Peterson Guilty; To Die on Aug. 17

Found Responsible for Murder of Jeweler on Feb. 23 by Three Superior Court Judges; Execution Date Set; Takes Sentence Calmly

Royal S. Peterson, 21 years old laundry worker, today was sentenced to die in the electric chair at the State Prison in Wethersfield on August 17. He was found guilty on two counts of the first degree murder of Matthew Wior, local jeweler of 977 Main street, on the night of February 23, 1945.

Three court judges, James Murray presiding and Judge Robert L. Munger and Frank E. McEvoy, sitting, deliberated slightly more than an hour before returning their verdict.

Peterson rose to receive the death sentence with no outward sign of emotion.

Residence Witness Stated maintaining that he did not intend to kill Matthew Wior, Royal Peterson, on trial for first degree murder on two counts in Hartford Superior Court today in the resumption of the story of his life and death in the murder of Matthew Wior, jeweler, Alcorn over a certain biblical quotation.

Did you ever read "Thou Shalt Not Kill?" asked Alcorn. Peterson immediately countered with "Did you ever read 'Thou Shalt Honor Thy Father and Mother?'" Peterson all along maintained that it was his need for money that he might give to his father that was the cause of much of his worries, as noted in entries in the diary which was admitted into the court record Thursday after violent objection by the defense.

Calvin in Telling Story Peterson continued his story in a calm, yet jerky manner today as he told the jury that he was never as strong as when he began his story yesterday. As he spoke about the advice given him by Lewis Alfred of Middle Turnpike East, when the latter had visited him in the county jail on March 8, he bowed his head and stroked his temples noticeably affected by the news. He went on to say that he had never been made that perhaps his experiences might be of help to others.

Meant To Scare Jeweler Referring to his intentions when he entered the store on the fatal night of February 23, Peterson said "My intention was to scare Wior, to get what I could, I wanted to scare him."

While in the store, Peterson leaned over the counter, the latter testified, and the handle of the pistol clicking on the glass top. "What do you plan to do with that?" Peterson said Wior asked. Peterson said he had considered sending the gun back to the store, but he would take merchandise instead. He described Wior as extremely nervous and paced up and down behind the counter, trying several times to reach into a drawer as he shifted by it.

As he passed by the gun from his hand to the right, Wior became more excited, the gun went flying through the air, hitting the wall or ceiling. Then Wior ran out of the store in panic and Peterson admitted firing twice.

Peterson Takes Stand Royal S. Conference Give Aid Take

Any one who expected the United States to go into San Francisco with a perfect and unblemished record of principles and come out with a perfect victory for every one of those principles would be over-estimating both the value of the country and the practical necessity of continual compromise in a conference comprising so many different points of view. Nonetheless, the success of the United States policy at the conference, and much of the life of the result will depend upon how skilful we are in avoiding those strategies and entanglements which may lead us into any direct negotiation of what should be our own principles.

World Wage Standards

After this war, American industry and American labor will again be faced with the problem of competition with "foreign" workers. The cost of living standards are incomparably lower than our own. The old-fashioned answer to this problem would have been to raise wages to meet the cost of living. This, for all its artificial protection of certain American industries, really had the merit of increasing and intensifying the conditions which made it seem necessary. In other words, when we imposed a tariff against products produced by cheap labor abroad, we tended to drive the wages and living conditions of that foreign labor down still farther, as foreign industry sought to get lower costs of production, still to get into the American market below our own production costs. Our tariff, in other words, tended to intensify the very conditions they were directed against. And meanwhile, the home front, their standards were far from perfect. Those American industries which had most tariff protection were not doing so well as the wage level of the rest of the world.
