The toastmaster then called on Rev. Ralph Ward to introduce the speaker of the evening, Rev. George A. Fallon, D.D., pastor of one of the largest Methodist churches in New England, Wesley church in Worcester, Mass. Dr. Fallon is a newcomer to New England, coming to Worcester three years ago from the Philadelphia area. He is widely known as a speaker before church groups, service organizations and clubs. He is a very forceful speaker and an orator of ability. He held the close attention of his large audience, his subject dealing with post-war problems. He punctuated his address with exceptionally good stories and events that kept his audience in a good humor. He made it very plain that if we are to bring about the new world in which all nations are to live in peace we must all do our part. We cannot just ask what Britain will do or what Russia will do, but what we are going to do.

The new world is a possibility, but in order to bring it about we must use our brains. It will not come about except we attempt to bring it about. We must have vision. Today we are living in one world. Boundaries mean nothing, not even the great oceans. Dr. Fallon praised the American nation for its great accomplishments. He praised American genius for the steamship, the telegraph, the telephone, the great railroads, radio and the airplane.

Dr. Fallon took a very definite stand against compulsory military service. He reminded his hearers that Germany became a great militaristic nation and today Germany is laid low. He also spoke of Japan, and her military power and asked his hearers to think what has happened to Japan. And yet there are those in this country who would have us take up what both Germany and Japan failed in. He closed his address by appealing to the nations of the world to live peacefully together, to put off thoughts of warring one on the other and to urge the people of this great nation to take the leadership in bringing about the new world.
