You might recall that the "Law No. 10" does not strip the right to attempt to prove to local military government officials that they were not active in Nazi activities.

General Eisenhower is known to have indicated he would demand a rigid test of such claims for fear of a two-pronged U. S. attack on Nazi owners was unofficially reported to the winning supporters on the Allied Control Authority for the zone.

The British have made no attempt yet to duplicate Eisenhower's order for comprehensive de-Nazification of public and quasi-public officials.

Exhaustive Tests Show Pills Do Not Restore Hair Color

By William A. O'Brien, M.D.

Can gray hair be restored to its original color by taking chemicals or vitamins? Part of this question is difficult to answer because no one knows what is meant by the original color of the hair, but the various vitamins and chemicals which have been tried on man under scientific conditions have not changed the color of gray hair, according to Modern Medicine for August, 1945. There is little evidence that members of the vitamin B complex used singly or in combination will restore the normal pigment of hair which has lost its color.

The idea that some form of malnutrition might be a factor in graying of the hair, came from studies of severe starvation in animals and humans. Many years ago it was noted that the hair of rats became gray if fed on a deficient diet and when they were put back on a general diet and certain chemicals were added the original color of the hair was restored. A sufferer from severe pellagra, a nutritional deficiency disease, whose hair became white, also reported that after he had eaten the original diet plus certain vitamins his hair turned black.

"If no one chemical or vitamin has been found solely responsible for the graying of the hair, it is probable that a combination of factors is at work. It is also reported that the hair of a man who had been without food for a long time and who had lost a great deal of weight, turned black after he had eaten a diet rich in vitamins and minerals."
