It is not our prospective share in the business of a free trade world which is the really important division, however. Free economic opportunity for all nations, free access to markets and free access to raw materials, are the basic economic fundamentals of a peaceful condition in the world as a whole.

Why Pearl Harbor
 Four years ago today the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor. Today, Congress is still investigating the circumstances of that attack. But whatever it happens in and report, the basic reason for the Pearl Harbor attack will probably not be among its findings.

The attack on Pearl Harbor was made, and it was almost inevitable, because the whole civilized world had previously failed to enforce its own rules for law and order. There were ways by which Pearl Harbor might have been prevented. There was a League of Nations which, properly supported and strengthened, might have operated in the long series of aggressions to which Pearl Harbor was merely the climax.

We abandoned from the League of Nations. But we were the leading signatory of the Nine Power Treaty which Japan violated when she made her first assault on Chinese sovereignty with her move into Manchuria in 1931. Here, thanks to the presence of Mr. Henry Stimson in the office of Secretary of State, we were at least cognizant of our opportunity to range the forces of international law and order against Japan, while there still was time for a unified world front to force Japan to back down. But, not finding that united world front to force our selves released, we were obliged to act, before the matter of the present loan developed. Britain so pledged in signing the Lend Lease Agreement back in 1941. The question at the end of the war, however, became one of how Britain, impoverished by the war and confronted with the necessity of struggling back to her economic feet, could bring herself to begin her reconversion effort by giving up those artificial economic aids British policy had accumulated in the past. How, with her own situation such an emergency, could she begin by abandoning those tariff preferences and monopolies and fund systems which meant advantage to her?

The answer was that, if Britain were left to its own resources, Britain would have to find the re-equilibrium of these artificial advantages impossible. Rather than give them up, Britain would, in fact, have to rely upon them more heavily than ever.

It is our loan which can make the alternative policy for Britain possible, which can give Britain the economic transition necessary if Britain is to impose such a drastic alteration in its own method of doing business.

One tangible dividend America is to collect almost immediately from the loan agreement, pledges to abolish, within one year, the so-called "dollar pool" maintained by the general "string bloc." This sterling bloc comprises the United Kingdom itself, India, Australia, New Zealand, Elze, Iceland, Egypt, Iraq, and all British colonies and mandates. And the "dollar pool" maintained by this bloc operates in the following manner: When America buys something from Egypt, and pay for it in American dollars, Egypt must now take those dollars and put them in a common pool, which in turn tells Egypt when and how it can spend a certain portion of these dollars in purchases of goods from America. The result is to impose American trade with Egypt, and to reserve to British home industry the first and choicest opportunity for doing business in Egypt.

This system has, in the past, kept American industry pretty well out of markets like Egypt and India and Australia, even when these countries had dollars they wanted to spend with us.

When the government set an inquest, this \$11,000,000,000 goal, it divided it into three parts:

Have Topped Goal
 To non-individuals (such as corporations, organizations, groups) \$7,000,000,000. This group topped the goal, bought \$8,076,000,000.

To individuals: \$4,000,000,000 in all classes of bonds. Individuals have topped the goal by buying \$4,212,000,000.

But—of that \$4,000,000,000 goal for individuals the government wanted to sell \$2,000,000,000 in "E" bonds—those bonds which range from \$25 to \$1,000 in maturity.

So far it has sold only \$1,165,000,000.

Doesn't Actually End Tomorrow
 Actually, though, this drive which started Oct. 29 doesn't end tomorrow—so far as final results are concerned—but on Dec. 31. This is why:

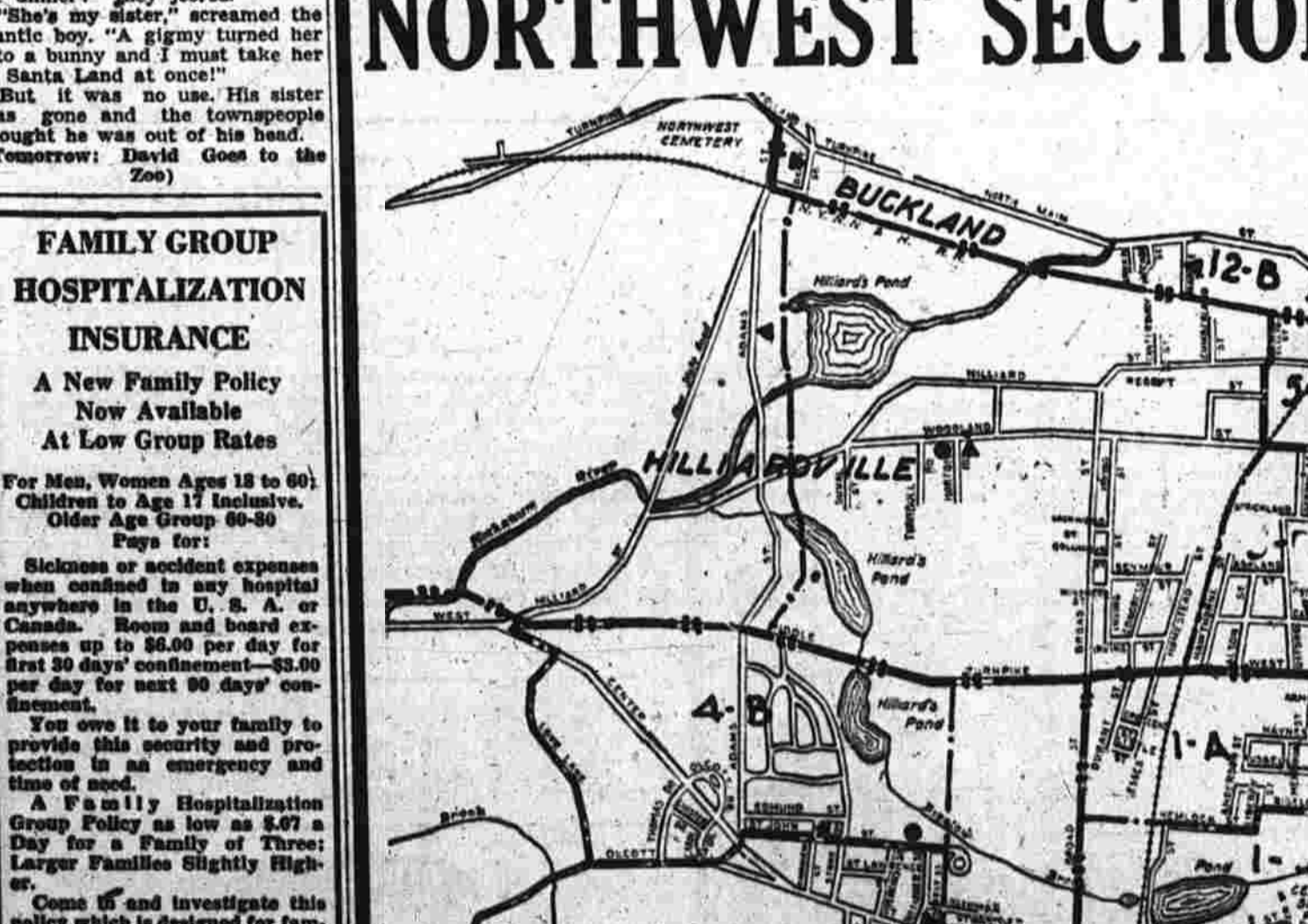
