States, were conspicuously absent from the list of Poles who will take part in the discussion.

Responsible quarters here said that Julian Zakowaki, 48-year-old architect and one of three London Poles invited to the conference, had decided to turn down the bid on the ground that he has never been connected with politics. Regarded as a liberal Socialist who has no affiliation with the anti-administration, he was understood to have been nominated by the Warsaw provisional government.

A dispatch from Moscow by Associated Press Correspondent Eddy Gilmore said a reliable diplomatic authority stated the conference was to be held on the basis of recognizing the government with the Soviet-sponsored provisional government as a nucleus.

Gilmore said diplomats in Moscow believed there were several good reasons to be optimistic.

**Big Three Representatives**

Big Three representatives to the conference will be Russian Foreign Minister Vyacheslav Molotov, U. S. Ambassador W. Averell Harriman and British Ambassador Sir John Archibald Clark Kerr.

Principal Polish leaders selected to attend were Boleslaw Roby, president of the Warsaw provisional government; Wincenty Witos, former premier and leader of the democratic group inside Poland not affiliated with the Warsaw government; and Stanislaw Mikolajczyk, peasant party leader who resigned as premier and withdrew from the cabinet government in London last year.

Announcement of the conference coincided with the return of Harry Hopkins to Washington following talks with Premier Stalin.

Optimism reflected in Moscow dispatches was accepted as strong evidence to support unconfirmed reports that some or all of the 18 missing Poles who helped direct underground activities for the London Polish government had been released by the Russians.

**Political Dilemma Facing Italy Both Complex and Baffling.**

Rome, June 13.—(AP)—Crown Prince Umberto, lieutenant general of the realm, began consultations with Italian party heads today after Premier Ivanoe Bonomi's resignation, in efforts to solve a political dilemma as complex and baffling as any in post-war Europe.

A major factor in Italy's political problem is the absence of elections for an accurate gauge of popular sentiment.

The task of whatever new government emerges will be to prepare for a plebiscite or constituent assembly to decide the fate of the monarchy, which up to now is protected by the Allied embargo.

**Principal Factor in Strife**  
This embargo—frequently attacked by the Republicans as an instrument enabling the monarchy to grid for a showdown battle—regarded as a principal factor in Italy's political strife.

The political tug-of-war out of which the new government will be created is being waged far above the heads of Italy's 40,000,000 inhabitants, by these complex forces.

The Committee of National Liberation, a six-party coalition formed as an underground body to fight the Germans and to rule liberated Italy provisionally. After months of conferences it has been unable to agree on a new government to succeed Bonomi.
