





# Coventry voters send budget back to the council

COVENTRY — The Town Council will begin work on another 1986-87 budget tonight following rejection of the spending plan by voters for the second time.

anticipated tax rate, was defeated in a referendum in May. Joan Lewis, chairwoman of the Town Council, said today the council will tackle the budget immediately. "I'd like to get this thing ready and back to the voters as soon as possible before we have to start borrowing."

The 1986-87 fiscal year began July 1, and the town is currently operating under last year's budget. Lewis, a Democrat, said she was disappointed by the results of Tuesday's referendum. "This means we are going to have to make cuts affecting services at both the general government and Board of Education levels."

Lewis also said she was upset by a filer distributed by Republicans on Monday which "misled" voters and influenced the outcome of the referendum. She said the filer indicated that \$47,000 being held in contingency for raises still under negotiation could have been used to offset the tax increase, along with state surplus allocations coming to Coventry. Lewis said that information was misleading because the contingency money cannot be used and the state money will be dedicated to specific uses.

But Republican Councilman Phillip Bouchard defended the general government spending, arguing that it was not misleading, but rather informed the voters of the real situation. Bouchard said he expected the budget defeat. "The council failed to adjust

spending," Bouchard said. "I told them things done in haste would come back to them. It did." Bouchard said the council needs to look at the budget "line by line and rigorously apply all additional revenue."

The budget proposal includes \$6 million for education, \$2 million for the current 31.29 mill tax rate. The Democratic majority on the Town Council attributed the defeat to the tax rate, not the spending plan, and therefore brought the budget to voters again without changing it.

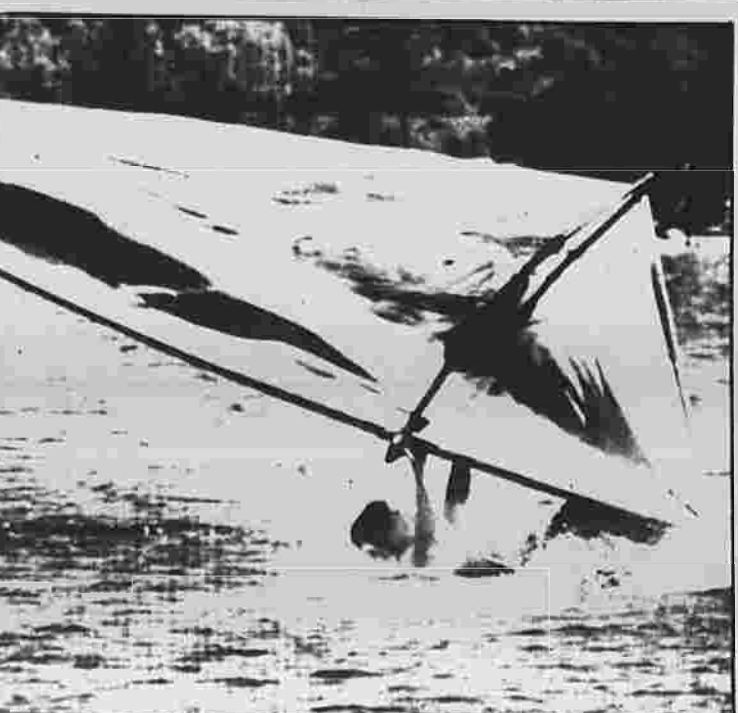

## State and bridge designer trade charges of negligence

NORWALK — The jury today was to view a videotape of the grisly aftermath of the Mianus River bridge collapse as the state and the bridge designer traded charges of negligence.

Connecticut and New York City. The disaster fueled a national debate on the nation's infrastructure and led Connecticut to initiate a 10-year, \$5.5 billion highway repair program.

The state earlier this year agreed to pay a total of \$6.713 million to the three survivors of the collapse and the estates of the three men killed. It did not, however, admit liability. The state is seeking recovery of those payments, in addition to other damages estimated at \$20 million or more, from Tippetts-Abbett-McCarthy.

State and federal officials agree that the movement of a 7-inch-wide steel bolt caused the collapse. But the state and the engineering firm disagree over what caused the bolt to slip. Bolts held together the hanger assemblies at each end of the bridge's suspended 100-foot sections.

A NATIONAL Transportation Safety Board investigation concluded that the bridge's pin-and-hanger assembly had rusted, causing the failure. Federal investigators also found that state bridge inspectors were ignorant of nationally recognized inspection procedures.

Tippetts-Abbett-McCarthy, Stratton, in its own report, agreed that the bridge collapsed because of shoddy inspection. The firm said that if state inspectors followed procedures outlined in a 1976 Department of Transportation manual, they would have discovered signs of corrosion and been able to prevent the accident.

WILLIAM RUSH, attorney for the engineering firm of Tippetts-Abbett-McCarthy-Stratton of Manhattan, told jurors that the state was at fault because of shoddy inspection and maintenance practices.

Rush, a Bridgeport attorney, referred to the reports in court, telling jurors the state's bridge inspectors had a "lack of knowledge and training." He noted that the last inspection of the Mianus

bridge before the collapse was done from 70 feet below the structure by an inspector using binoculars.

Rush also said the bridge, built in 1957, was similar in design to other bridges constructed during the 1950s.

THE STATE, armed with the report of a private engineering consultant it hired, contends the bridge's skewed design doomed its support system. Rather than being connected at a 90-degree angle to its piers, the span connects at a 54-degree angle. The state consultant said the rusted pin-and-hanger assembly didn't cause the failure and claimed the rust actually acted as a weld, holding the sections together and delaying the collapse.

"Our claim is that the skew angle created a force that pushed the bridge sideways, and it should have been known that the skew was too great and should have been eliminated," said Bai, also a Bridgeport lawyer.

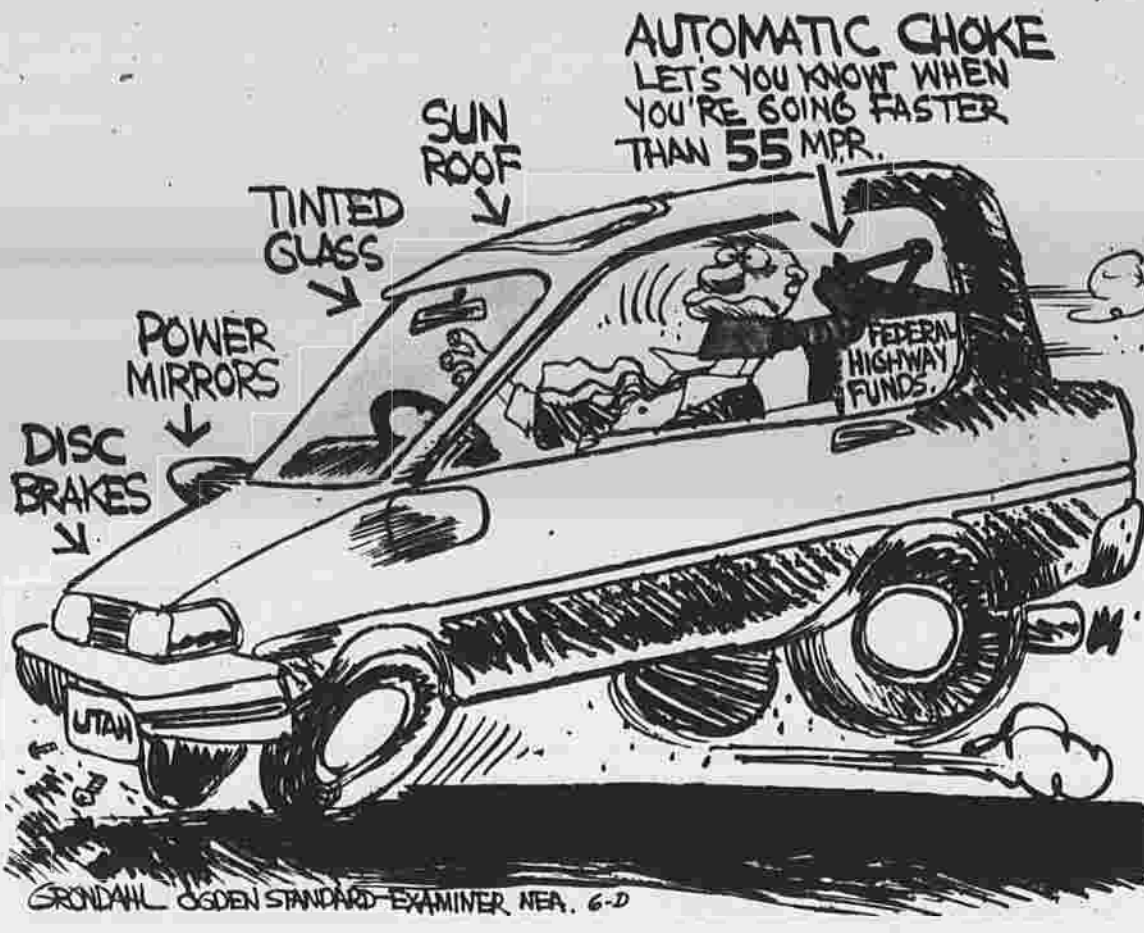

U.S. probes theft of technology

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Customs Service and the Justice Department are investigating allegations that Israel illegally smuggled U.S. technology to build cluster bombs, a Customs spokesman said Tuesday night.

U.S. had been supplying Israel with the bombs prior to 1982, but revoked its approval because of reports about Israeli use of the bombs in their Lebanese invasion. When detonated, cluster bombs release hundreds of smaller explosives.

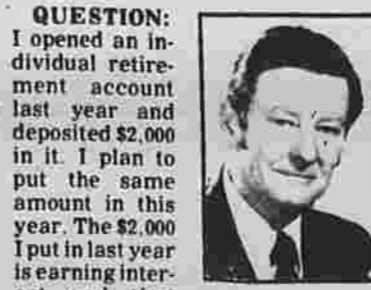

IRA interest does not constitute a contribution

QUESTION: I opened an individual retirement account last year and deposited \$2,000 in it. I plan to put the same amount in this year. The \$2,000 I put in last year is earning interest and that presents a problem. As a single person, the maximum I am allowed to contribute to the IRA annually is \$2,000. If I put \$2,000 in this year, that amount and the interest will exceed \$2,000. To avoid "over contributing," I will withdraw the interest. Because I am under age 59 1/2, there is supposed to be a 10 percent tax penalty on IRA withdrawals. I can understand paying regular

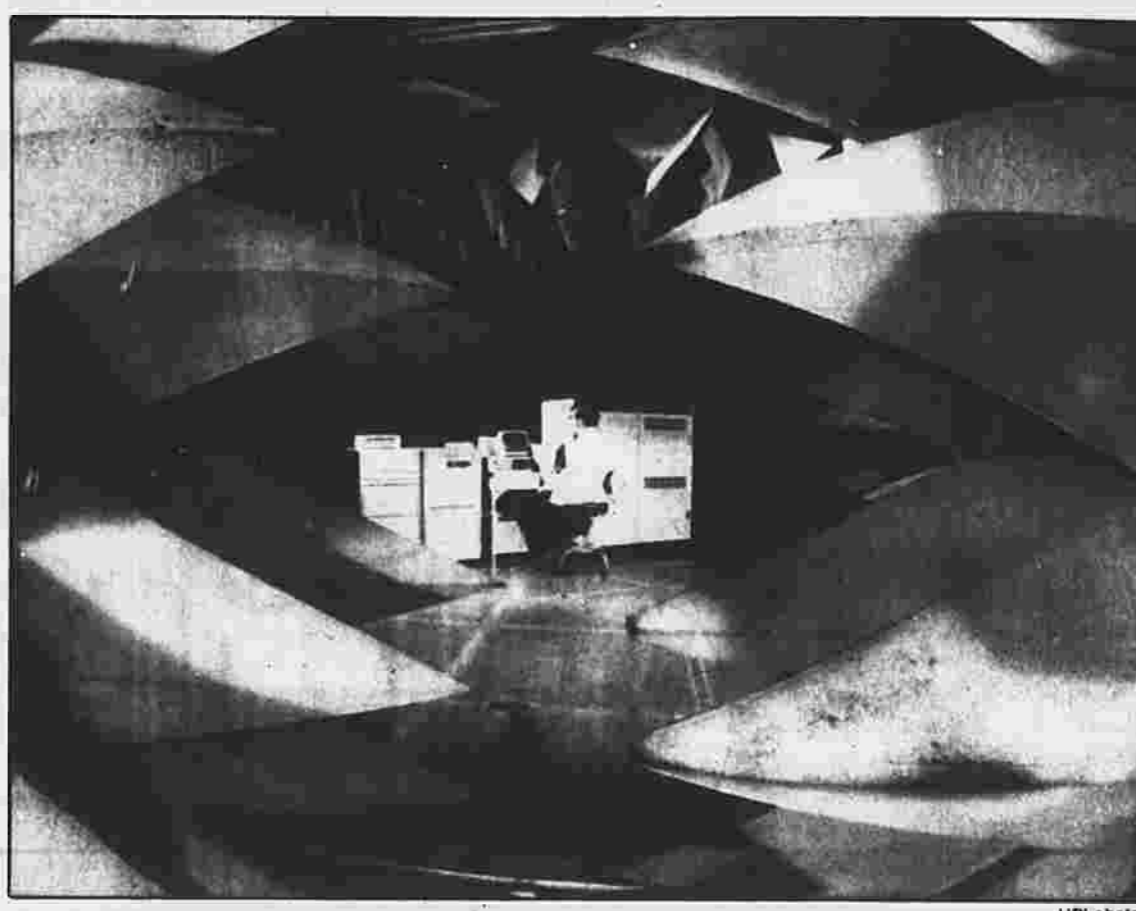
reaching that age or becoming permanently disabled must pay regular income tax, plus the 10 percent penalty. However, you don't have to withdraw the interest your IRA earns. You're badly mixed up about the contribution limits. That interest does not count as a contribution. The money you put into an IRA, plus everything that it earns in the form of interest, dividends or growth in value, is sheltered from income tax until you withdraw it. If you leave your IRA intact for many years, the interest it earns each year will compound and might actually exceed the money you put in as contributions. As long as you can afford to leave your IRA untouched, don't withdraw the interest. By tapping the IRA before age 59 1/2, you would be subject to an unnecessary tax bite.

QUESTION: I am out of work and my unemployment compensation has run out. I have an individual retirement account with a local bank. Can I draw money out of the IRA without paying a penalty? ANSWER: Not unless you are at least 59 1/2 years old or are permanently disabled. If you're under that age and in good health, there are no exceptions to the rule that you must pay regular federal income tax and a 10 percent penalty tax on IRA withdrawals. However, because you are unemployed and if you have no other taxable income, you're probably in a very low income tax bracket. As a result, the tax bite on the IRA withdrawals might not be terribly large. But there is another thing you

Stock slide shows signs of slowing

The stock market suffered more big losses in the second day of trading following Monday's record sell-off, but there were some signs that the dizzying plunge may be slowing down. After remaining down by nearly 30 points for much of Tuesday's session, the Dow Jones average of 30 industrial stocks trimmed some of its losses to close with an 18.27-point decline at 1,820.72. That put the combined two-day loss at 80.14 points. A record 61.87-point drop - to 1,839 - was posted Monday, topping the previous record drop of 45.75 points June 5. In the broader market Tuesday, about five stocks fell for each one that rose on the New York Stock Exchange. Big Board volume totaled 174.06 million shares, against 138.23 million in the previous session. Only a week ago, the Dow Jones industrials had closed at an all-time high of 1,969.33, which was about 33 percent higher than it was in late September, when the market began to rebound. Tumbling stock prices also affected the credit markets Tuesday. The Treasury's 30-year bond, generally considered a trend-

New digital technology may reduce phone costs

WALTHAM, Mass. (UPI) - A new digital telecommunications technology developed by GTE Labs quadruples the capacity of carrying capacity standard cable or radio communication systems and could lead to lower telephone costs. GTE developed a way to code and compress four voice channels into the space of a single channel without quality distortion experienced by those attempting the same procedure in the past. Redmond said Tuesday. "This is a significant advancement for the telecommunications

industry," he said. "The technology we've developed at our lab measurably increases communication efficiency." "Ultimately, this new technology may result in lower telephone bills to consumers." A hardware prototype of the system was developed for laboratory use, and the technology could be in commercial utilization within a year, Redmond said. The company has applied for patents on the product. The new technology "digitizes" speech, or codes it electronically, at a rate of 16 kilobits per second for transmission over telephone circuits, Redmond said. The stand-

ard rate is 64 kilobits per second or four times less efficient. A single hardware unit using the new technology could carry 96 channels as opposed to the 24 of the current system, he said. Digital telecommunications represents speech through sampled electrical signals. The other telecommunications transmission method is analog, which is unsampled direct electrical speech and applied research in electronics, photonics, telecommunications, artificial intelligence and materials science.

Rural bank failures may soon threaten farmers

WASHINGTON (AP) - The number of bank failures in rural America so far has not hurt a large segment of the people who live on farms and in small towns, but the situation may be changing, a report by the Agriculture Department says. In 1985, there were 118 commercial bank failures, the most in a single year since the Depression of the 1930s. About two-thirds of the failures were in rural areas, particularly farming communities. "Most failed banks are replaced by healthy ones within a few days," the report said. "This may be changing, however."

The problem involves the Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. which steps in when failure is imminent. The FDIC, as receiver, then decides the procedures for closing the bank. Over the 1983-85 period, 239 commercial banks failed. Of that number, 137 were rural, and 107 - some of which also were rural - specialized in financing agricultural activity. Snags delay UTC radar

HARTFORD (AP) - United Technologies Corp. says technical problems have delayed completion and "significantly" increased the cost of an advanced radar system under development. Norden Systems, a UTC subsidiary, was contracted to provide the radar systems. UTC spokesman Tom Drohan refused Tuesday to say who the radar system is being built for, when it was originally due for completion or when it will be delivered. Drohan said UTC is establishing a pre-tax provision of \$155 million for expected losses stemming from the radar system. The provision will reduce the company's second-quarter earnings by approximately 75 cents a share, he said. Drohan said that despite the expected losses, UTC expects to report a profit for the quarter when it issues its results later this month.

said Richard D. Bronson of Bronson and Hutensky.

"All parties are winners here," added Donald Bookle, vice president of development for Melvin, Simon & Associates. "The synergism created by the Homart and Hartman Tobacco projects will be greater than the sum of either individual project."

Further details on the mall's location will be available later, Boynton said.

The mall will house major department stores including Sears, G. Fox and Co., Sage Allen and Co., Steiger's and D&L. Boynton said. Sears and D&L had made commitments to Buckland Hills, while the other three retailers had made plans for outlets in Winchester.

The agreement confirms reports in the Herald last week, when sources close to the developers said an agreement to build just one major shopping center was near. Those sources said that although nothing was definite, it appeared the mall would be located in Manchester and would include all

five of the major retailers.

An agreement was sought, officials said, because the developers were trying to curtail delays both were experiencing due to a number of lawsuits each had filed against the other. Those suits will be dropped as part of the agreement, officials said.

But there are two additional suits pending against the Buckland Hills site that cannot be overlooked.

The first involves a group of residents who have questioned the mall's effect on the environment.

Manchester attorney Bruce S. Beck, who represents the Manchester Environmental Coalition, could not be reached for comment today. The environmental group has charged that the Manchester Planning and Zoning Commission should have held a public hearing to consider the effect the wetlands permit would have on the area before it granted Homart the permit last November.

A second suit was filed last week by the town of South Windsor, which is charging that the State Traffic Commission issued the traffic permit to Homart without

properly considering the traffic impact of Buckland Hills on South Windsor's streets.

Hartford attorney Ralph G. Elliot, who represents South Windsor, said today he has instructions to continue with the suit.

When asked if the suit would be dropped now that it appeared South Windsor would receive at least some of development, Elliot said: "The purpose of the suit was not for any strategic purposes. The STC did not consider the effects of the mall's traffic on South Windsor roads. That being the case, I don't see that anything has changed."

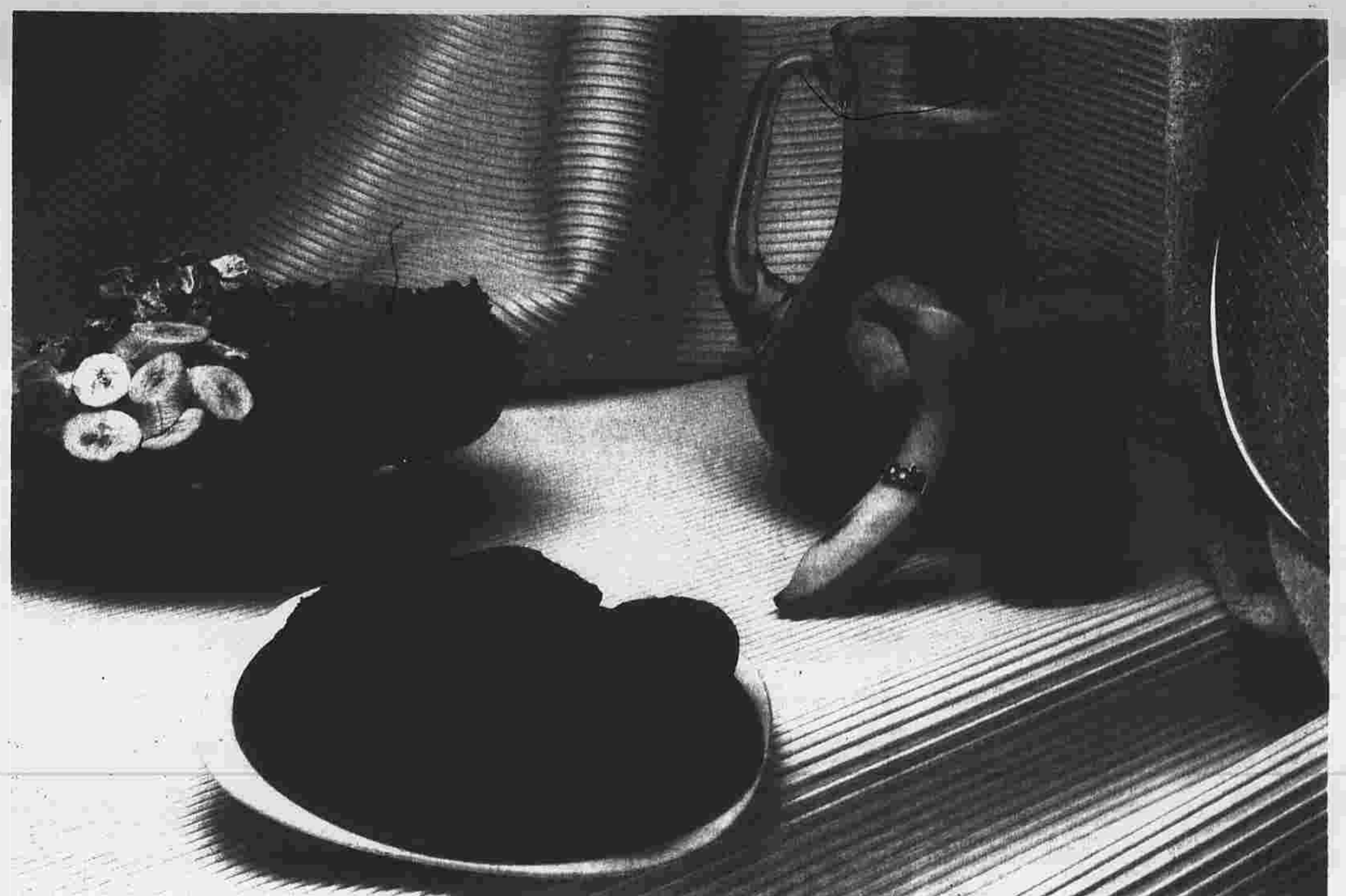

- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1-1/4 cups flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

#### PEANUT CHICKEN SALAD

- 3 medium Bananas, peeled
- 3 cups cooked chunked chicken
- 1/2 cup sliced celery
- 1/3 cup peanuts
- 2 tablespoons chopped green onion
- Spicy Lite Dressing
- Crisp salad greens
- 2 apples, cored, sliced
- 2 oranges, peeled, sliced

#### BANANA-ORANGE YOGURT TART

- 3 extra-ripe, large Bananas, peeled
- 1 cup orange juice
- 4 teaspoons unflavored gelatin
- 2 cartons (8 oz. each) vanilla yogurt
- 1 tablespoon grated orange peel
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar
- Gingersnap Crust
- 1 teaspoon cornstarch
- 1 firm Dole Banana, peeled, sliced
- 1 large orange, peeled, sectioned

Purée 3 extra-ripe bananas in blender (1-1/2 cups.) Pour 1/2 cup orange juice into medium saucepan. Sprinkle gelatin over juice to soften. Heat mixture until gelatin dissolves. Cool slightly. Stir in puréed bananas, yogurt, orange peel and sugar. Set saucepan over bowl of ice water to thicken slightly, but not until firm. Stir occasionally. Turn thickened mixture into Gingersnap Crust. Chill until firm overnight. Meanwhile, combine remaining 1/2 cup orange juice with cornstarch. Cook until sauce boils and thickens. Cool. 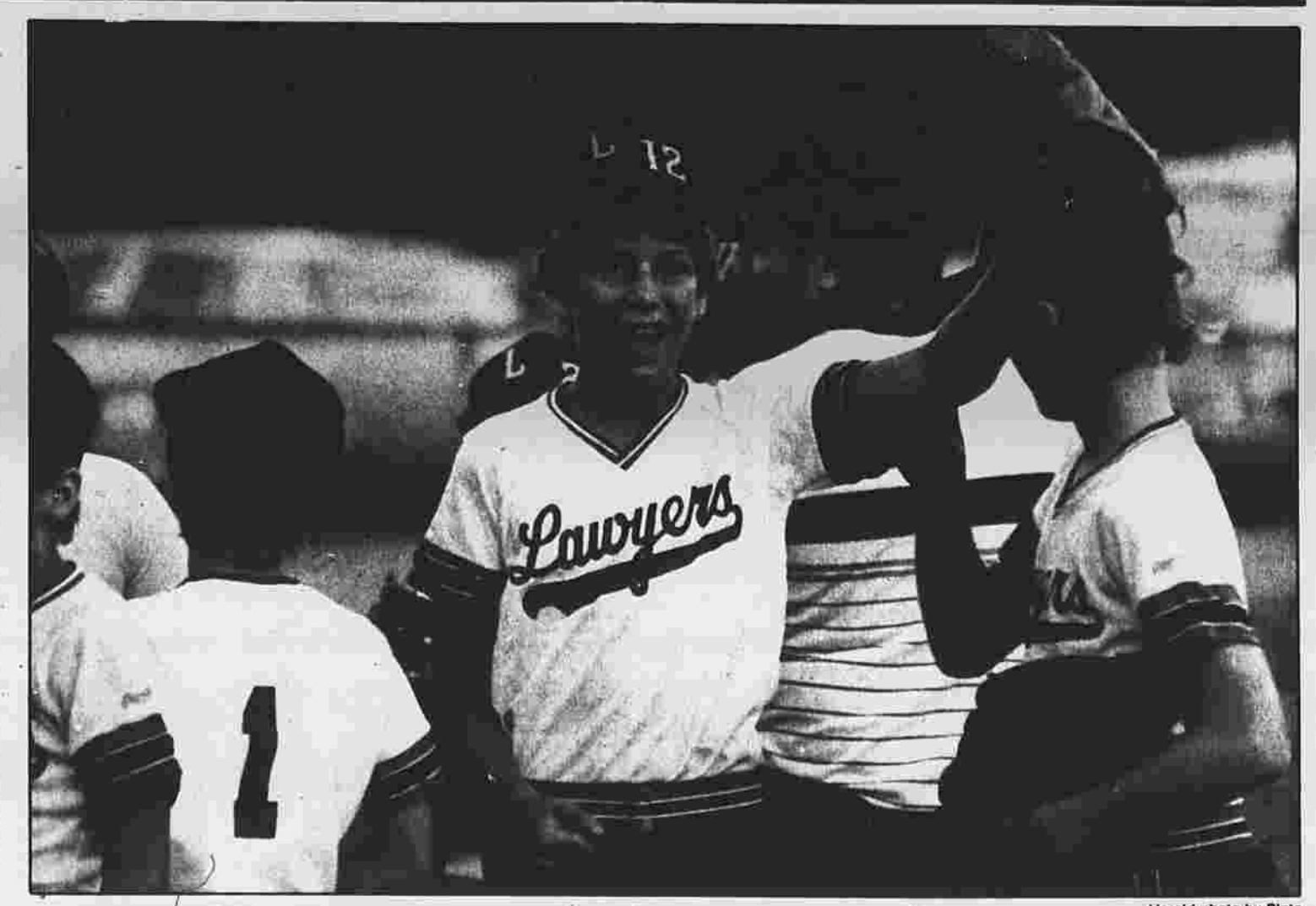

# Tax reform in real estate will likely affect large numbers

There will be tax reform. Whatever your personal judgment, it will be hailed by the politicians as a wise and fair law, it will be approved by tax professionals as simplifying the language of the law so all of us can at least read it, and it will immediately result in new investment strategies.

It will be months before the details are clear on how tax shelters are truly affected, pro and con. It will be even longer — perhaps years — before we are sure how investment decisions on cash flow, appreciation, write-offs, and so on are changed.

And perhaps in no area will the changes be more evident than in real estate — affecting countless numbers of us in every income class and in every educational

group from coast to coast. For guidance on the crucial questions concerning you, I consulted Ronald B. Bruder, president of the Brookhill Group, a nationwide investment and management firm, headquartered in New York City.

**QUESTION:** Are there any positive points for real estate in the law?

**ANSWER:** Lower tax rates would mean that investors would seek income-oriented investments, and any taxable income

would obviously be taxed at the lower rates.

**QUESTION:** How would this law affect real estate tax shelters?

**ANSWER:** It would limit the ability of investors in all areas, including real estate, to use tax losses to offset other current income. The excess tax losses would accumulate until the property is sold and then be used to offset any gain.

Actually, this provision is largely redundant. At a tax bracket maximum of 27 percent, most investors won't want tax shelters.

A \$1 loss would save you only 27 cents in taxes — hardly enough to justify investing in a non-economic property.

**QUESTION:** What about property you own and manage yourself?

**ANSWER:** The law would be almost as hard on these investments as on "packaged" tax

shelters. Deductible losses would be limited to start with and would dwindle gradually to zero as your income rose.

**QUESTION:** What other changes would affect real estate?

**ANSWER:** Depreciation schedules would be extended, interest deductions would be limited, investors would have to be personally "at risk" on some of the notes they sign. Taken together, the tax burden on real estate may well be much higher.

**QUESTION:** How about write-offs for a first or second home?

**ANSWER:** Let's say your house payments now are \$1,000 a month, of which 80 percent (\$800) is deductible. If you're in a 50 percent tax bracket, that \$800 deduction is worth \$400 to you. Your net payment is really \$600 a month. With a tax bracket of 27 percent, an \$800 deduction saves you only \$216. Your after-tax cost goes to \$784 —

an increase of more than 30 percent from the \$600 you were paying.

**QUESTION:** In the real estate limited partnership area, what types of investments still will be attractive?

**ANSWER:** many sponsors will offer partnerships that offer high tax-free yields. Let's say you put \$10,000 into a partnership that buys a shopping center for \$20 million, using \$10 million in cash and \$10 million in mortgages to purchase the property. Suppose the partnership's net income on the property is \$800,000 (8 percent of the cash invested). However, the partnership still is allowed to depreciate the property, which might be worth \$666,000 (3 percent) a year. Thus, a partnership's taxable income would be \$133,000 and your share would be \$133. If you're in the 27 percent tax bracket, you would pay only \$36 in taxes. That would leave you with \$764 out of your \$800 cash distribution. On your \$10,000

investment, that is a 7.64 percent after-tax yield.

**QUESTION:** Does that mean real estate investors must settle for no more than 6 percent to 8 percent?

**ANSWER:** No. As the rents from the property increase, the investors' returns should go up. The distribution might go from 8 percent to 9 percent, and so on. This can't happen if you invest in bonds. Rising rents will make your property more valuable.

Another strategy likely to become more popular is property refinancing. If the shopping centers grew in value, the sponsor might make a mortgage and distribute the proceeds to the investors, tax-free. You, the investor, would have all your money back, plus all the cash distributions to that date.
