Index leaps, but economy holds steady

By Martin Crutinger The Associated Press WASHINGTON — The government's main gauge of future economic activity shot up 2.1 percent in December, the biggest increase in almost four years. The increase in the Commerce Department's Index of Leading Indicators was the fourth in a row and followed a substantial 0.9 percent November gain. Analysts, who had been expecting a strong performance out of the index, cautioned against reading too much into the December number. They said it reflected various temporary factors such as a year-end rush to beat tax law changes rather than reflecting any significant long-term rebound in the economy.

PZC asks aid for Oakland

Kirch Herald Reporter The Planning and Zoning Commission expressed concern Monday night for traffic problems on parts of Oakland Street, and is asking the town's legislators to push for road-improvement funds for the street. Specifically, the commission will ask the Manchester Board of Directors to approach state Reps. James R. McCavay and D. Manchester, John W. Thompson, D-Manchester, and Sen. Michael P. Meotti, D-Glastonbury, about getting money to improve Oakland Street from North Main Street north to Tolland Turnpike. Development has increased traffic on the street drastically over the last few years, commission members said. "Many developers do traffic studies and say their development won't have an effect on (Oakland) street," said commission member Theodore Brindamour. "But it's like adding a drop of water to a glass that's already full. It will spill over."

Fatal alarm

"We should really jump on that Oakland Street problem," commission member William Beyer said. The PZC's comments came as the commission reviewed a town-sponsored traffic study of Manchester's North End. The study, which was conducted during the summer by Purcell Associates and cost the town \$120,000, identified 11 road stretches that would improve if local streets are to handle traffic in northern Manchester, where a giant mall and high-density industrial, commercial and residential development is being planned. Raise looms over House

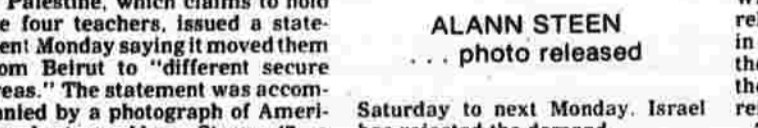
WASHINGTON (AP) — Members of Congress and 3,000 high-level federal officials will get hefty pay raises if the House doesn't vote against the increases by midnight tonight. The Senate turned down the \$12,100 pay raise for Congress last Thursday, leaving the House in the uncomfortable position of being the final voice on the politically sensitive issue. To make it impossible for the House to simply ignore the issue, the killing of the increase was made an amendment to emergency legislation for the homeless. House Speaker Jim Wright, D-Texas, has indicated the House likely will follow the Senate's lead and reject the increases. "If we put it to a vote on the House floor, I'm sure it'll fail," Rep. Frank Horton, R-N.Y., said Monday as a House tax force heard testimony on the pay raises. The raises are to take effect at midnight tonight if the House does not act to stop them. President Reagan last month recommended the raises for Congress and other federal officials. Among the raises were a 1.5 percent increase for the Senate and House, which would put the congressional paychecks at \$89,500. Cabinet members' pay would rise 12.5 percent, to \$92,500. Supreme Court justices would go up 2.6 percent, to \$116,000; and federal district judges 10.4 percent, to \$89,500.

Captors say hostages moved to frustrate American attack

BEIRUT, Lebanon — The Muslim kidnappers of three Americans and an Indian said they moved the captives out of Beirut because they believe the United States plans to attack Lebanon in an effort to free the hostages. A student-called general strike protesting the Jan. 24 kidnappings of the four teachers from Beirut University College paralyzed Lebanon yesterday. Hundreds of chanting, placard-waving students staged street demonstrations demanding the hostages' immediate release. "You (kidnappers) have gone too far. It's too much," chanted the demonstrators as they marched through the commercial thoroughfare of Hamra Banks, restaurants, schools, shops and other businesses were closed by the strike. Islamic Jihad for the Liberation of Palestine, which claims to hold the hostages, issued a statement Monday saying it moved them from Beirut to "different secure areas." The statement was accompanied by a photograph of American hostage Alann Steen, 47, a communications instructor at Beirut University College. The group also renewed its threat to kill the hostages unless Israel releases 400 Arab prisoners, but moved the deadline back from Saturday to next Monday. Israel has rejected the demand. The group also has threatened to kill the teachers if the United States attacks Lebanon. Its latest statement, handwritten in Arabic and delivered to Western news agency and the

Questions surround CIA pick

WASHINGTON — Before CIA veteran Robert M. Gates can win Senate confirmation as head of the spy agency, he may have to explain his failure to tell Congress about the use of Iran arms money to help Nicaraguan rebels.

Gates' selection came after former Republican Sen. Howard Baker of Tennessee reportedly turned down the job.

Gates is a scholar and experienced bureaucrat. After obtaining a doctorate in Soviet history from Georgetown University in 1974 while working at the CIA, Gates spent six years on loan to the White House National Security Council, serving under Reagan, Ford and Carter.

Confirmation hearings may focus more on his role in the Iran-Contra affair than his credentials, however.

Some members of Congress have argued that the CIA violated the law by failing to inform the congressional intelligence committees of the secret channel of funds for the Contra rebels in Nicaragua.

Rep. Dave McCurdy, D-Okla., a member of the House Intelligence Committee, said, "One of the assets Bob has is that he'll be able to bridge the gap, and there was a tremendous gap between Congress and director Casey."
