Each is the greatest agency ever controlled by humans in its particular field. Each is the most efficient cure for some evil which has been afflicting the human race.

DDT is the greatest of insecticides, an unbelievably efficient weapon for man in his continual war against pestilential forms of lower life.

Sulfa and penicillin are the greatest of drugs, the most efficient weapons against disease man has ever discovered.

The atomic bomb is the greatest of war weapons, the most efficient weapon man has found against man. As DDT ends insects, as sulfa and penicillin end germs, so the atomic bomb has ended a war.

So, in first flush of discovery, and in first use, the three, DDT, sulfa, and the atomic bomb are the wonders of all time, three instruments which represent man's highest control of his own destiny.

But now, as we look forward to future use of these great discoveries, the similarity between them becomes even more marked. Each has this striking attribute: although it is the greatest weapon in man's possession for the winning of the struggle against which it is directed, it may actually result in man's complete and final defeat in that struggle.

Man's greatest victories, and his greatest achievements are his most dangerous. It may be impossible to ensure completely that experiments are elected in accordance with the desires of their peoples.

But, went on Mr. Bevin, there is one thing we must aim at, and that is to prevent the substitution of one form of totalitarianism for another.

Later, referring specifically to Bulgaria, Rumania and Hungary, Mr. Bevin said "the governments which have been set up do not in any way represent the majority of the people and the impression we get from recent developments is that one kind of totalitarianism is being replaced by another."

So, if the election of a Labor Government means closer cooperation between Britain and Russia, it must be a give and take cooperation to which Russia brings its full share of courtesy and continuing.

Smaller Strokes Control Wartime Controls Take More Time

Washington, Aug. 22.—(AP)—News here on it will be a little different from that first week after Japan surrendered.

Then the news came of the swing from war to peace at home—in a rush and a year.

It started almost as soon as the president announced victory on the night of Aug. 14.

Reconversion News Delayed

A short time later that might be started off the reconversion news delay, which lasted through the week, with this:

An end to the draft for men of 65 or over, at end to all manpower controls, the discharge of men from the armed services within 48 hours.

Announcement piled upon announcement according to one official—close to the top—America was caught in the "woods" by the suddenness of the surrender.

It had to whack its way out. It did it by whacking by tearing away wartime control after another to shove American industry and civilians scrambling down the new peace road.
