## Nazis Try to Get Relief to Forces Held in Budapest

### Mobile Warfare Rages Between Hungarian Capital and Vienna; Russians Have Given Ground in Past Two Days to Nazi Drive.

Moscow, Jan. 4.—(AP)—Mobile warfare raged between Budapest and Vienna today as a huge German tank and infantry force, mounting the first German counter-offensive on the eastern front since October, sought to break through Russian lines to the relief of the surrounded garrison in the Hungarian capital.

### Getting Situation in Hand

In the last two days the Russians had given ground and it was probable that more would have to be yielded, although the Russians appeared to be getting the situation in hand.

The German counter-assault was sprung from the area of Pestom, a Danube river town 45 miles northwest of Budapest.

The German-Hungarian garrison in Budapest, where the Russians have overrun 1,082 city blocks, was reported making savage attacks in an effort to break out toward the relieving force.

Nearly a third of the eastern section of the capital was in Soviet hands, an additional 200 blocks having been captured in the last 24 hours.

The exact time the Germans launched their counter-attack in the Komarom area has not been disclosed, but from available reports it appears to have been Tuesday morning in the snowy dawn.

### Artillery Line Forced Back

A heavy German thrust was thrown at Russian artillery positions. A Russian dispatch said the artillery line had been forced back by German tanks southeast of the city but it did not state the extent of the withdrawal. The official account said merely that the Russians had given up several populated points along the southern bank of the Danube.

The most recent official accounts of the advance on Komarom had placed Russian elements 10 1/2 miles east of the city.

The German Air Force has been giving increasing support to the attacking armor and infantry.

The Russian communiqué said the attack was launched by "large forces of infantry and tanks." It added:

"At the cost of heavy losses in men and material, the enemy was able to capture several populated places on the southern bank of the Danube."

### Russians Capture Sacher

The bulletins said that Rodion Y. Malinovsky's troops, driving on Losonc (Lucence), in southern Slovakia northwest of Budapest, had captured Sacher, half a mile from Losonc's limits. Ten other places to the east and south also fell to the Russians.

Large scale air battles are being fought over Budapest. By night the sky for miles around the capital is alight with the fire of

## Jury Ponders Chaplin Case

### Foreman Sees 'Possibility' of Reaching Verdict Sometime Today.

Los Angeles, Jan. 4.—(AP)—The Charlie Chaplin paternity trial jurors go into their second day of deliberations today with what their foreman described to the judge as "a possibility" of reaching a verdict.

The seven women and five men were solemn-faced as they filed back into the courtroom late yesterday to be excused over night. For four hours and 40 minutes they had weighed the contention of Joan Barry, 24, that the world-famed comedian's former drama instructor, her former drama instructor, is the father of her 15-month-old baby Carol Ann.

### Such Evidence Not Binding

Three physicians testified that blood tests showed that the 55-year-old actor-producer could not be the father. Superior Judge Henry M. Willis instructed the jury that such evidence is not binding in California but that it should be given the weight to which the jurors deem it entitled.

None of the principals was in court. Joan was with her mother and baby at their home in West Los Angeles. Chaplin was confined to his Beverly Hills home by the severe ankle gash he suffered last Saturday night when, locked out of his house without his keys, he kicked in a glass door panel to gain entrance.

### Heard Testimony Re-Read

The jurors returned to court in mid-afternoon for a re-reading of part of Joan's testimony.

## 1944 Output Of Aircraft Hits 96,369

### Production Represents Increase of 11,423 in Number; Weight Total Boosted 50 Per Cent.

Washington, Jan. 4.—(AP)—American factories delivered 96,369 planes of all types in 1944, bringing production since July 1, 1940 to an Axis-staggering total of 253,256.

The 1944 output represented an increase of 11,423 planes but by using weight as the yardstick the increase exceeded 50 per cent. Weight now is regarded as a more accurate gauge, since it reflects the increasing size, and consequently greater hitting power, of aircraft now coming off the assembly lines.

The trend toward greater weight will continue in 1945, with increasing numbers of B-29 Super-Fortresses and other giants on the year's schedule.

### 78,327 Planes 1945 Goal

Present planning calls for 78,327 planes in 1945, but Chairman J. J. Krug of the War Production Board said today the indications are that this will be jumped up.

December deliveries totaled 6,697 planes, a slight decrease from November's 6,747, but there was no decline on a weight basis and Krug called the performance good.

## Storm Signals Follow Action Upon Probers

### Huge Question Mark Arises Over Ability To Command Constant Majority in House.

Washington, Jan. 4.—(AP)—Storm signals were hoisted today over the newly-launched 79th Congress.

A huge question mark arose over the ability of the administration to command a constant majority in the House, as a Republican-Democratic coalition overrode Democratic leaders on the opening day of the Congress to put the old, so-called Dies committee on a permanent basis.

Democratic Leader McCormack of Massachusetts, arguing against a disregard for precedent, told the House that never before in history "has Congress created a permanent investigatory committee."

The new committee to inquire into un-American activities will be the only permanent body of Congress with continuing power of subpoena.

### 207-186 Victory

In a thumping, noisy opening for the new Congress, the House Republican-Democratic combine sailed to a 207 to 186 victory—a surprising development in view of the large Democratic gains of

## Midwest Again Chilled Today

### Subzero Weather Moving Across Nation in Sort of Daily Cycle.

Subzero weather moving across the nation in a sort of daily cycle chilled the Midwest again today.

The mercury dropped as low as 25 below zero at Lone Rock, Wis., and was below zero in the eastern Dakotas, Minnesota, Iowa, Wisconsin, upper Michigan and northern Illinois.

Minima ranged upward to the 20s and 30s in the Ohio valley, Oklahoma and Arkansas and to the 50s in southern Florida and the lower Texas coast.

Representative lows included -20 at Bemidji, Minn., -19 at Park Falls, Wis., and -14 at Moline and Joliet, Ill.

The Midwest had bitter weather Tuesday. Yesterday it had moved to the east, with 40 to 15 below along the North Atlantic seaboard. Today it was the Midwest again, while the east was warming up.

## Carrier Planes and Super-Forts Raid Formosa, Okinawa Islands

## Two New Landings Made on Mindoro

## Coordinated Air Attacks Smash Southern Japan, Ryukus, Formosa Along 2,000-Mile Arc.

General MacArthur's Headquarters, Philippines, Jan. 4.—(AP)—Coordinated air blows smashed southern Japan, the Ryukus and Formosa along a solid 2,000-mile arc down through Luzon, prized island of the Philippines, as Gen. Douglas MacArthur disclosed today his troops have made two new landings on Mindoro, his closest approach to Manila.

### Battering Ram Assault

Heavy bombers and fighters opened a battering ram assault Wednesday (Philippines date) on Formosa, which funnels Japanese men and planes to the Philippines.

Japanese broadcasts said that 600 U. S. carrier aircraft and Okinawa islands, Wednesday and Thursday. Five hundred planes struck yesterday for nearly seven hours and 400 returned to the attack today.

Japanese reports, intercepted today, said that the attack was coordinated with the Super-Fortresses.

The Saipan-based B-29s kindled large fires and attained good results, the War Department announced, when they ripped into Nagoya yesterday for the fourth time.

One Super-Portress was lost to enemy action in the target area. The planes of the 21st Bomber command bagged one enemy interceptor, probably brought down nine more and damaged others.

A dispatch from Associated Press War Correspondent Vern Haugland at Guam said the aerial task force was of sizeable strength, indicating that up to 100 planes participated.

Tokyo said 90 B-29s made the raid.

### Fighter Opposition Moderate

The War department announcement said fighter opposition was moderate. Anti-aircraft fire was described as "meager and inaccurate."

On their last thundering strike against Nagoya on Dec. 22 the monster bombers encountered heavy anti-aircraft fire and a horde of defending fighter planes. Aircraft factories and other war installations were hit on this raid. The targets of yesterday's assault were not announced.

Nagoya, 165 miles west of Tokyo, is a major industrial city which was heavily raided by the Super-Forts Wednesday.

### Reports Sumatra Attack

The news agency brought Sumatra into the raid picture with a dispatch saying "about 40 enemy bombers and fighters" attacked the Medan area on the island's northern coast this morning. It did not identify the nationality of the planes.

Domei said "about 40 B-29s" participated in the raid.

## Nazis' Armies Seen Battling Many Months

### Equipped with Series of New Weapons; Germans Believe They Can Still Defeat Allies.

Bern, Jan. 4.—(AP)—Information from inside Germany, discounting Nazi propaganda, indicates that German armies equipped with a series of new weapons must be reckoned a fighting force capable of continued effective resistance—perhaps for many months.

Moreover, the Nazis apparently believe they can still win the war by taking advantage of Allied mistakes and difficulties.

Reports dealing with the German military situation and use of secret weapons coming from a half-dozen independent sources in the Reich stress these factors:

### Fluke Might End War

While a fluke might end the war tomorrow, or a new Allied offensive might quickly smash Nazi forces, it appears (1) that the Germans have sufficient gasoline to carry out their present battle plan; (2) new secret weapons are being turned out steadily in underground factories; and (3) troop reinforcements are still available in large quantity.

It is difficult to determine the degree these informants have unconsciously absorbed Nazi propaganda, but they seem in a position to be well informed and have proved reliable in the past.

### Gasoline Stores Believed Great

Observers in Berlin are convinced the Nazis had far greater underground stores of gasoline than the Allies believed. Synthetic gasoline is still being manufactured, and the Germans need far less fuel for their operations than in the days when the Luftwaffe went out steadily.

One German said of the Luftwaffe, "We now go into action only after scouting and intelligence reports indicate it will be worthwhile."

These informants believe firmly that "V-weapons" being turned out in underground factories in Czechoslovakia as well as in the Reich, will be used to great effect. They say a new airplane, ready for use, is shot from the ground like a rocket.

### Permits Silent Swoop

Carrying a crew, it switches to gasoline until approaching the target. Then the plane can use compressed air to permit a silent swoop. After leaving the target and launching its one torpedo, it can switch back to gasoline and land normally. The plane is said to mount two cannons and has a

### Village Taken By Canadians

### Inflict Heavy Casualties on Picked Nazis in Seizing Conventello.

Rome, Jan. 4.—(AP)—Canadian troops have captured the village of Conventello, two miles east of Alfonsine on the Ravenna-Ferrara highway after inflicting heavy casualties on picked German forces. Allied headquarters announced today.

Approximately 100 prisoners were taken in the advance, a communiqué said.

Meanwhile patrolling by both sides was intensified all the way across the front, particularly in the area of Highway 65 due south of Bologna.

### Artillery Breaks Up Raids

American artillery broke up four sharp enemy raids in the area of San Ansano, just west of Highway Nine, four miles below Bologna. At the same time the Germans continued their recently adopted tactics of trying to ambush American patrols feeling out enemy positions.

Paris, Jan. 4.—(AP)—Protests against censorship delays in news about the new First Army offensive have come from correspondents both at supreme headquarters and in the field with the First Army.

The SHAEF correspondents complained that the British Broadcasting Corp. sent out news of the offensive when it was still restricted at headquarters. SHAEF officers subsequently lifted the lid.

### Protest Scoop on News

Frontline reporters protested that SHAEF scooped them by hours on the news.

A dispatch filed from the front by AP Correspondent William F. Boni at 6 p. m. yesterday was not released for transmission until about 12 hours after SHAEF had released virtually the same news. After giving a few details Boni said:

## 13th Straight Daylight Raid Pounds Reich

### Germans Report Allied Bombers Approaching From South; No Warning on West Attack.

London, Jan. 4.—(AP)—German reports of Allied bombers approaching from the south, apparently U. S. 15th Air Force Flying Fortresses and Liberators from Italy, heralded the 13th straight daylight attack on the Reich today.

Until noon there was no warning of bomber formations invading Germany from the west—a sign that the weather might be halting the record winter string of 12 consecutive days of raids by U. S. Eighth Air Force from Britain.

Snow, rain and leaden skies prevented operations yesterday by aircraft based in France, Belgium and Holland. Bombers flying from Britain had to drop their explosives through a heavy overcast.

In the past 12 days the Eighth Air Force flew 18,000 sorties and unloaded 26,000 tons of bombs on German objectives, principally forward positions near the western front, a U. S. Army announcement said. This assault was complemented by the R.A.F. with both day and night attacks.

Army casualties totaled 536,352 through Dec. 31, an increase of 8,329, and the Navy's total was 81,787, a rise of 1,169.

The officials said they were unable to determine immediately what effect the action would have on operation of the yard where more than 25,000 are employed on construction of warships.

### Working on Aid for Italy

Washington, Jan. 4.—(AP)—Secretary Stettinius declared today that the United States and Britain are "in basic agreement" on aiding Italy, but are still working on how to go about it.

### Grocers' Strike Averted

Key West, Fla., Jan. 4.—(AP)—The threatened strike by 55 Key West west and grocery dealers against OPA ceilings was averted today when the OPA promised price adjustments would be made where found justified. Store operators who control 95 of the 100 grocery stores discontinued all sales yesterday except for a few dry grocery items.

War Bonds in Action
The Unit costume of men of wealth and authority, consist of knee breeches made of broadcloth, velvet or silk; a vest of colored silk—usually green or scarlet; and a coat of broadcloth. The vest was long in front and tight fitting. The coat reached nearly to the knees and was usually decorated with large pockets. Below the waist it flared out. It was usually dark-blue or black, but other colors—such as scarlet, brown and green—were also worn. Gentlemen's clothes had buttons of silver or brass; men of lower rank had wooden buttons. Shirts were of white linen, with flurries over the white and at the wrists. The well-dressed Virginia New England and Virginia were far apart. The Puritans were stern, nervous, industrious and so reluctant to waste time that they labored even when there was nothing to do.
