The bankruptcy lawyers will tell you that it will be on your record for only 10 years. But this is not the whole truth. When you fill out a credit application, it asks, "Have you ever filed bankruptcy?" If you say, "Yes," you really don't have too good a chance. If you say "No," that's fraud.

Abby, please help me tell other young people that the shouldn't file Chapter VII. Tell them, instead, to swallow their pride and go back home if they can, because the long-term effect on their credit rating is devastating. - HUMBLED IN SAN DIEGO

DEAR HUMBLED: I am printing your letter because I think the message it carries could be valuable to everyone, regardless of age. Credit counseling is available for people who find themselves in over their heads. 



WASHINGTON - The end to the Persian Gulf War will not necessarily mean an end to the recession. Peace and prosperity do not go hand in hand. There are too many factors plaguing the economy — quite separate from the war

The one bright spot is that a quick and

spirited war will inspire consumers to come out of their bunkers and start spending money again. The bad news is, if they don't have the money to spend, there will be many purchases on plastic. Factories won't mind the buying spree, but consumers can't afford to increase the level of their debt. If the consumers are smart enough to keep their credit cards in their wallets, then economists will continue to blame them for the recession because of the precipitous drop in spending. Never mind that there are good reasons for putting away the wallet. Consumer confidence is the tail that wags the economic dog. Even though that confidence, administration economists believe, will rebound in the wake of the successful war, the spending-driven boom of the 1980s is not likely to repeat itself in the morning-after days of the 1990s. One of the main reasons is the huge buildup of public and private debt in the 1980s. That will constrain spending for years to come. Americans have been spooked not only by their personal debts, but by the excessive government spending of the Reagan

While recovery may be around the comer, it will be weak and anemic compared to the recovery that began in 1983.

Turnabout Is Fair Play The former head of the Federal Home Loan Bank Board, Edwin Gray, is being urged by his friends to make a bid for the Senate in 1992. Gray is a California Republican who worked faithfully for Ronald Reagan for more than 20 years there. His reward was the job as chief regulator of the savings and loan industry. If Gray should run, he would seek the seat now held by Sen. Alan Cranston, D-Calif., one of the Keating Five recently under investigation by the Senate Ethics Committee for allegedly leaning on S&L regulators to take it easy on Charles Keating.

War Vs. War More than 60 percent of the cocaine sold in the United States is smuggled through Mexico. Joint Mexican-U.S drug teams patrol the border in helicopters, but at least a dozen helicopters used to stop drug smugglers were diverted to the Persian Gulf War. 



Jimmy Tingle, comic

By DOUGLAS J. ROWE The Associated Press

NEW YORK - Jimmy Tingle, a journeyman comic for 11 years, says it himself: He looks like Fred Flintstone's best friend. He stalks the stage, discussing gun control, the Gulf War, censorship and other issues. Along the way, he offers some trenchant observations as setups for the

punchlines. Bam, Bam, Bam: It's the world according to Barney Rubble. Tonight, he opens his one-man show, "The Education of an American Comic" at the Charles Playhouse in Boston. And on Saturday night, HBO airs his comedy special as part of its "One Night Stand" series.

Tingle tackles issues because "these are the things we're confronted with every single day. ... You can't listen to the radio or pick up the newspaper without hearing about AIDS, the war, the deficit." And, yes, Tingle says, that's his real name. "They used to call me 'Ting," he says, recalling his childhood with a working-class Protestant father from North Carolina and an Italian Catholic mother in Cambridge, Mass.

He doesn't spend much time on the standup comic's staples, the ironies of relationships and families. "There isn't much about me that I really feel like talking about anymore," he says. "I'm a concerned American citizen, I'm a patriot. I want what's best for the country. I think everybody's concerned for the

country. But you can disagree on how to get there." Tingle says he thinks cutting military spending to finance education is patriotic because an uneducated public is the worst thing for a democracy. "It's scary because people are more easily manipulated," he maintains. As his show's title suggests, Tingle says his act is the result of an

educational odyssey. It's a long way from where he started, at the "open-mike nights" at comedy clubs in his hometown Cambridge or performing on the subways and in Harvard Square. Tingle, 35, always liked to run his mouth - and drinking heavily lubricated his jaws. But he says he hasn't touched a drop in about three years, and his career is getting more exposure than ever before. In the early '80s, he kicked around the same circuit as Lenny Clarke and Kevin Meaney, both of whom had CBS sitcoms this season, as well as Steven Wright, Paula Poundstone and Bob Goldthwait.

Back then, Tingle concedes, he went for the easy laugh, telling jokes about such things as nude beaches. "It was very rough," he says of his act, "and I was trying to get beer Once he quit drinking, he read a

lot. "I couldn't sleep!" he protests. His head cleared, he took on more serious issues, "I've been working hard. I think I have a good product to offer," he says.

He's uncomfortable with the term political humorist. He prefers social commentator, a la Will Rogers, whom he greatly admires. He points out that parts of his routine are apolitical, like when he talks about his father working as a cabbie, the absurdity he sees about parking tickets and religion. In that respect, he sees his act as

"a slice of our times ... a piece of America." Still, he's at his best, his most intense, when he waxes about highly politicized social issues, like the proposed seven-day waiting period for handguns.

"I don't want to sound like a Quaker, but is a week a long time to wait to see if the former mental patient should have an Uzi?" he wonders. Pause. "It takes about three

weeks to get a phone!" A Florida court, he notes, deemed the rap group 2 Live Crew obscene and the record industry puts warning labels on possibly objectionable material. Meanwhile, a convicted felon in the same state buys a gun and kills 11 people. "What do they close? The record


