Plan to Challenge Summary of Jap Story of Attack

Republicans on Pearl Harbor Investigating Committee to Try to Learn if Any Act of United States Official Touched Off Warfare

Washington, Nov. 17.—(AP)—Admiral T. B. Inglis testified today that the Navy might have discovered the Japanese task force attacking Pearl Harbor if it had used its long-range patrol planes. Under questioning by Senator Brewster (R., Me.), Inglis told a Senate-House inquiry committee that 69 PB-1s, capable of flying a triangular course with an 800-mile radius, were available for patrol work in December, 1941.

Washington, Nov. 17.—(AP)—The Pearl Harbor investigating committee turned today to questioning whether any act of United States officials touched off the war with Japan. Republican members told newsmen they would challenge a summary of Japan's side of the story which Rear Admiral T. B. Inglis, Naval intelligence officer, expected to lay before the committee in its third day of hearings.

Shows Hull Not Responsible Senator Brewster (R., Me.) who has had the summary in his possession since Thursday, expressed the opinion to reporters that the report was designed to show former Secretary of State Hull "was not responsible for the war." Brewster said the summary undertaken to prove that the Japanese decision to attack Pearl Harbor was made long before Hull's negotiations with a Japanese "peace" envoy reached their climax with the presentation of final American proposals on Nov. 25, 1941.

Legion Moves Into Chicago Scarcity of Rooms in Hotels; Convention to Be Opened Tomorrow

Chicago, Nov. 17.—(AP)—The American Legion moved into Chicago today for its first post-World War 2 convention, facing such present-time problems as universal military training, employment, housing and rehabilitation of veterans. Hotel rooms for the four-day convention opening tomorrow were scarce, and the Legion had only some 3,000 rooms reserved for its delegates, as many alterations were made over the past few days.

61 Resolutions Offered Committees began work on affixing 61 resolutions. One of the most important committees, on national defense, had the task of presenting to the convention a program of peacetime military training unified under federal command. It required provision for the transportation, shelter, hospitalization, supply, training, and general welfare of 1,300,000 men who had to be embarked in the United States and transported across the Atlantic to the United Kingdom.
