Parties leave Parliament

NEW DELHI, India (AP) — Members of every opposition party walked out of Parliament today to protest the government's acceptance of \$470 million from Union Carbide for the 1984 Bhopal gas leak, which killed 3,400 people.

The government had settled for the amount after suing the Dunbury, Conn.-based corporation for \$3 billion for the world's deadliest industrial disaster. Opposition legislators yelling "surrender to multinationals!" left Parliament after House Speaker Balram Jakhar refused to admit a censure motion against the government's acceptance of the Supreme Court's Feb. 14 order that instructed Union Carbide to pay the \$470 million as full and final settlement.

Madhu Dandavate, the leader of the opposition in Parliament and a member of the Janata Party, said: "What we are talking about is very basic. The fundamental right to human life has been violated by the Supreme Court order." Jakhar, a member of Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi's Congress Party, scheduled a special discussion later today on the Bhopal settlement "in view of the extreme importance of the matter."

System overhaul needed

WASHINGTON (AP) — Experts inside the Internal Revenue Service are recommending a thorough overhaul of the 150 separate civil penalties that can be imposed on people who make tax mistakes.

Although the proposals have not been approved by the IRS or higher federal agencies, most of the suggestions have been endorsed by IRS Commissioner Lawrence B. Gibbs. He says the present crazy-quilt penalty system is difficult for taxpayers to understand and the IRS to enforce. "While the merit of each individual penalty can be defended, when taken together they sometimes produce unintended results and have a combined impact that can be too severe," Gibbs said Tuesday.

\$1 billion in heroin seized

NEW YORK (AP) — In the largest heroin raid in U.S. history, police and federal agents tracked \$1 billion worth of drug from Southeast Asia to two homes in New York City, where it was hidden inside hundreds of tires.

The 800-pound seizure made the notorious "French Connection" case seem modest by comparison, and showcased the rise of Asian drug smugglers, authorities said Tuesday. U.S. Attorney Andrew Maloney said "Operation White Mare" and some other recent cases provide "clear proof that the Chinese are responsible for 70 to 80 percent of the heroin that is smuggled into New York."

INS detains refugees

BAYVIEW, Texas (AP) — At least a dozen Central American refugees have been detained and hundreds more kept quietly under federal immigration policy of quickly evaluating applications for political asylum.

The new policy went into effect slowly Tuesday, the day after it was announced by Immigration and Naturalization Service officials who said they wanted to discourage Central Americans from entering the United States with "frivolous" applications for asylum. By Tuesday afternoon, only 45 Central Americans, half from Nicaragua, were under review while 200 others waited to be processed.

North's trial begins

WASHINGTON (AP) — The former chairman of the House intelligence committee is the first witness called by Iran-Contra prosecutors intent on showing that Oliver North subverted democracy by lying about his secret support of Nicaraguan rebels.

Associate independent counsel John Kecker told jurors in his opening statement Tuesday that Lee Hamilton's panel wanted to know what North was doing in 1985 following news reports he was helping the Contras in defiance of a congressional ban. "You'll hear Lee Hamilton say that there is a difference between keeping secrets and telling lies and you don't have to tell lies to keep secrets," Kecker told the jury.

Japan offers apology

BEIJING (AP) — An official Chinese newspaper today accused Japan's prime minister of trying to whitewash Japanese aggression during World War II.

Japan's ambassador to China apologized for any misunderstanding over Prime Minister Noboru Takeshita's statement and said Japan recognized the great harm it inflicted on other Asian countries during the war. The China Daily commentary criticized Takeshita's speech last week to Japan's Parliament, in which he said future historians must decide whether Japan was the aggressor in the war. The newspaper said it was surprised that Takeshita "should make such cynical utterances" and "would rather resort to sophistry than speak the truth."

Rebels make a new offer

OAXTEPEC, Mexico (AP) — A month after offering to participate in national elections, El Salvador's leftist rebels say they will lay down their weapons if the armed forces are cut and next month's presidential vote is postponed.

Leaders of the country's political parties, to whom the rebel Farabundo Marti Liberation Front made the offer on Tuesday, said it seemed to reflect a sincere guerrilla desire for peace. They said in a resolution that they would today meet with President Jose Napoleon Duarte and ask him to immediately engage the rebels in talks.

Chemotherapy isn't needed

BOSTON (AP) — A federal recommendation to give chemotherapy to all victims of early breast cancer will mean needlessly treating 65,000 women at a cost of \$338 million to improve the outlook for just 5,000 others, a new analysis concludes.

Until recently, drug and hormone therapy were given exclusively to women whose tumors had spread to their lymph nodes. Those whose cancer had not visibly progressed beyond their breasts were treated with surgery and radiation therapy alone.

However, four new studies suggest that even those with early breast cancer could benefit from chemotherapy drug treatment. The therapy somewhat improves their chances of remaining cancer-free during the years immediately after their surgery, although there is no evidence that they ultimately live any longer.

Three of the studies, conducted in the United States, were the basis of an unusual recommendation last May by the National Cancer Institute. Without revealing details of the studies, the agency sent letters to cancer specialists suggesting that they give drug therapy to all breast cancer patients.

'Greenhouse' action urged

WASHINGTON (AP) — The nation should react to the greenhouse effect on global warming by using natural gas instead of coal and by developing "safe and publicly acceptable" nuclear power, a House panel was told.

Robert M. White, president of the National Academy of Engineering, said Tuesday these are among measures needed to prevent further build-up of greenhouse gases that could be responsible for global warming. White and three other witnesses cautioned that scientists still do not know whether burning of fossil fuels and other human activities will cause significant temperature changes, leading to heat waves and drought.

One witness, University of Virginia professor Patrick J. Michaels, told a House Energy and Commerce subcommittee it would be more prudent to await more study before making drastic policy decisions. "Our policy should be commensurate with the state of our scientific knowledge," the professor of environmental sciences told the energy and power subcommittee.

Few take diabetes tests

KALAMAZOO, Mich. (AP) — Barely half the nation's adults have been tested in the past year for diabetes — the third leading killer disease. A survey by the Gallup Organization — commissioned by Johnson Co. — found that 46.5 percent of the 1,064 adults questioned had not

followed the call for annual blood screening made last year by the American Diabetes Association and the National Institutes of Health. People over 40, overweight and with a family history of diabetes are targeted as most at risk.

An estimated 12 million Americans have diabetes but only half know it. Left untreated, diabetes can damage blood vessels and nerves, leading to kidney disease, gangrene and blindness in addition to heart attack and stroke.

Group fights drug lollipops

WASHINGTON (AP) — A health research group today asked the Food and Drug Administration to stop experiments in which children facing painful medical procedures are given lollipops laced with a powerful narcotic.

Public Citizen Health Research Group, in a letter to the FDA, said the drug in the form of a lollipop sends children "a dangerous message" about drugs being candy and is of "dubious clinical need or safety."

However, both the FDA and the Anesta Corp. of Salt Lake City, established by anesthesiologists and the University of Utah to test and develop an oral form of the drug, defended the study and discounted the potential for drug abuse.

The narcotic, fentanyl, has been approved by the FDA as an injectable drug. In the FDA-approved study, it is mixed with sweeteners, mounted on a stick like a lollipop and administered orally to children before they are given general anesthesia or undergo a painful diagnostic procedure.

Computerized city a first

SANTA MONICA, Calif. (AP) — Santa Monica residents can fire off a complaint to City Hall, look for a job or check to see if the latest best seller is at the library, all by tapping a few computer keys.

Touting itself as the city of the future, Santa Monica's computer system will allow residents with personal computers a direct hook-up with City Hall.

Officials say they will answer each computerized message with a reply sent to that person's own computer. But residents can use the system to do more than complain about municipal problems. They can comb the computer network to find out such things as where to get parking permits and dog licenses, what events are scheduled at the pier and the Santa Monica Civic Auditorium, which city agencies are hiring, and whether or not the books they want to pick up at the local library have already been checked out.

Zoo finds 2nd condor egg

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Two eggs laid by captive pairs of endangered California condors have been placed in incubation while anxious scientists wait to learn whether either one is fertile, zoo officials said.

The newest egg discovered Tuesday at the San Diego Wild Animal Park was produced by condors UN1 and AC4 one day after an egg was found at the state's other breeding station at the Los Angeles Zoo, park spokesman Tom Hanscom said.
