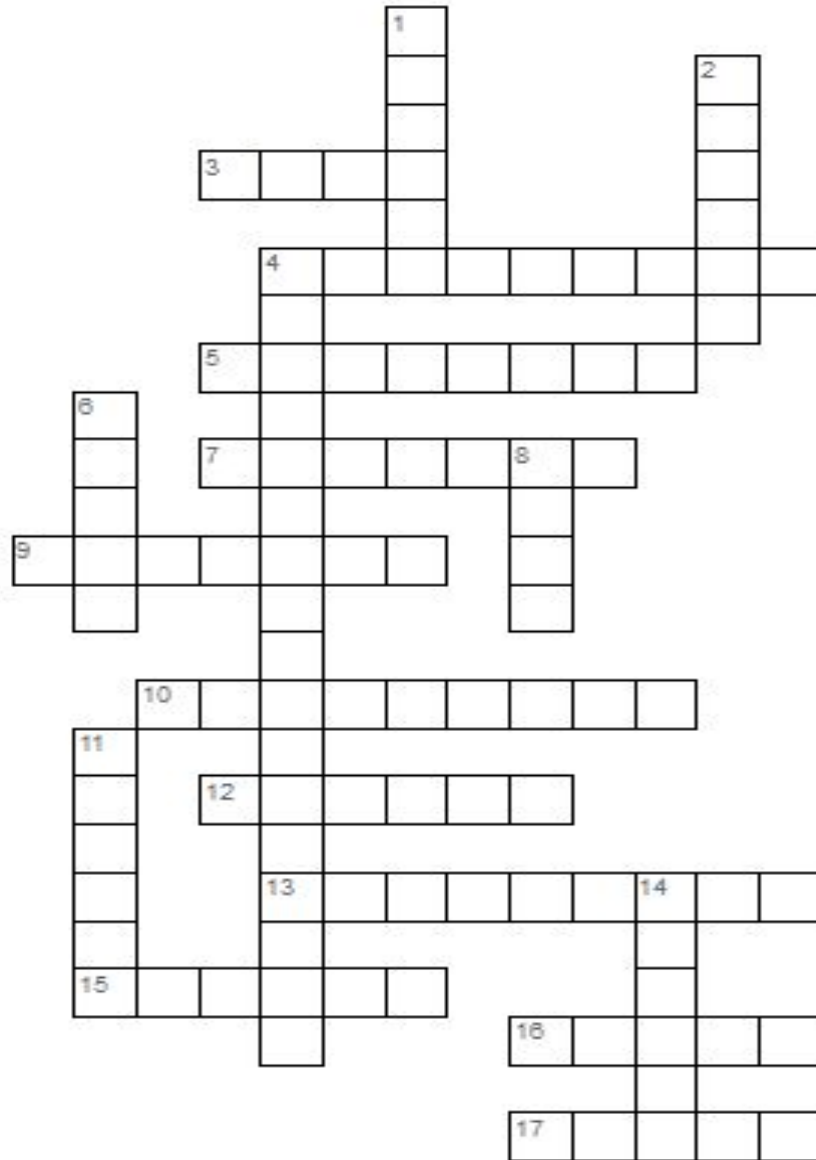


**OOPS! Error in 4-down.** The crossword editor typed three E's instead of two E's in the first word. Apologies!

- 3 Small locomotive used on the Cheney railroad; also used to move rolling stock in the railroad yards: Yard \_\_\_\_
- 4 \_\_\_\_ section of town, laid out by E.J. Holl, 1874-1967, real estate developer, who was born in England and used British names for some streets in his developments, such as Oxford, Cambridge in this area, near Middle Tpk./Main Street.
- 5 On November 22, 1919, the cornerstone was laid for Manchester Memorial \_\_\_\_, honoring WWI veterans. The building, on Haynes Street, was dedicated on Armistice Day, 1920.
- 7 Former school on Hollister Street, renamed in 1961 to honor educator Thomas \_\_\_\_.

- 10 Award-winning dairy bar founded by John and Bernice in 1948, still in operation today (2 words)
- 12 This Hilliard Street business manufactured cloth toys, including stuffed animals. (2 words; hyphenated.)
- 13 \_\_\_\_\_ section of town, laid out by E.J. Holl, 1874-1967, real estate developer, who was born in England and used British names for some streets in his developments, such as Scarborough, Wellington.
- 15 Lorenzo T. \_\_\_\_\_ and partner operated a paper mill in the Lydallville area of Manchester. The mill pond is still there, along with a town swimming pool.
- 16 A sculpture of dancing \_\_\_\_\_ adorns a fountain in historic Center Memorial Park.
- 17 Malcolm Mollan won \$25 in a 1935 contest with his entry in a contest to choose a motto for Manchester: "A City of Village \_\_\_\_\_."

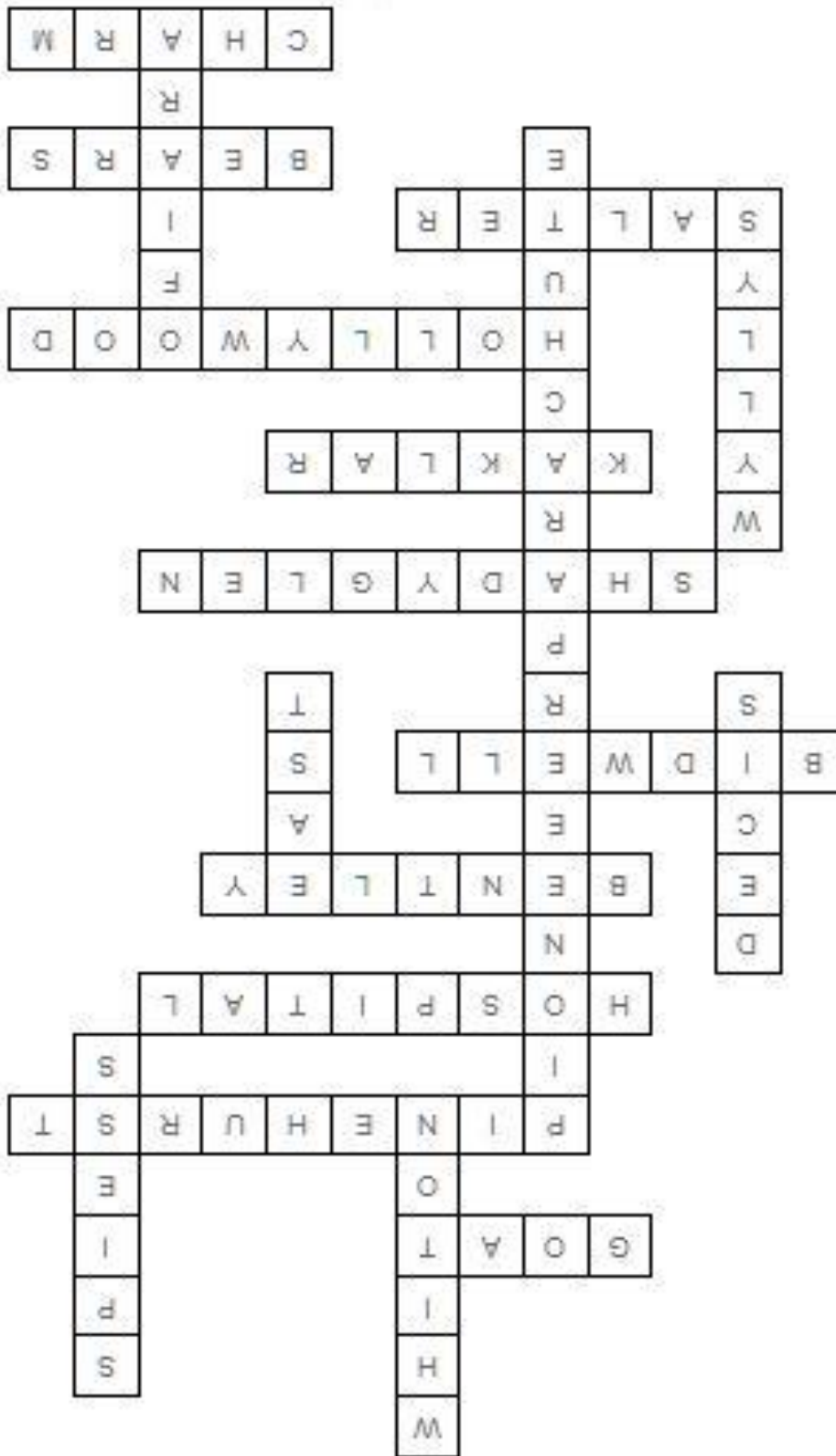

- 6 Fast-food drive-in on Center Street, popular during the 1950s & 1960s.
- 8 51-acre \_\_\_\_\_ Cemetery, off Porter Street, is the second-oldest in town, its first acre deeded in 1751, before Manchester was incorporated as a separate town.
- 11 Former copper mine, located on a steep slope in the Highland Park section of town. There's also a street by this name that runs north and south between Highland and Porter Streets, along the side of the Highland Park Market.
- 14 Manchester Herald photographer and later MCC photography teacher, Sylvian "Sinch" \_\_\_\_\_, 1926-2012. A gallery of his photos is in the "Special Features" section of our website, and his photos are featured on our Facebook page.
