War Casualties

List of Connecticut Men, Dead, Wounded or Missing, As Released by War and Navy Departments Today. These Reports Are Based On Prior Notification To Next of Kin and Casualties Noted Here May Previously Have Been Reported in the News Columns.

Army Casualties and Liberated War Prisoners for May 11, 1948. The War Department casualty list, Serial Numbers G-269 (missing, Pacific), G-270 (killed, Europe, 193), G-271 (missing, Europe, 58), G-272 (killed, Pacific, 41), G-273 (wounded, Pacific, 202), and G-274 (wounded, Europe, 2,001), announces for the United States as a whole 2,801 casualties for May 11, 1948, classified as follows: 234 killed, 2,563 wounded, and 64 missing.

The War Department also announces, on Serial No. G-275, for the United States as a whole 20 Army personnel liberated from German prison camps.

Total Naval Casualties To May 11, 1948. The Navy Department announces for the United States as a whole 660 casualties for May 11, 1948, of the U. S. Naval Forces (Navy, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard) not heretofore released on Navy Department total casualty lists, consisting of 83 dead, 280 wounded, and 13 missing. These casualties bring the total reported to next of kin and released for publication since December 7, 1941, to May 11, 1948, to 106,734, classified as follows:

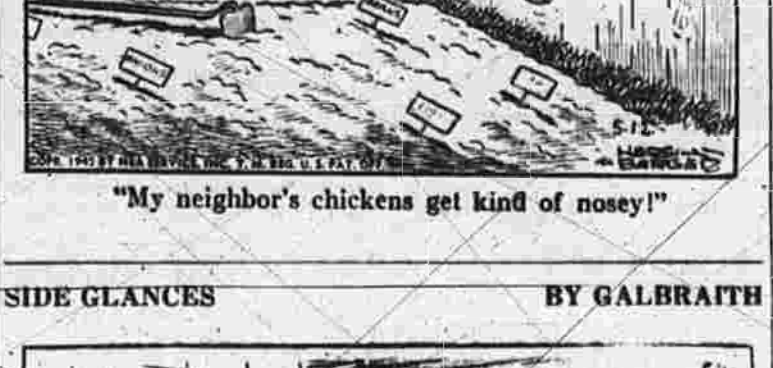

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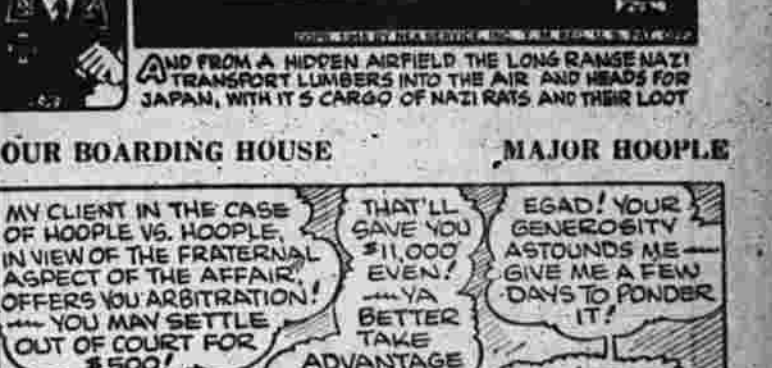
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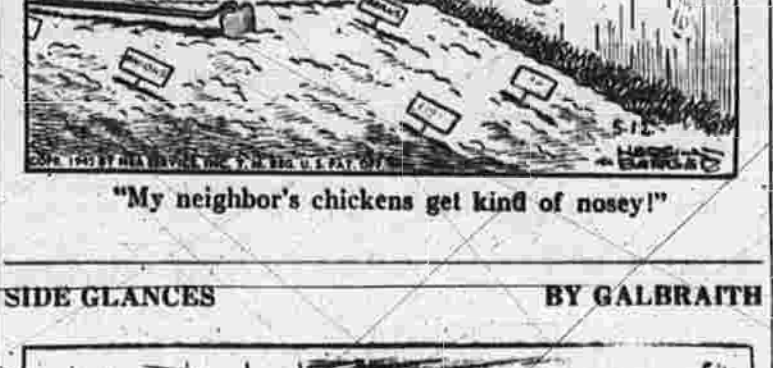
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
