



# Berry picking to be a blast in early June

Strawberry shortcake, strawberry ice cream, strawberries on your cereal ... you get the picture? The strawberry season is almost here, and there's nothing better than enjoying the berries picked fresh from the fields, with your own hands. Because of the cool, wet spring, some growers say this year's berry crop will ripen several weeks later than normal. That means you're not going to start picking until June 10, though in some years Memorial Day marks the start of the berrying. August Zeppa, who was born at the farm he operates on Birch Mountain Road, has spent his entire life around strawberries. He described this spring's weather as terrible for the crops, but

certainly not the worst he's seen. "We got the rain too late that we should have had earlier," Zeppa said Monday. "Now the fields are so wet, some farmers can't get in their fields and cultivate anything." But this year's crop should be plentiful, most

armers say. That will mean prices will remain near ast year's level of 70 to 75 cents per quart. "It's a beautiful crop this year, it's coming right along," said Sue Dufford, whose family owns Riverview Farms in Glastonbury. **DEATH PENALTY:** The House voted 93-57 to toughen Connecticut's death penalty law by giving juries the discretion to weigh aggravating factors against mitigating factors when deciding whether a defendant convicted of capital felony should be put to death. The bill now goes to the Senate. A measure to abolish the death penalty failed, 96-55.

MOTORCYCLE HELMETS: The House voted 97-49 to require 16- and 17-year-old motorcycle drivers to wear helmets. The bill. which also requires applicants for drivers' licenses to complete a course in safe driving and alcohol and drug education, now goes to the

GRASS CARP: The House approved, 143-2, a bill limiting the use of weed-eating amur grass carp, used to clear vegetation that can choke ponds. The bill, now on its way to the governor, imits the fish to so-called contained waters that have no easy outlet, so the fish don't spread. The fear is the fish could damage other lant life needed to sustain other marine life

FOUNDATIONS: The House voted 140-1 to require college foundations to undergo annual private audits. The bill goes to the Senate. A measure requiring state audits failed, 110-31.

#### Security tight for Bush

NEW LONDON (AP) - Security will be tight during President George Bush's visit to the Coast Guard Academy today, and all of the 5,000 people expected to attend the commencement ceremonies, including the graduating cadets, will have to pass through metal detectors, authorities said.





# Coventry's Gagnon doing king-size job

COVENTRY — The basement wall at the Gagnon home took a beating this past winter. Any nicks or cracks in the concrete from the hours of practice turned in by softball pitcher Chrissy Gagnon are well worth it, if you ask Coach Rich Page. The hard work of the long winter months has paid

off for Gagnon, and the Coventry High School Patriots are reaping the fruits of her toils. Gagnon, 16, had the task of filling the shoes of 5-11 Kim Mizesko on the mound. In two years with the Patriots, Mizesko posted a 37-3 mark — the team was 39-3 - and led them to back-to-back Charter Oak Conference championships and a berth in the

1988 state Class S semifinal. The regular season ended for Coventry High on Monday afternoon, and if you check the record you'll see the mighty-mite Gagnon, a junior whose 5-foot-2 stature belies how tall she really stands. has come through with flying colors. She was the driving force as Coventry posted a 14-4 mark and just missed qualifying for the COC title game. Gagnon's season has included a no-hitter and

three one-hitters. Her earned run average is 2.43. "I'm not surprised by what she's done." Page said. "She worked very hard before the season. I didn't know how the rest of the team would play but I know she makes (the opponents) put the bat on the ball. She doesn't give up any freebies."

The freebies Page is talking about are bases on balls. Gagnon's statistic for the regular season bears out his remarks. She worked 118 innings and walked only 16. She worked four consecutive games without giving up a walk. "I don't think too many high school pitchers can do that, especially with someone who has some velocity," Page said.

Gagnon's velocity doesn't match that of her predecessor, Mizesko. But yet she struck out almost one batter per inning, totaling 116 strikeout victims. "Kim had great velocity for a high school pitcher. When she was on, she could throw the ball down the middle of the plate and get away with it.

"She (Gagnon) has good velocity but she has to spot the ball more. She's more of an inside-outside pitcher. She has to pick her spots, Page said." If anything, Gagnon was guilty of throwing too

many strikes early in the season. She gave up a lot of 0-2 hits, a situation she has since corrected. Gagnon follows two All-State hurlers at Coventry High. Mizesko was a two-time selection. Before that, Louise Chamberlain was an All-State selection in her junior year. Whatever pressure


