Hartford Cemeteries and dates established.

Those listed as 1,5, 6,8 & 12 are Hartford City owned cemeteries

- 1)- Ancient Burying Ground AKA Center (Church) Burying Ground, Established 1640
 First burying ground used in Hartford was eradicated in 1712, as it had gone abandoned
 after the Colony council secured land from Mr. Olmstead, now between Main & Gold St. in Hartford.
- 2)- Second Burying Ground of Hartford Center Burying Ground, was established. 1709/10 located now on Main St. of East_Hartford. The land was owned and secured by same colony council in Hartford for those residents living East of the Great River, which at that time was almost 2/3's of the population.
- 3)- West Hartford's Center Cemetery Established 1719 on Main St. in West Hartford
- 4)- Next was what is now **West Cemetery in Manchester_**(earlier part of Hartford, Orford Parish then East Hartford) was established in **1740**... The land was given by resident owner Mr. Olcott location is now Spencer St. in Manchester
- 5)- Old South Burying Ground, Hartford, Established 1800 for the city making it the 2nd oldest burying ground Within the present day boundaries of Hartford. Given to the city by the First Mayor Thomas Seymour (previous burials 1700's for Benton Family) on Maple St. in Hartford (adjacent to Fox Middle School AKA old Bulkley School)
- 6) Old North Cemetery, Hartford, Established 1807 first burial 1809 Land given to the city by resident owner Mr. Bushnell on North Main St. in Hartford which includes Holy Trinity; the first Catholic Burying Ground 1839 (Holy Trinity is managed by Mt. St. Benedict's)
- 7) St. Patrick's Cemetery Established (behind Old North Cemetery) Hartford (managed by Mt. St. Benedict's) 1848(?)
- 8) Zion Hill Cemetery Established 1843 Behind Trinity College Harford
- 9) **Spring Grove Cemetery**, Established **1840** on North Main St., Hartford
- 10) Cedar Hill Cemetery Established 1864 On Fairfield Ave. Hartford – Privately run
- 11) Mt. St. Benedict's Cemetery Established 1874 Blue Hills Ave. Bloomfield – Hartford line.
- 12) Northwoods Cemetery Established 1925 North Main St. on Windsor town line.
