Injections help herniated disc

DEAR DR. GOTT: My 34-year-old son has a herniated disc. Are there alternatives other than surgery, such as lasers and new methods of control?

DEAR READER: Intervertebral discs are doughnutshaped structures that separate the vertebral bones in the back. When a disc degenerates or slips out of place (herniates), part of the disc can irritate or pinch a nerve, leading to pain, tingling and numbness. Herniated discs can be treated with bed rest, special exercises and analgesics; with this therapy, most will slip back into place and

If this conservative therapy is ineffective, however, more aggressive treatment has to be considered. The traditional option is surgery to remove or repair the disc, thereby relieving pressure on the nerve.

In the past few years, chymopapain (meat tenderizer) njections have been shown to help some people with erniated discs. The procedure requires no surgery but is not as permanent as an operation; surgery may still be necessary if the injections fail.

Nonetheless, this is an attractive choice for patients who view surgery as a last resort. Chymopapain injections should be performed only by practitioners, such as orthopedic surgeons, who are experienced in the techni-que. I am not aware of laser or other experimental therapy that is appropriate or superior to conventional treatment. However, I am not a neurosurgeon or an orthopedic surgeon, two of the specialists your son should consult for specific advice.

DEAR READER: Sulfites are chemical compounds that are often sprayed on fresh produce in the market to retard spoilage and maintain freshness. As with any addi-tive, some people are highly allergic to sulfites and will feel unwell (headache, hives, asthma, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, rapid pulse and nervousness) when they eat food treated with sulfites. For this reason, many supermarkets routinely post warnings if they are using sulfite sprays. Sulfites and other contaminants of fresh produce

are easily washed off; therefore, people should routinely

An elderly Colorado woman who received a hip joint has tested positive for the AIDS virus, said Doug Wilson, a spokesman for LifeNet Transplantation Services of Virginia

"It's tragic. It's unfortunate. Certainly we were not negligent. The science was simply not there," Wilson that the elderly woman had tested positive for the AIDS virus, he said.

All 30 hospitals that received the tissues were notified of the AIDS risk by Thursday evening, Wilson said. 





WASHINGTON - The Pentagon should issue a surgeon general-style warning to would-be whistleblowers that would read: Exposing negligence in military medicine can be dangerous to your health.

A tightly circulated report from the Pentagon's own Inspector General's office confirms some of the findings we have been warning of for a year regarding retaliation and improprieties among U.S. Army medical installations in Germany. Several military doctors there argued that they were being treated like second-class citizens who enjoy few rights or legal recourses to protect themselves against abuses. Now investigators are concluding, belatedly, that some of these problems are systemic throughout the Army Medical Corps.

In a move evocative of the KGB, some military officials have forced perfectly sane doctors to undergo psychiatric treatment for simply complaining about their working conditions. Our associate Dean Boyd learned of one Air Force doctor forced to spend nine weeks in a psychiatric ward after raising his voice over what he felt was negligent patient

An Army Surgeon General's Office spokesperson offered the excuse that it was often difficult to notify doctors because they are so mobile.

In other cases, the inspector general found that some Army hospitals "placed adverse information in physician's credentials" in response to minor infractions "unrelated to the practice of medicine." When those doctors go hunting for jobs in the civilian world, these false blemishes become bars to employ-

Ellerbee peddles her book

NEW YORK - Linda Ellerbee is out of town today, on the road, wrapping up a Left Coast swing on her 31/2-week tour of TV chat shows on behalf of her wonderful new book "Move On." Talking about the book on TV is fitting for Ellerbee, who acquired

her reputation as a writer of distinc-tion with such shows as "Weekend" and "Overnight" at NBC and the Emmy Award-winning "Our World" Her first book, "And So It Goes," was about her adventures in the

news dodge. The new one is about the changes in her life, and its tone is more intimate and more

autobiographical.

"A small part of it was that I began to be terribly uncomfortable with people who said, 'Oh, you're such a role model for me. I want to be like you," Ellerbee said. "And I thought, "They're only seeing what I allow them to see on television. There's much more to me than that and some of it's not so pretty." But the overriding reason, she said, was that she was born into in-

"I was a war baby. I was a child during the duck-and-cover days of the Cold War. I came of age with rock 'n' roll.

"Then it was the '60s and I was living in a commune. And in the '70s, I was a working mother and a single parent. In the '80s, I started my own company and was a woman executive. And in the '90s, I'm a recovering alcoholic.
"It seemed to me that a lot of the

stories I wanted to tell, some of which were about me, some of which were about friends and family, were not so much my stories, they were our stories. They were stories of this time and of the people who'd lived through it. In that sense, I thought there was a book to be written on

surviving life in the last half of the Ellerbee said it wasn't that tough to go public with the chapter revealing her treatment for alcoholism. Her friends and acquaintances al-

ready knew it. "The one thing that bothered was the cliche-ness of 'Here's-anothercelebrity-who-dried-out-at-the-Bettyclinic, "she said.

"If we could do that, we could have those kids grow up and be a nation of newspaper readers — and watchers of television," she said. "We're hoping to be part of this PBS effort to try to cover the elec-tion in '92 in a different way. We've been having a lot of meetings together and they seem to think we have something to offer." And, she said, there's another book in the works: a novel. She

"Fiction's very frightening," she said. "There are so many choices. "I'm used to writing from a skeleton. When you're a news reporter, even an editorial writer, the bones are there. In fiction, you have to build your own skeleton." **SATURDAY, MAY 18, 1991**

LOS ANGELES - Ann-Margret, who appears for an interview wear-ing a fluffy platinum wig and a form-fitting green pants suit, looks ike the raucous cocktail waitress she plays in the new ABC movie "Our Sons."

"It's really the story of two women," she says, sitting in a hotel suite overlooking Century City. In another room is her co-star, Julie Andrews, who looks dressed for

The two women in "Our Sons" are opposites. Ann-Margret plays Luanne Barnes, who is unsophisti-cated and has rarely been outside of Arkansas. Miss Andrews plays Audrey Grant, an elegant, worldly businesswoman. The two are drawn into a thorny relationship because their sons are lovers, and Luanne's

son is dying from AIDS. "Our sons are roommates, and my son's AIDS is the catalyst that brings together two women who are polar opposites," Ann-Margret says. "It's about love and reconciliation. It's about what these two women learn from each other about themselves. And, finally, it's about a mother's unconditional love for her

The movie, written by playwright William Hanley, is the fourth collaboration between Ann-Margret and director John Erman, He previously directed her in "Who Will Love My Children?," "A Streetcar Named Desire" and "The Two Mrs. Grenvilles," The roles brought her critical acclaim and three Emmy nominations as best

actress.
"We work 18- and 19-hour days," she says. "You come home exhausted. John's off to Hawaii to rest before starting the editing. Roger and I are going to our house in

Ann-Margret is married to Roger Smith, who starred in "77 Sunset Strip" in the early 1960s. Smith, who quit acting and now produces his wife's stage shows, has myasthenia gravis, a debilitating mus-

cular condition.

Ann-Margret herself suffered a personal tragedy in 1972 when she fell 22 feet from a stage scaffold at a hotel in Lake Tahoe. She suffered a brain concussion and fractured several facial bones, her jaw and her left arm.

Back to her character, Ann-Margret says, "Luanne's had a hard life. She's been married three times, and she kicked her son out when he was 17. Eleven years later she gets a call from Audrey that he's dying. She's hardly ever been out of Arkansas, but she flies to Los Angeles and Audrey drives her to San Diego. Luanne's a cocktail waitress. Audrey runs her own fashion busi-

"They take an immediate dislike to each other during that drive. Luanne smokes, she does her nails, which drives Audrey crazy. They fight through most of the movie, but near the end Audrey tells her son, 'Luanne is smarter than I am, but she doesn't know it."

Audrey's milieu is the country club; Luanne's a saloon. Audrey is sophisticated and fashionable; Luanne is naive and wears things she can toss into the washing machine. Audrey accepts that her son is gay; Luanne cut her son off. Yet, over the course of the two-hour movie, which will be televised Sunday, the two women come to see they have much in common.






