Maj. Hagedorn Club's Speaker

Military Officer Delivers Address to Professional Women's Group

A meeting of the Professional Women's Club was held last evening at Center Church house, with Major Raymond Hagedorn as guest speaker. Major Hagedorn spoke in a pleasant, informal way on the general subject of the veteran's post-war needs, and illustrated his discussion with the assistance of a number of actual cases with which he has come in contact.

He told first of his own war experience with the Fort-third Division in the Philippines, and of a "rest" at camp in California where the mercury sometimes reached 150 degrees.

His Present Employment

Major Hagedorn has been employed for the past eighteen months in a position which he at first took with misgiving, but has found to be tremendously interesting. The New Departure Division of General Motors in Bristol and Meriden wished to do some work for their returning veterans. They engaged Major Hagedorn to carry out a plan. After careful consideration the major decided on certain aspects of the firm to the returning veteran as a first consideration. Each man should be treated as an individual rather than merely as a member of a class or group; his grievances and ideas, those should be listened to as well. His physical demands and requirements were to be checked against his physical condition.

Place for Handicapped Men

A definite place must also be found for handicapped men. The case of "Tommy" was described as a typical one. Tommy had so many narrow escapes from death, and was bringing in a war-time work as his company's representative in Washington.

Gunshot Victim Makes Remarkable Recovery

Fact That Life of Bolton Man Was Saved At Local Hospital Is Tribute to Institution

Roger Williams of Bolton, recent victim of gunshot wounds in the abdomen, had made a miraculous recovery and is now ready to leave the Manchester Memorial hospital where he has been confined since admittance there on October 20. On that date the Colchester State Police called the local hospital to state that they were bringing in a man with a serious gunshot wound in abdomen.

The hospital personnel immediately started preparations to receive the patient in complete readiness when the patient arrived. Five minutes after his arrival in the hospital the exact location of the bullet had been determined by X-ray. Within fifteen minutes after his arrival the patient was on the operating table and a really life-saving operation was performed by the surgeons of the hospital. All vital organs were examined throughout and it was found that the intestinal tract had been pierced in 15 places by the bullet. Speed in an operation of this type is an essential factor, and in this case the fifteen holes were closed up and the bullet extracted from the abdomen in a short time as possible. For the next 24 hours numerous plates of blood plasma were administered and for the next six days the patient was kept alive by intravenous feeding.

Thanks to the special care given by the nurses' staff, the doctors and the entire hospital staff, Mr. Williams' recovery is nothing short of miraculous. This is a good example of the results which can be obtained in an efficient hospital such as there is in Manchester. It is a wonderful tribute to medical skill. The fact that he is now completely recovered and able to leave the hospital, in view of the condition of his abdomen, is a testimonial evidence of the excellent care given to patients in the Manchester Memorial hospital.

Veteran Takes Life in Theater

New York, Nov. 7.—(AP)—A discharged serviceman shot himself through the heart while seated in a crowded Brooklyn movie house yesterday watching a film "Back to Bataan" which depicts the liberation of the Philippines.

Hunt for Poison Gas Led to Rodent-Killer

Secret Held by Polish Chemists Relayed to United States from Refugee Scientist

By Barton Humphries
Washington, Nov. 7.—(AP)—The search for a deadly poison gas by Polish chemists led to discovery of 1080, the new wonder rat poison.

So 1080 came into being. Hurried plans were made for wide field testing. A grant was obtained from ORSD for the purchase of 1,000 pounds of 1080. A chemical concern was commissioned to make it.

When it arrived it was proceeded to the rodent control operators and the Fish and Wildlife Service, the Public Health Service, the Army and the Navy for further testing under all possible conditions.

The results were even more dramatic than the chemist had hoped. Poison 1080 was it.

(Tomorrow: 1080's Partner)

Dr. Ray Treacher, then a research chemist for the Fish and Wildlife Service, had appealed to all United States chemical concerns for samples of chemicals which had shown themselves to be effective.

Hundreds of such chemicals had been tested on thousands of laboratory rats. While poisonous substances were found, none had been located which had all the virtues of a good rodenticide (rat poison). A good poison should be highly toxic, stable, dependable and acceptable to rats and other rodents.

New Formulas Selected

In a conference between Dr. Treacher and Dr. Walter Kirmser of the National Defense Research Council, a number of new formulae were selected for trial. One of them was a compound related to the substance which had been discovered in Poland.

More laboratory tests were arranged, and test 1,080 arrived. The substance was a fluorocarbon acid derivative. Although deadly in small quantities, it was too volatile and dangerous to handle. Chemists put their heads together and decided to make a "salt" of it.

Small quantities of the salt, sodium fluorocarbonate, were tested in the Patuxent, Md. laboratories of the Fish and Wildlife Service.

Danbury Fires Damage Heavy

Break Out Simultaneously in Fur and Silversware Plants

Danbury, Nov. 7.—(AP)—Two fires which broke out simultaneously at 2 o'clock this morning in the fur factory of George A. McLachlan and Sons and the silversware plant of the Holston-Botts Co. on White Street caused heavy damage according to Fire Chief John H. McNamara. He said he was unable to estimate the loss in figures.

The fur factory fire was discovered by Peter Gallagher, a night watchman and had spread throughout the second floor of the building when the first fire company rolled in and while flames were laying hose lines the flames were noticed in the silversware factory about 50 feet east of the fur plant.

Hampered by Heavy Smoke

Damage in the silversware factory was kept at a small figure, Chief McNamara said as the blaze there was quickly extinguished. However, he added, the fire in the fur plant had spread into the third floor and hampered by heavy smoke, the firefighters experienced considerable difficulty in bringing the flames under control in an hour's fight. In addition to the fire damage in the fur factory, Chief McNamara said, water used to cause some loss of stock.

He expressed the opinion that the defective wiring in one of the fur plants was responsible for the fire which will be investigated today.
