready to help," Laugel told reporters after meeting with Berri at Berri's home in west Beirut.

watched the ice fall. Menke said the sheet was probably 6 feet long, 8 inches thick and moving at about 200 mph as it hurtled from the sky.

"When it hit, I fell on the ground," Torbicki said. "I thought it was going to hit us."

Shello Slattery, who was in an adjacent back yard, also saw the ice coming.

"After it had fallen, I was amazed and very thankful it was closer to me because I'm sure I would have been killed. There was no time to move at all," she said.

Slattery saved a piece of the ice about 10 inches in diameter and put it in her refrigerator.

Winds dim comet light

LA JOLLA, Calif. (UPI) — Fierce solar winds gusting to more than 200,000 mph could be causing the mysterious fluctuations in the brightness of Halley's Comet that have puzzled astronomers for years, a scientist says.

Asoka Mendis, a physicist at the University of California at San Diego, said Wednesday that bursts of electrically charged particles streaming from the sun could be causing the pulsations as they wash over the comet.

"Like any other wind, solar wind sometimes gusts — from an approximate average speed of 250 miles per second to as high as 400 miles per second or 216,000 mph, Mendis said.

Halley's Comet is believed to be a solid chunk of ice and dust. It completes its orbit when it swings around the sun and heads out of the solar system every 76 years.

IN WASHINGTON, THE REAGAN administration appeared to be working on a delicate new bid to free the hostages but imposed a news blackout and refused to comment on the proposal by Berri, who has been negotiating on behalf of Shiite militants who commandeered a TWA jetliner June 14.

Shultz, speaking at a United Nations Charter banquet Wednesday in San Francisco, linked the TWA hostages with seven Americans who are being held by kidnappers in Beirut, demanding the unconditional return of all of them. (Story on page 4).

Diplomatic sources in Israel said Israel planned to free another batch of prisoners taken from southern Lebanon during Israel's military occupation.

The sources said the Israelis had planned to free those prisoners today but might delay it to avoid the impression it was linked to the hijackers' demands and to Wednesday's release of an American hostage James Palmer.

The crisis began June 14 when Shiite gunmen hijacked TWA Flight 87 en route from Athens, Greece, to Rome.

They forced the plane, with 145 passengers and eight crewmembers, to fly to Beirut, where they released 19 women and children and ordered the pilot to fly on to Algiers, where they released another 21 passengers, mostly women and children.

They forced the plane to return to Beirut June 15, where the hijackers killed one hostage — a Navy diver — and a half dozen passengers said to have "Jewish-sounding" names were removed from the plane by gunmen.

The hijackers then forced the plane back to Algiers, where they released more than 60 passengers.

The plane returned to Beirut June 16, where it has remained since. Of the American passengers said to be ill was allowed to leave the plane June 16.

All the passengers were removed from the plane the following day, when Berri's Amal militia took custody of them and Berri began negotiating on behalf of the hijackers.

Berri released three hostages June 16, the day his militiamen took over custody. And he released another 21 passengers.

But the three remaining crewmen have remained aboard the plane with the hijackers.

The Amal leader offered to transfer the hostages to a Western embassy if the country that received them would pledge to hold them until 73 Lebanese Arabs were freed by Israel.
