Hearing Fault Affects Speech

Many Children Unable To Associate Sounds, Words Due To Defect.

Hartford, June 26—Many normally hearing children have severe speech defects due to auditory disabilities, declared Florence Stiles Lewis, Speech Teacher, Division of Crippled Children, in the Connecticut State Department of Health Bulletin for May.

For several years the Division of Crippled Children has provided speech training for children with hearing defects. In addition, speech consultation has been given to children having speech defects other than those related to these two conditions. Examination of these children revealed that speech was defective because they were not mentally aware of sounds per se, and were unable to associate sounds with general direction, as was pointed out by the visual forms. Those children who were unable to associate sounds with general direction, were unable to hear in sequence several consonant sounds, which might cause speech defects. There has not been any retardation of speech in these children.
