#### About 2,500 Berlin Women and Girls Being Arrested Weekly

Berlin, Dec. 4.—The four powers occupying Germany, aided by German civilian police, are pushing a concerted drive against vice and delinquency which is bringing in about 2,500 Berlin women and girls weekly. Up to last week 30 per cent of those examined had general diseases. A campaign of compulsory treatment is now reducing this to approximately 25 per cent.

In launching the anti-vice drive, military government authorities are taking what one specialist American medical officer called "the greatest moral problem in the world."

**350,000 of "Easy Virtue"**

He estimated there are 250,000 women of "easy virtue" in Berlin, although more than 60,000 are classified as professional or semi-professional prostitutes.

"These figures shock even the Germans," the medical officer said. "They reflect more than a moral breakdown—more nearly a chaos to which many factors contribute."

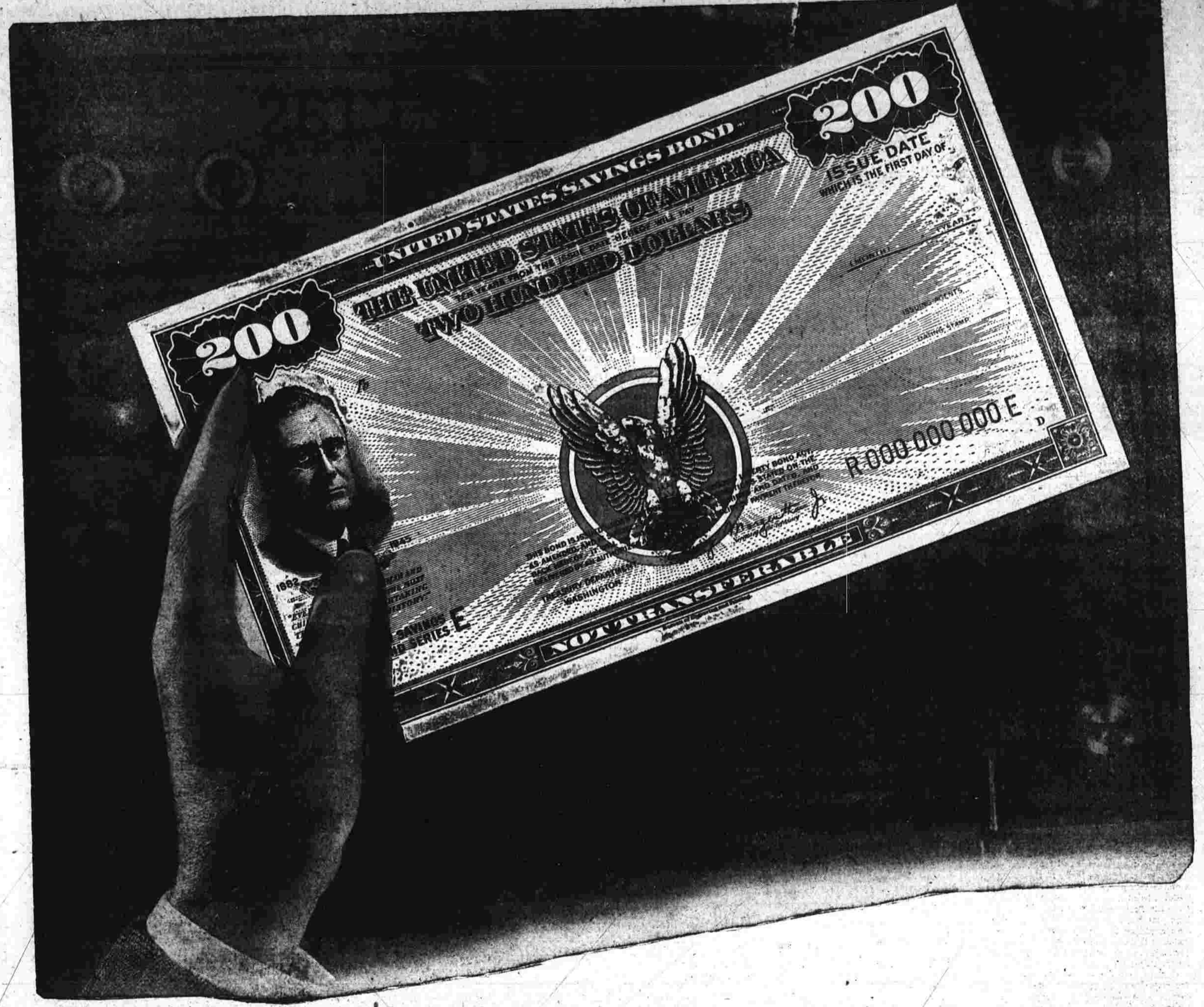

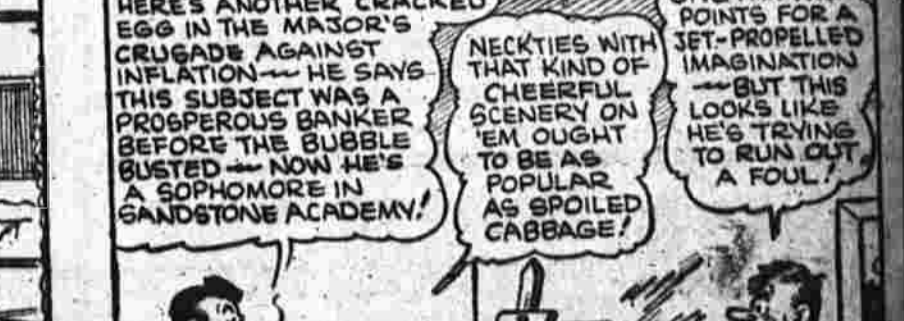
