Beach Future Seen in Peril

New London Park Facing Danger of Being "Second Coney Island"

Heartford, April 5.—(P)—Ocean Beach park, the \$2,500,000 resort built by New London on the ruins of the 1938 hurricane is in danger of becoming "a second Coney Island" unless the state comes to the rescue, Senator Richard F. Corkey (D) declared at a public hearing before the Committee on State Parks and Reservations yesterday.

Corkey's apprehensions were not shared by a group of citizens of New London which district the park represents. They challenged his contention that the park was a financial liability. They argued also that the state of Connecticut is not the only one to have a park because workers could not afford to pay admission and parking fees charged at the park.

The proposed commission would comprise the mayor of New London, the chairman of the State Park and Forest commission, the chairman of the Ocean Beach Park board and four members appointed by the governor. It would report its recommendations to the 1947 General Assembly.

Corkey urged the creation of such a commission, told the committee that last year it cost taxpayers of New London \$70,000 to operate the park and that interest and amortization payments on the \$2,500,000 bond issue floated to finance the resort would inevitably force the complete commercialization of the enterprise and turn a healthful recreational project as originally designed by the public into a profit-making business.

Dr. Katharine Bunt, former president of Connecticut College for Women and director of the park, both members of the Ocean Beach Park board, contended that the resort would ultimately be self-supporting. Dr. Bunt asserted that the park had not been operated long enough to show its full financial possibilities. The park, opened in 1940, has multiplied its profits 12-fold in that time, in spite of wartime restrictions, by assessing, O. G. Andrews, publisher of
