War Prisoner Guest Speaker

Priest Held by Japanese Tells of His Experiences to Rotarians
 Rev. John Doherty, of the LaSalle Missionary order, was guest speaker of the Rotary Club at the Sheridan last evening.
 Recalling his experiences as a prisoner of the Japs, Father Doherty stated that the last year of his internment was the most difficult and hunger was his constant companion. Any slight taste he attempted left him exhausted. He said he has increased in weight 30 pounds since liberated.
 The Filipino never lost confidence or faith in the Americans. Even through their darkest days they knew that some day they would return and consequently treated American prisoners as they would their own people, raising their lives and sometimes dying trying to get food to the starving internees at the infamous San Tomas prison in Manila.
 The Japs' fear of "losing face" before the consuls of the neutral countries forced them to treat the inmates of San Tomas with a little more decency than they did in the concentration camps outside the city, and prisoners they considered dangerous were transferred to other camps and tortured or killed.
 Officers More Brutal
 Stating that the Japanese officers were more brutal than the average Japanese soldier, Father Doherty related several instances where barter was carried on between the soldiers and the inmates. On one occasion Father Doherty traded his watch for two pounds of rice and considered it a good bargain.
 During his three years imprisonment, Father Doherty came in close contact with the Jesuit missionaries and praised their work highly. They had a tremendous influence over the population of the Philippines and used it to defeat the Japs in various ways.
 Father Doherty is leaving in a few days for England to do parish work outside of London. His highly interesting talk was thoroughly enjoyed by all the members.

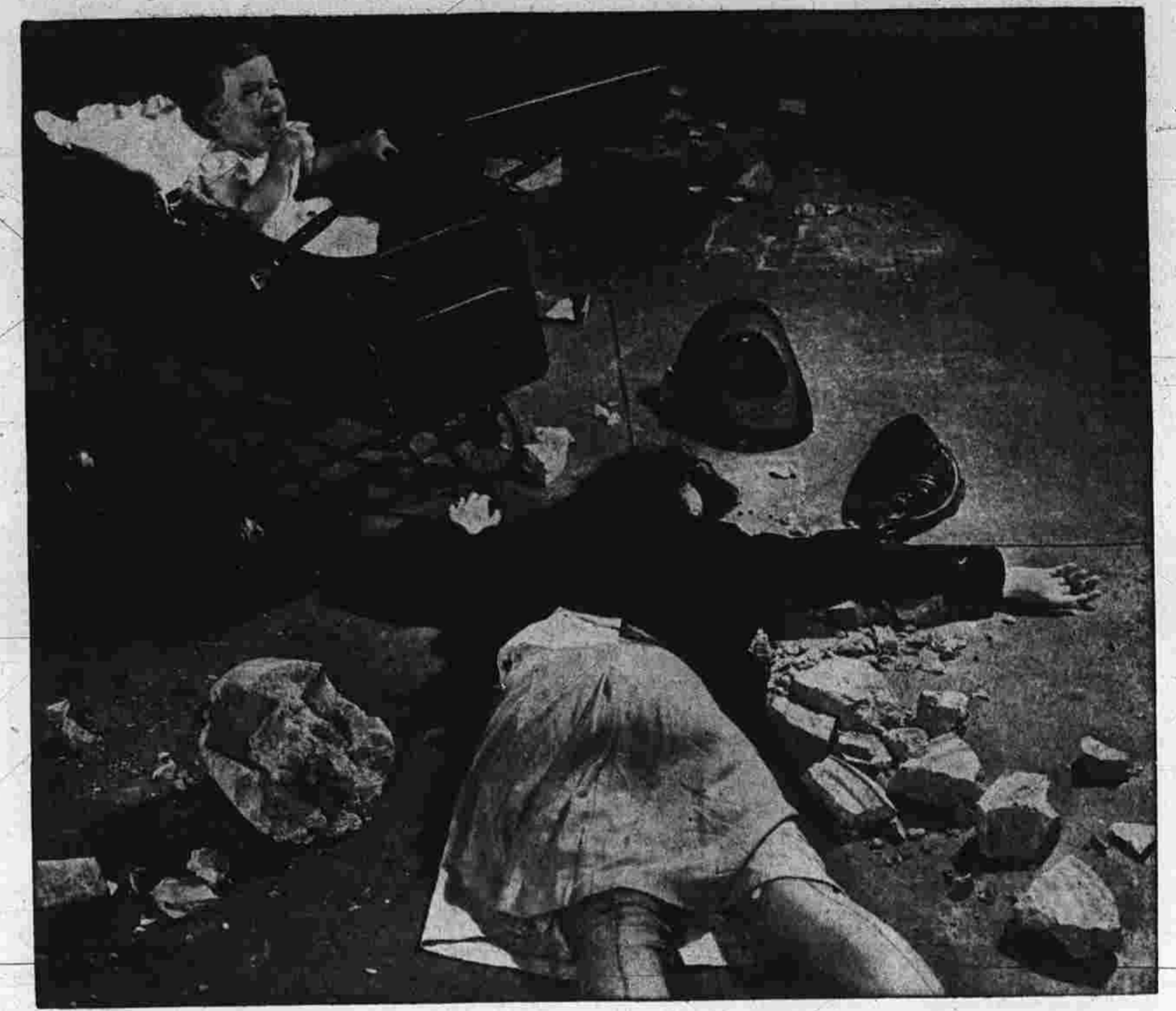
