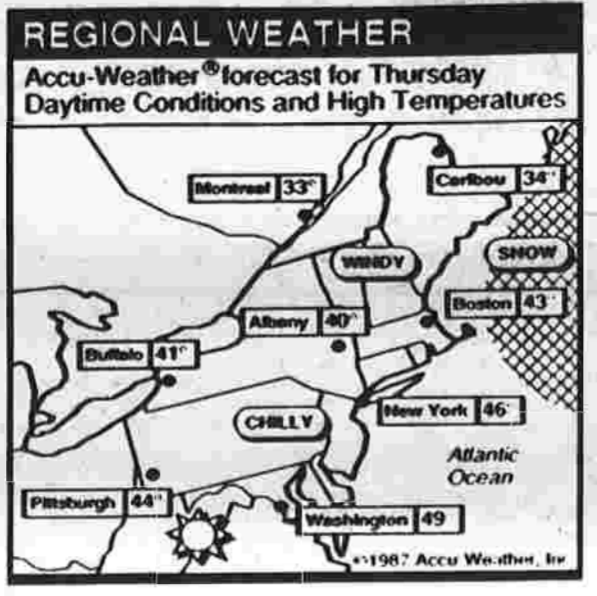


Snow falls in East; Northwest is rainy

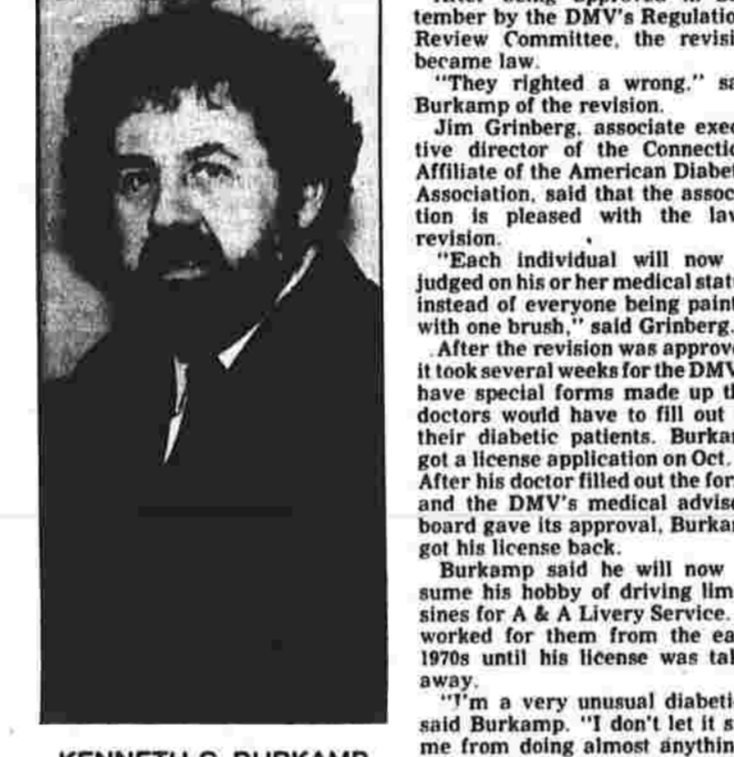

They dig for their dinner

Some people dig for gold. Margie and Dominic Gentileore of Maple Street dig for clams. Throughout the summer, the Gentileores spend days with friends on the shore of Rhode Island, digging for the delicacy that Margie later transforms into tasty dishes. With pall and clam racks, the seafaring couple don bathing suits and wade into the water, carefully choosing the clams they believe will taste the best.

"Any opening at all, the clams are not good," said Mrs. Gentileore. The tighter the seal, the healthier the clam. But even when you find just the right clam, you may not be able to bring it home with you. The state of Rhode Island restricts the quantity and size of clams for lay fishermen.

"A little painful is what you're allowed to take," said Mr. Gentileore. But the Gentileores are satisfied with what they get. And their efforts pay off. Mrs. Gentileore's stuffed clams were fresh and light requiring minimal churning. However, keeping the clams fresh on top of each. Bake for 45 minutes at 350 degrees. Serve with lemon wedges.

White clam sauce 1/4 cup olive oil 1 stick butter 4 cloves garlic, minced 1 cup parsley, chopped fine 2 cups clam broth 2 cups clam broth 1/2 pound bacon (approximate) Mix together all ingredients, except the bacon. Clean clam shells and fill with mixture. Put 2 strips of bacon on top of each. Bake for 45 minutes at 350 degrees. Serve with lemon wedges.

Post office's 'Rebategate' nabs fraudulent refunders

They got caught in the act! Lurking in the shadows of refunding are the cheaters who ignore the manufacturers' rules and restrictions. Some of them tell their friends that they laugh all the way to the bank. But they aren't laughing now, not since 'Rebategate'.

Clip 'n' file refunds

Cleaning Products, Soaps, Paper Products, Bags, Wraps (File 1) Clip out this file and keep it with similar cash-off coupons - beverage refund offers with beverage coupons, for example. Start collecting the needed proofs of purchase while looking for the required forms at the supermarket, in newspapers and magazines, and when trading with friends. Offers may not be available in all areas of the country. Allow 10 weeks to receive each refund.

For the Record

In a recipe published in the Manchester Herald on Oct. 28, the directions for a filo dessert invented by Ruth Staum omitted one step. Among the rebates Lasater received were eight \$100 rebates from RCA. This offer required the warranty card from an RCA video product and two box tops from Ritz crackers! It wasn't the different post-office boxes that tripped up Lasater. His role was revealed by one of the suspects during questioning. Once the investigation got into full swing, the Rebategate did not hesitate to turn in their fellow cheaters. Some of them were merely known by reputations gained at refund conventions or from advertisements they placed in refund publications. Nancy Demison, of Jenison, Mich., pleaded guilty and admitted stealing proofs of purchase from packages in supermarket aisles. Faced with penalties of as much as \$1,000 for each count or five years in prison, there are few refunding joys left for the Rebategaters. Most of them have pleaded guilty and now await sentencing.

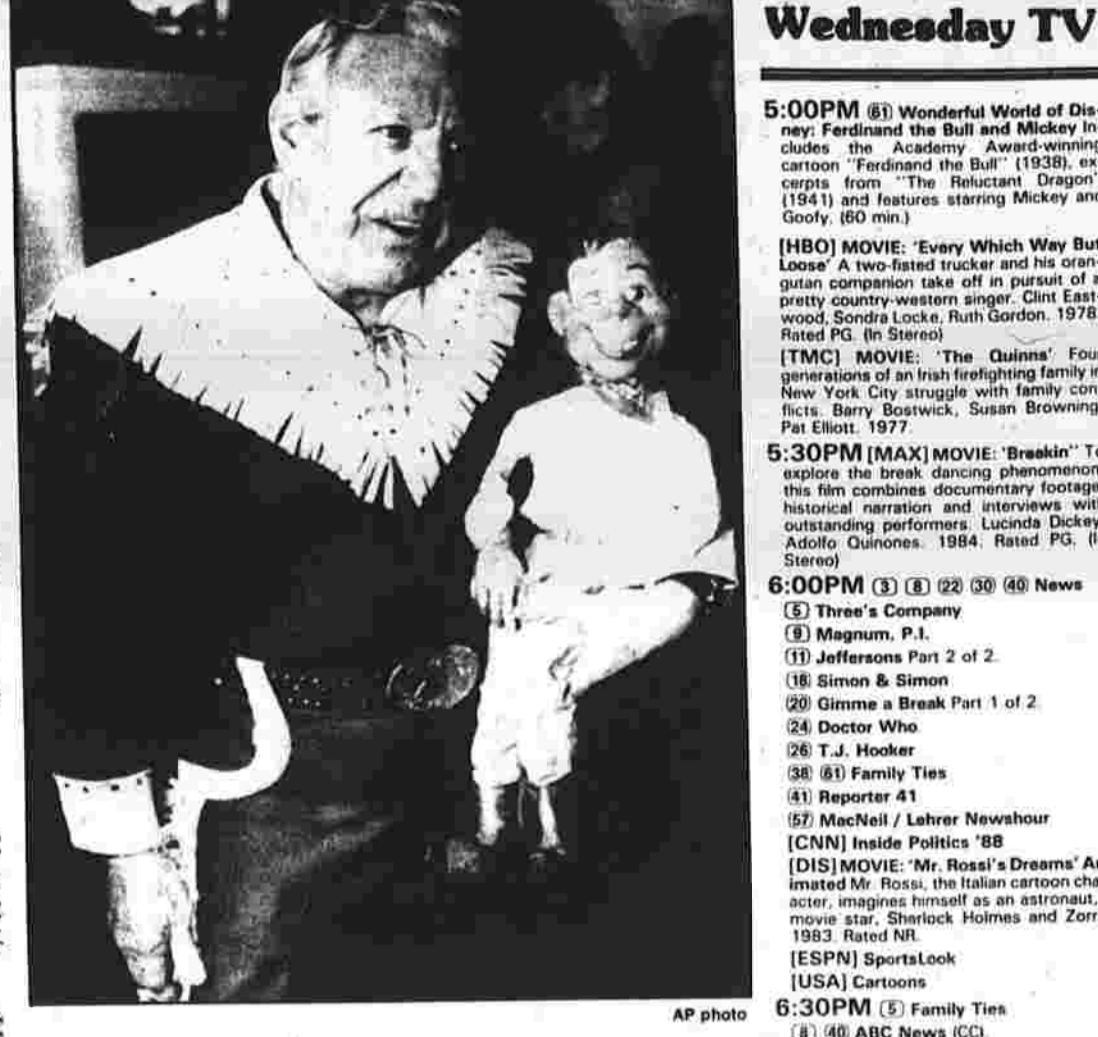
