6 ways to protect your eyesight

1. Don't sit in direct glare. Shade eyes to eliminate glare and use indirect reflector lamps wherever possible. Never sit close to your left shoulder. Never read by light.
2. Avoid reflected glare. Guard against light reflected into your shadow can cause severe eyestrain. Your shadow can reduce the amount of light on an object 1/3 its normal intensity.
3. Don't sit in your own shadow. Read in a well lighted room. Avoid reading in a room where your shadow can fall on the page.
4. Rest your eyes occasionally. Your eyes become tired when you read for long periods. To read an average newspaper, 400 words require about 40,000 muscular movements. So stop and rest awhile.
5. Keep bulbs clean. Remove your bulbs and bowls occasionally to give them a bath in warm, soapy water. The higher you are the brighter your light. Dirty bulbs mean 25% to 30% less light.
6. Use right bulbs. Floor lamps should have 100 watts; table lamps, 100 to 150 watts; desk lamps, 400 watts; so-called "60 to 75 watt" lamps, 40 to 60 watts; kitchen, 100 watts.
