Weicker to offer updated, balanced budget

HARTFORD (AP) — Independent Gov. Lowell P. Weicker Jr. is considering coming out with a second budget proposal as an updated, balanced version of the income tax-based budget he offered in February.

Since Weicker proposed his budget four months ago, soaring Medicaid costs and weak tax receipts blamed on the deepening recession have tipped it out of balance by an estimated \$250 million to \$300 million.

Bush remains silent on health care issue

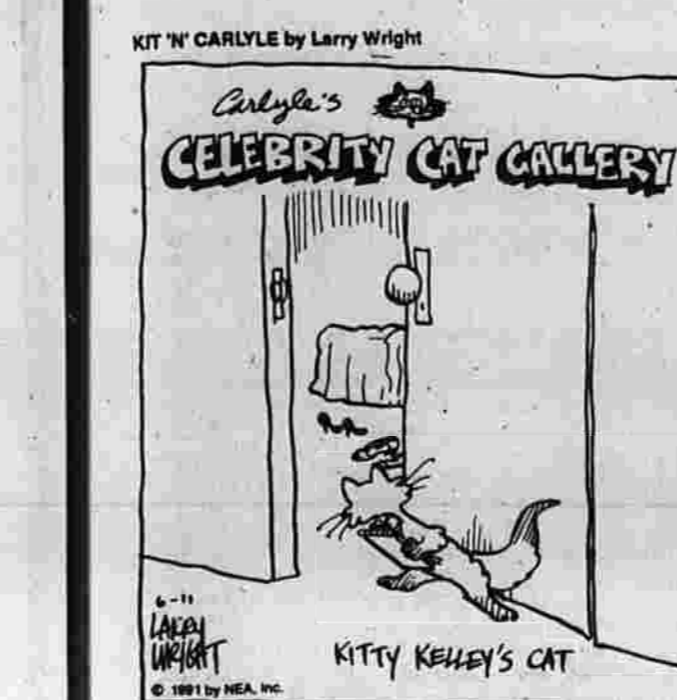
