Students protest rules

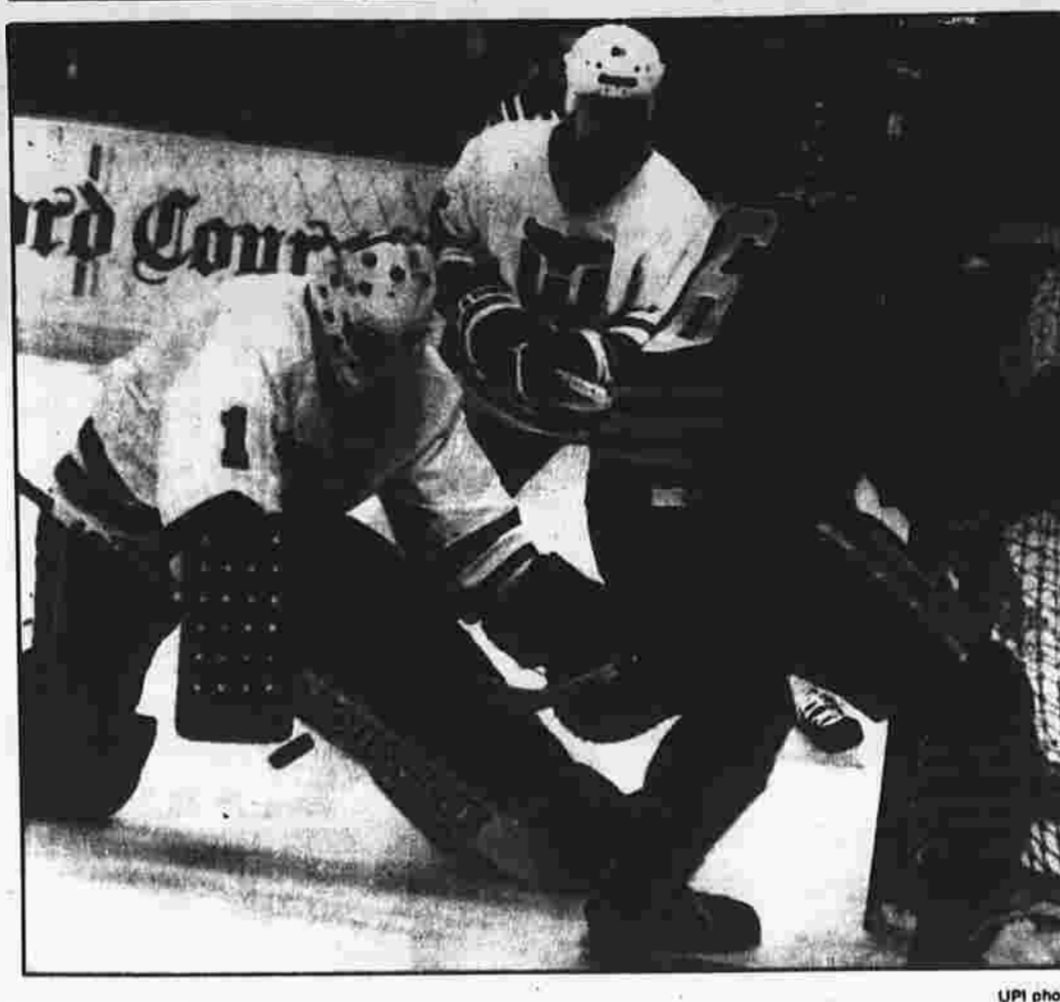
COVENTRY — About a third of the student body at Coventry High School walked out of classes this morning to protest rules distributed by the school's administration.

Plan offers to give town sewer grant

A new plan that would provide Manchester with a grant of about \$11 million toward the \$26 million cost of federally mandated improvements to its sewage disposal plant has been worked out and reportedly has a good chance of being passed by the General Assembly.



The explosion occurred as the plane, carrying 121 passengers and crew, was at an altitude of 15,000 feet over southeastern Greece. The aircraft—a Boeing 727—was descending toward Athens at the time of the blast.

The jetliner — TWA Flight 89, which originated in Los Angeles — was bound from Rome to Athens and Cairo when a blast tore a gaping hole in the plane's right side, killing four Americans who were sucked from the plane.

Ospina kin awaits grim confirmation

STRATFORD (AP) — The family of Albert Ospina, who was aboard the TWA jet in which a bomb exploded, was waiting today for government confirmation that the Stratford businessman was one of four passengers killed.

Meanwhile, the federal government is pressing the state to spend its available sewer grant money and the money slated for Groton could be used for Manchester and Suffield. Manchester would get about \$6 million of it, bringing its total grant to about \$11 million.
