Poultry Gives Price Problem

Ration Board Stresses Need of Cooperation of the Buying Public.

The chairman of the Manchester War Price and Rationing Board stressed again this week "the need of public cooperation to stamp out the black market in poultry" which he described as "one of the toughest problems now facing the community."

A week ago, the Chairman revealed that a large proportion of all poultry but, particularly live poultry is selling over the ceiling, in some quarters as high as 700 per cent above the legal price.

The best means of discouraging a "black" or "leave it" attitude apparently prevalent among certain poultry dealers, the chairman said, is to ask for a receipt if you do take it, which must be given on the request of a buyer, according to OPA regulations. "If a dealer who has overcharged you refuses to give you a receipt," he added, "your next step is to pay a visit to your War Price and Rationing Board."

Cabbage Pest Control Told

Gardeners Are Reminded Maggots and Cutworms Are at Work.

Storms, April 18-It is time to unlimber the weapons of garden warfare, A. E. Wilkinson, vegetable specialist of the Agricultural Extension Service, University of Connecticut, reminds the home vegetable grower. The cabbage maggot may put in an appearance at any time, and the cutworm is already here. The average date on which the small fly lay the eggs from which the cabbage maggot hatches is May 1 to 3 in Connecticut, but the early warm weather of a spring may advance that date. Prof. Wilkinson warns. Hence any identification of the pest should be made around the base of the plants already in the ground, or the roots of the plants are dipped in the dust when they are set out.
