Tokyo, Sept. 7.—(AP)—Fanatical Japanese sources said today that well-known young Japanese officers on Aug. 14 killed the commanding general of Emperor Hirohito's personal guard division and forger his name sheet troops to surround the palace in a vain effort to prevent the imperial surrender announcement.

Yoshihisa Kuzo, one of two men who organized the Black Dragon society, was seen today in a public place, it was reported.

Kuzo, 70-year-old professional patriot, was reported to be in the country.

The Black Dragon society was known from the activities of the late Mitsuru Toyama, long its president, who died in 1944 at the age of 49.

Discussions in February sources which gave this information said that the first surrender discussions among the militarists began in February.

Before the surrender actually was announced, the emperor's historic decision to accept the terms of the Potsdam declaration was made.

The group of fanatical young officers included a lieutenant colonel and a major hatched a hurried plot to assassinate the emperor.

During the war, secret societies battled each other for spoils from China, Malaya, the Philippines and elsewhere.

It is impossible to ascertain now whether new government policies are encouraging or discouraging such activities.

On Sept. 7.—Victim Quishing, pleading for his life today, told a court trying him for treason that "Hitler took a deep liking for me and wanted me for other tasks in Europe."

He said Hitler respected him because he was a "people's man."

He acknowledged meeting Grand Admiral Raeder but said the conversation was "perfectly innocent" and that he was not aware of the invasion of Norway.

90,000 Idle During Wave Of Disputes

Death Takes Naval Leader
Admiral McCain Victim of Exhaustion From Combat Duty

San Diego, Calif., Sept. 7.—The stout fighting heart which carried Admiral John S. McCain through the Navy's strenuous flying course at 52 years of age and to smashing victories over the Japanese, gave out last night in a heart attack while McCain was in command of the aircraft carrier USS Yorktown (CV-10).

Admiral McCain, 52, was in command of the Yorktown when it was damaged by a kamikaze attack on the night of Oct. 24, 1944. He was shot down and captured by the Japanese. He was held in a prisoner-of-war camp in Japan for 18 months.
