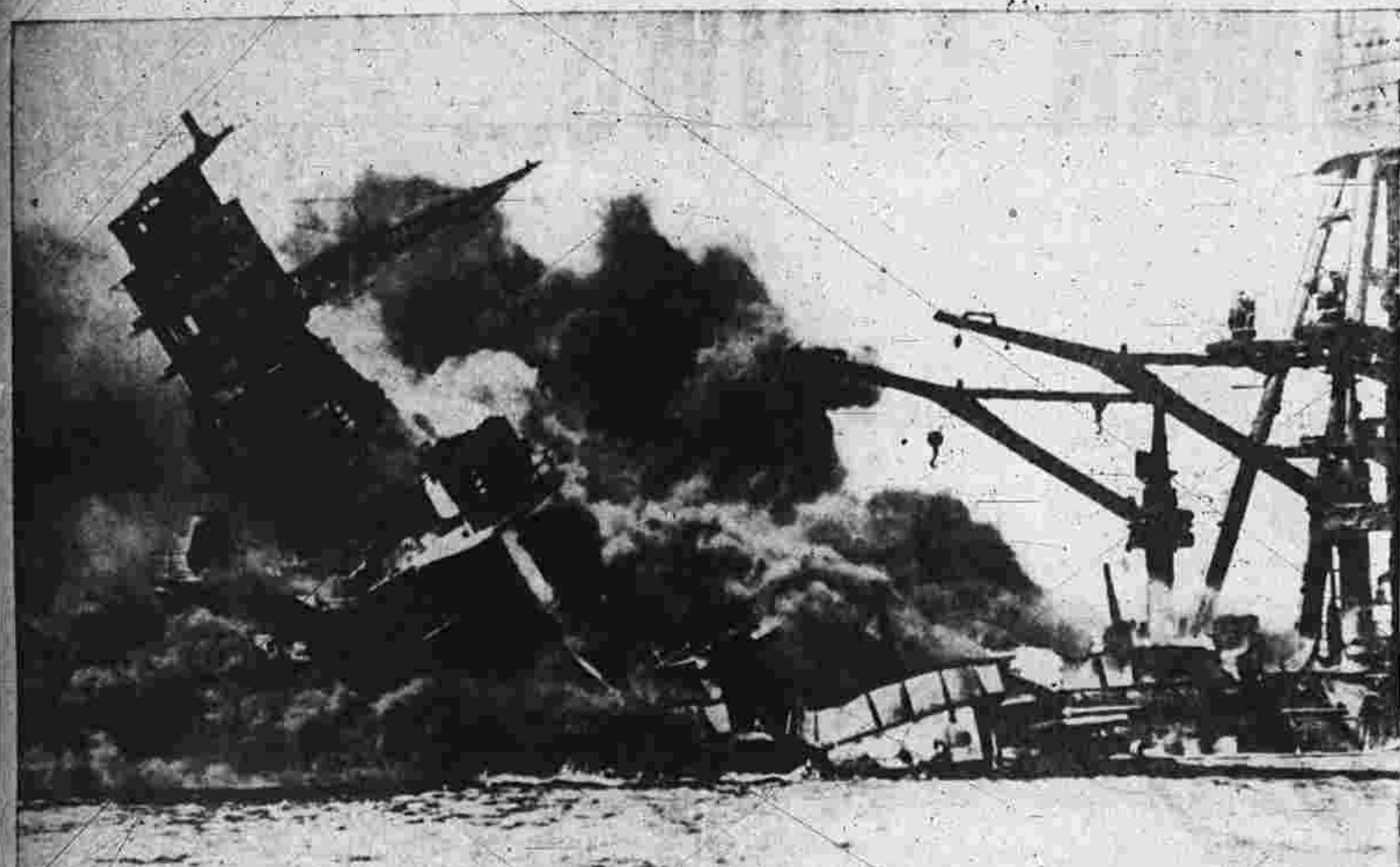

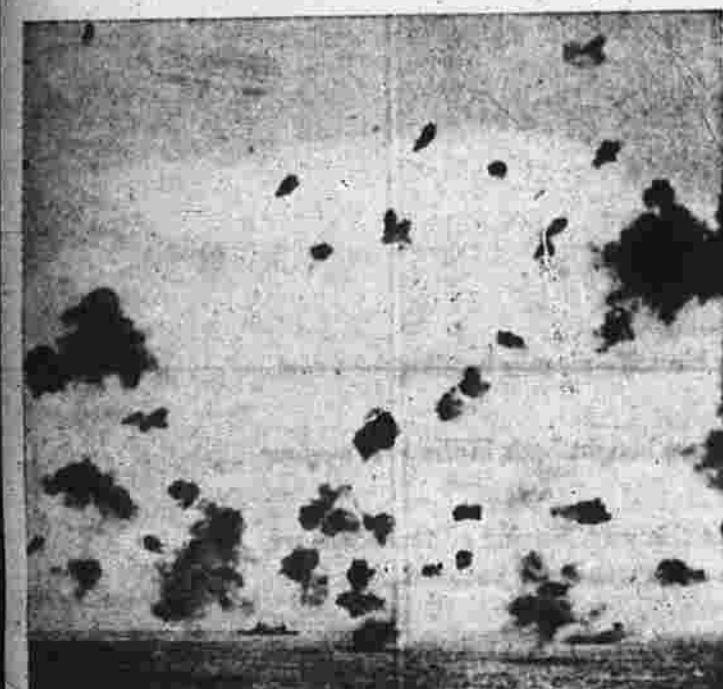
Camera Record of Japan in Victory---and in Defeat

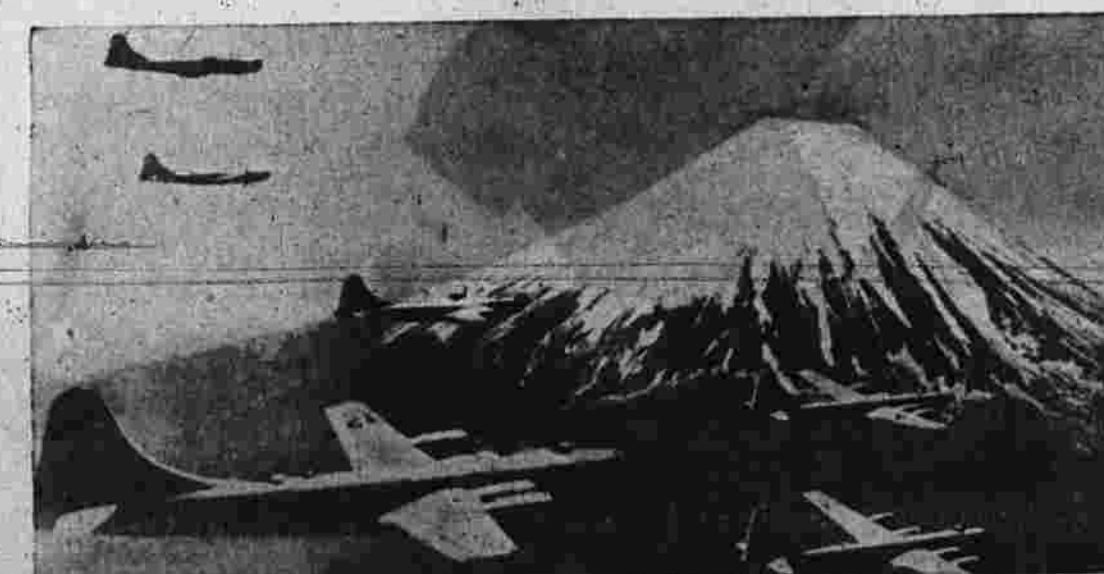

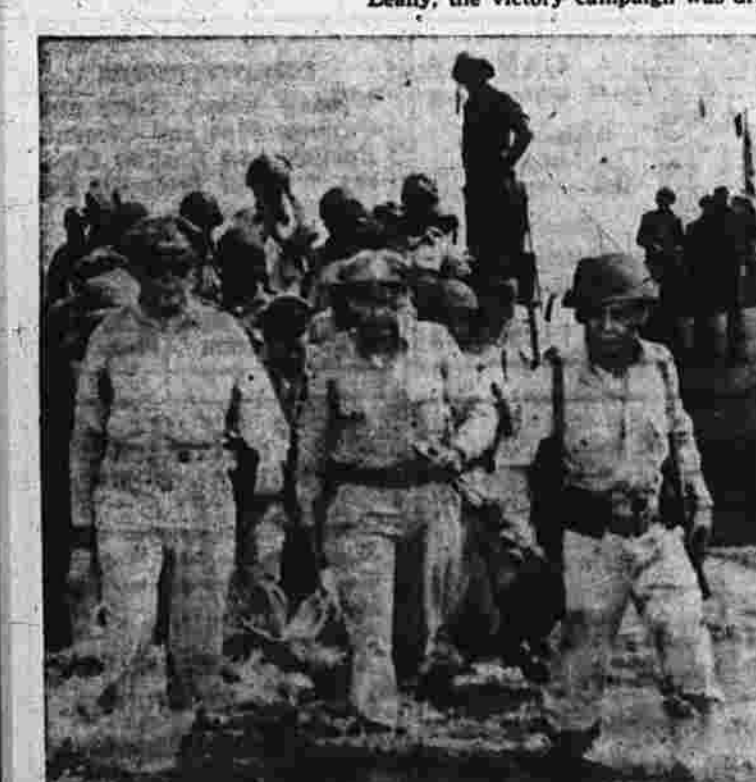

While the men and women of Manchester found war work in the local and Hartford war plants, their sons were dying or suffering wounds and privations on the battlefields of Germany and the South Sea Islands and the Japanese Empire and on ships and in planes above the embattled troops.

By November, 1944, 38 Manchester men killed in action; 31 were wounded, 13 were missing and seven were reported as prisoners of war. In the Pacific, the Navy had reported seven dead, two wounded and three missing. In the Army, 11 were reported as missing, three dead and three wounded and one missing. Fifty Manchester boys had died to make the supreme sacrifice. And the end was far from sight.
