Police Court

John D. Leonard, of 148 Forest street, East Hartford, was convicted of evading responsibility in connection with an automobile accident which occurred August 24 at 2:40 p. m. at the intersection of Hartford Road and Spencer street involving a car driven by E. W. Lamb of 230 Hackmack street. Judge Raymond R. Bowers presided in court today.

Leonard was accused of leaving the scene of the accident without identifying himself or submitting to police investigation. He was later arrested by Officer Walter R. Casella, in connection with an accident which occurred at Adams and Center streets on August 2 at 10:55 a. m., when a car driven by Panagakis traveling west on Center street struck a car crossing Center street from the north to south side, driven by Thomas Spillane.

Officer William Scully, the investigating officer, testified concerning the point of impact of the two cars, distances of both cars from the contact and said that when he arrived Spillane was driving west on the west side of his car in a dashed condition. Spillane was taken to the hospital in Holman's ambulance and remained there as a patient for 25 days, he testified, having suffered injuries to his head, elbow, bruises on his left side and back. Both Panagakis and Spillane testified that neither saw the other car approaching. Mrs. Mary Panagakis, sister-in-law of the accused, a passenger in the car at the time of the accident, also testified. She said she did not see the Spillane car until almost upon it. Mrs. Panagakis was cut down from the face and was hospitalized for several days. Panagakis was enroute from Coventry Lake to his place of business in Hartford on the Sunday morning when the accident took place, he said. In rendering his verdict, Judge Bowers said that he could find no grounds in the testimony for reckless driving, though admitting negligence of the parties involved in the operation of their cars. Albert Wilson, 521 Spring street, was found guilty of drunken driving on Sept. 2 on Woodbridge street. Wilson was arrested by Officer Winfield Martin after which had struck a pole on Woodbridge street. Mrs. Rose M. Hillbrand, 61 of the same address, a passenger in the Wilson car, suffered a fracture, leg in the crash and a laceration of the forehead. The witness, Wilson, pleaded nolo contendere.

Army Hints Men of 34 To Get Out

(Continued from Page One)

Men in the new categories who now are in the Pacific area or in Europe will remain until they are eligible for discharge or can be returned. However, such soldiers in Europe will not be sent to the Pacific.

Those screened out of re-employment units under the new regulations and other qualified individuals will be given duty in replacement, training and separation centers in this country to replace men being discharged.

Score Will Be Recompacted Eventually, the screening score will be recomputed to take in combat, parenthood and service credits on which the new discharge score of 80 points is based. This revised score may be higher, it was explained, but will not affect those who had 45 points on May 12.

Currently, enlisted men with 80 or more points based on the Sept. 2 computation; those 38 or older and those 30 through 37 with minimum of two years of service are eligible for discharge. There are about 1,100,000 men in these groups, in addition to the 400,000 who were made eligible for discharge under the former 85 point score.

The Army said the new 80-point score will be reduced from time to time to keep demobilization at a high rate. An enlisted WAC may be discharged.
