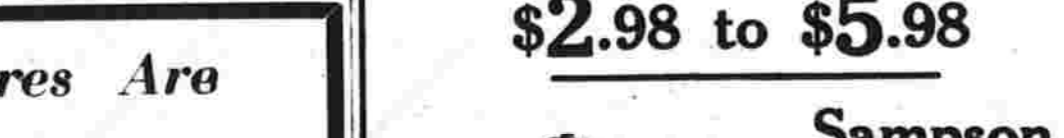

Soviets Advance Within 25 Miles Of Berlin Limits

Outflank Kuestrin and Reach Seelow on West Side of Oder; Terrific Fighting Reported In Area by Nazis; Two Breaches Made.

London, March 8.—(AP)—The Russians have driven to within 25 miles of Berlin's city limits, outflanking the fortress of Kuestrin and reaching Seelow on the west side of the Oder, a Transocean broadcast from the German capital said today.

Seelow is directly across the Oder from Kuestrin, and is on the main railway striking the Oder which connects Stettin and Frankfurt.

Timed With Drive to Rhine Marshal Gregory Zhukov's massive new offensive, timed with Allied drive to the Rhine and the west, also has been reported. It is on the main railway striking the Oder which connects Stettin and Frankfurt.

Transocean said Seelow was reached on the Russian bridgehead at Goerzitz, between Kuestrin and Frankfurt, and that the fighting was taking place in the area, with many places changing hands repeatedly.

Heavy attacks are taking place at Niederzosen, four miles southeast of Zedden in a loop of the Oder river, Col. Ernst von Hammer Berlin broadcast, and the Russians have made two breaches in the Oder river in the Kuestrin to the south-east.

Terrific Artillery Barrage Fighting was reported along a 12-mile front from Stettin to Cossen following a terrific artillery barrage that began at dawn and continued for several hours.
