Ends Series Of Lectures

Father Stack Talks on the Seventh, Eighth, Tenth Commandments

"If we need something to preserve our life and can't get it in any other way it is perfectly all right to take another's property and restore it later." Rev. Thomas F. Stack, St. Thomas' rectory, Bloomfield, told his audience at the last of six lectures on "A Map of Life" at St. James' School last night. "For example, if we were being pursued by someone who knew we were going to kill us it would be all right to take an automobile that was standing at the curb with the motor running in order to make our escape. Civil law does not recognize this right as it opens to abuse. What civil law thinks, however, does not change the morality."

"Then there is the little understood matter of occult compensation. We must be very careful in this. Occult compensation is the secret appropriation of a just debt owed to us. It is a perfectly legitimate way of recovering property. However, the debt must be certain; it can't be owed to us because we don't know where it is. We must be able to take something from someone because we have given him something. Nor can we take something from someone because it has been promised to us. It must be received. If we must be careful that there are no other means of recovering the debt."

"We must be careful that no debt is done to a third party. Whenever we have a case of occult compensation we should consider the law into our own hands. If wages are less than those due in strict justice we can take more to make up what is just. Before doing this one should consult his confessor. He will tell you of ways of making restitution."

"In any case of stealing there is the obligation of making restitution. Before doing this one should consult his confessor. He will tell you of ways of making restitution."

"God could have made us so that we would not have to provide for food and clothing. Man has a right to his property which he has earned and no man has the right to steal from him. If a thief finds out he has been taken books as a loan either with or without the owner's consent. It is outright stealing when these books are not returned. It is stealing if a library. Also it is if we do not return books to a public library. It is also poor citizenship when many volumes are priceless and cannot be replaced."

"Running up a charge account which we know we will be unable to pay is sinful. Extravagant living, where we are unable to pay debts that should be paid, is another sinful act. Many people owe a debt in one store and they forget to pay in another and when they have no intention of paying the first store, they are committing a sin."

"Borrowing with a person's promised consent is permissible. If we have been accustomed to borrowing another's lawnmower and that person is not at home when we need to use it, we can borrow the lawnmower from a neighbor who owns it. We should tell the owner of our action when we return it."

"Sinfulness of theft depends upon whom we steal and also upon the value of the thing stolen. Theft of between \$40 or \$60 or more from anyone is a mortal sin; regardless of the wealth of the person from whom we steal. We must consider relative values. It is a great sin to steal if the loss is a notable one to the particular owner. For example, stealing a day's pay from a working person is a mortal sin. Or if the sum taken is that needed to provide for one day's expenses for his family."

"It is a bit different to steal from one's parents than from from one's neighbors. The relationship of parents is a great sin. It is a sin to steal from one's neighbors. If the thief is caught at intervals. Small thefts at long intervals if not united through intention do not make into a great theft. If it is the intention to take a great sum, it is a mortal sin. In the latter case a great theft becomes a grave sin."

"Continual venial sin, however, would lead us from loving God. If we realized what sin really is we would never want to commit venial sin. When we steal we have to restore the amount taken before we can be forgiven."

"Stealing is against the basic citizenship. Many people think nothing of taking towels from a hotel room or using them to clean their shoes or razor blades. They excuse themselves by saying they are paying more for the room than it is worth and that the hotel excused such treatment."

"We must also consider authors and inventors. We can't take something from another's book if we are going to get paid for it, unless we get the author's permission or pay him for it."

"Stealing is unjust when property is taken without the owner's reasonable consent. In extreme need a person may take whatever

KILLED IN ACTION is the official description that closes this Coast Guard's records, but, more than that, he is a symbol of all those who died at their posts in the service of their country. He is a symbol of the courage, the strength and the daring that make our Navy the greatest in the world.
