**Courts Posts Still Problem**  
See 'Better Than Even' Choice' Baldwin Will Name 'Minor' Judges.  
Hartford, June 4.—(AP) With but three legislative days remaining before Connecticut's 1945 General Assembly must adjourn at midnight Wednesday, the reserves today seemed to believe there was "better than an even chance" that the shore of naming judges to 60 minor courts would become an item of the day.

**Some professed to privately believe that the refusal of House Republicans to approve a minor court judge formula agreed on more than two weeks ago by legislative leaders of both parties had been such a situation.**

**They recalled that Republicans earlier had demanded "all the minor court patronage" and that some Democrats had recently charged that failure of the House majority to approve the formula had been due to its being unfavorable to party leaders outside the Legislature.**

**See Retaliation for Stand**  
They saw retaliation for this supposed stand by Republican House members in the statement last night by Senate Majority Leader Leon Ruskopf of Hartford. "Many startling changes" have been made by a Senate subcommittee in the record \$10,000,000 budget approved last Wednesday in the House.

**Ruskopf would not indicate how much had been lopped from the budget, but some of the "startling changes" were believed to include the elimination of House approval of appointments to the State Development Commission, the War Council and the Post-War Planning Board.**

**Democrats are pledged to the creation of a state commerce department which would absorb the functions of these three agencies. "The revisions we have made already," Ruskopf said, "are so numerous that it means retyping the whole bill. We are trying to get it ready for the Senate as soon as possible. It may not be ready until Tuesday."**

**Says Each Item Studied**  
The revisions, he said, had been made by his subcommittee over the week-end. He said that each item had been studied and compared with corresponding items in previous budgets.

**Ruskopf described the methods by which Connecticut state budgets are prepared and delivered to the Assembly as "very poor," and said the bills themselves were "incomprehensible documents."**

**He recommended a seven-day course in state finance for all future legislators.**

### FEPC Facing Death As No Funds Likely

Request Ignored as Permanent Agency Measure Now Pending in Congress Committee.

By James Marlow  
Washington, June 4.—(AP)—The Fair Employment Practices committee is fighting for its life. It is a dead duck unless Congress dumps some money into it by June 30.

This comes at a time when Negroes—aided off by the thousands in outcreek war plants—will find job-getting a lot tougher. Then during the war against Germany, the FEPC was created by executive order of President Roosevelt in 1941. It was designed to prevent war plants in hiring workers from discriminating against anyone because of "race, creed, color or racial origin."

8,000 Complaints Received  
Since July 1, 1943, the FEPC has received more than 8,000 complaints of discrimination and has disposed of all but 2,500. About 85 per cent of the cases involved complaints of discrimination against Negroes. About 5 per cent charged discriminations against Jews.

In the south the FEPC was hated. Southern congressmen have talked against it. Now Congress—or at least the House—seems to have found a way to kill it off.

Each year since its creation the FEPC had to be kept alive by appropriations from Congress. Last year it got \$500,000. This year, rather, for the fiscal year starting July 1—it wanted \$500,000.

No Money for FEPC  
Unless it gets an appropriation by June 30, it automatically goes out of existence. The House Appropriations committee has found money for other government agencies, but not for FEPC.

The committee favored it on the grounds that legislation to create a permanent FEPC is pending in Congress. This permanent agency would be a successor to the present temporary agency created by Mr. Roosevelt.

True enough. Such legislation is pending, and has been a good while. But it's almost certain the legislation will not reach the floor of Congress for debate and action before June 30, if ever. It's buried in committee.

So, by failing to provide money to keep the temporary FEPC going until a permanent FEPC is set up, the House is knocking it off the head. It's a neat way to get rid of it.

Might Involve Wrangle  
It's possible the Senate will insist on Congress providing the money to continue the temporary FEPC. That might involve a wrangle between House and Senate. It's hard to guess what the outcome would be.

As of the moment prospects for the FEPC continue are not bright.
