A Handsome Victory

Manchester has provided no better home front news in the whole course of the Red Cross drive just closed. The quota of \$41,600 was high, well beyond anything Manchester has previously attempted.

We hate to think what we might be writing today if Manchester had failed, even by a little. Probably we would be saying poor things about the relatively good showing made. But we would know, and so would all Manchester, that any degree of home front failure in the moment of high tide victory on the battlefront would have been unforgivable.

McNutt Would Renegé

While the Japs were in uncontestable possession of the Philippines, and doing their crude best with the aid of such puppets as they could find, to win the cooperation and loyalty of the people there, our Congress made haste to confirm July 4th, 1946, as the date for the complete independence of the Philippines, and even granted the President special authority to advance that date if circumstances should permit it.

Other commentators have been quick to note that contrast between the brand-minded legality with which members of this Legislature are speeding along the proposal to increase their own pay and the obstructionism with which they are handling various proposals in which the people of the good state of Connecticut are interested—court reform, for instance.

When it is said that our good legislators are out to "double" their own pay, it seems a very handsome thing they have in mind for themselves. Justly, doubling \$300 does not give a very great amount, and it is to our mind, the intermediate nature of that amount which is just the trouble.

We would either continue paying our legislators the present amount, or we would pay them a great deal more. We would do one or the other, but we would regard anything intermediate as unfortunate.

At present, speaking very generally, the majority of the members of the Connecticut Legislature has to be made up of men and women who can afford to serve. It is perfectly true, of course, that there are a number of them, who make it pay financially through jobs they can get to themselves or their associates.

But it is equally true that many legislators—a saving percentage of legislators—serve only at financial loss to themselves, or because of their way of living or source of private income is such as not to be interpreted by their legislative duties.

The reason these individuals are willing to serve, then, has to be their idea of the honor and distinction to be gained. And the reason they get into the Legislature is precisely because the state of Connecticut has never made service in the Legislature financially profitable.

We get good men and women because we don't pay them enough to make lesser talents envious of their jobs.

Strangely enough, and also soundly enough, the argument increased pay is that it would attract better men than women who cannot now afford service in the Legislature. That is the obvious truth in the situation. Economic status is no reliable indication of either intelligence or honesty.

Theoretically, perhaps, we should pay our legislators enough so that no one would ever have to refuse to serve for economic reasons.
