The War Department casualty list, Serial Number O-241 (missing), Pacific 7, O-242 (killed), Pacific, 351, O-243 (missing), Europe, 128, O-244 (killed), Europe, 190, O-245 (killed), Pacific, 891, O-247 (wounded), Europe, 3,232, and announcements for the United States as a whole 4,681 casualties for May 7, 1945, classified as follows: 222 killed, 4,123 wounded, and 145 missing.
