

Rockville Town Meeting This Evening

Special Gathering Is Called in Rockville to Discuss Three Items

Rockville, Dec. 18.—(Special)—A special town meeting will be held this evening at which time the voters will be asked to take action on three items.

The first item is the appropriation of \$3,500 for the erection of a new fire escape on the Memorial Building. It is understood that the present escape is unsafe and that unless the appropriation is voted, it will not be possible to use the Town Hall in the future.

The second item is to appropriate \$2,000, the town's share of the new Veterans' Advisory Center. At a city meeting held two weeks ago, the city appropriation was voted.

The third matter is to see whether or not the voters will authorize the Vernon Fire Company No. 2 the use of the Dobsonville school house for recreational purposes. This building was turned back to the town of Vernon by the Board of Education several months ago.

Death Foiled Revolt Plans
Irish Agent Aboard German U-Boat at Time He Succeeded

Nuremberg, Germany, Dec. 18.—The mysterious death of an Irish revolutionary agent aboard a German U-boat foiled Nazi plans to promote a revolution in Ireland and to sabotage British industries from Irish bases, according to Nazi Maj. Gen. Edwin Lahusen.

Lahusen, erstwhile German intelligence official who is a prosecution witness at the war crimes trial here, said in an interview that the Nazis planned to air up revolt against the outlawed Irish Republican Army.

The revolution, he said, was to be timed to occur when the Nazis would be in the process of retreating from Britain. This was to be accomplished by sabotage operations conducted against British war industries by agents operating from Irish bases and assisted by the Irish Republican Army.

Key Figure Irish-American
Lahusen said the key revolutionary figure, whose death put a permanent crimp in Nazi intrigues, was an Irish-American in the IRA, United States merchant ship, and went to Germany after contacting Nazi intelligence officers, Lahusen said.

After German operatives were sent to Ireland, the IRA agent was to board a submarine on Aug. 6, 1940, for an undetected voyage to the Irish coast, Lahusen said.

The U-boat had only been gone a very few hours when it sent a radio message that the agent had been killed. Lahusen said there was great excitement caused by this in the Foreign Office in London, which had been informed of the high state of excitement had proved too much for him.

Assessed of Police Agent
Admiral Walter W. Canaris, the Greek-born chief of German intelligence, who subsequently was hanged for participation in the 1944 bomb plot against Hitler, was accused by the German Foreign Office of poisoning the IRA agent.

"I can say that however mysterious this whole affair was, it was absolutely out of the question that Canaris poisoned him," Lahusen said.

Another theory, advanced by Allied interrogation officers, is that a British secret agent, who was an IRA agent, may have had a hand in the death. In any event, the death "practically ended all enterprises in Ireland," said Lahusen.

Smuggling Arms Comment Awaited
Mexico City, Dec. 18.—(AP)—U. S. Ambassador George S. Messersmith today awaited the Mexican government's comment on charges by Labor Leader Vincent Lombardi that the United States was smuggling arms into Mexico.

Messersmith visited Foreign Secretary Castillo Xaguer last night and asked him to help determine if there were any "definite evidences" to support Lombardi's charges. He said he had a conversation with the foreign secretary and that he would report the results of the conversation to the State Department.

The labor leader, head of the C. A. R., asserted in a speech Sunday that members of the revolutionary Sinuista movement were "passing arms into Mexico across the United States border" and that the U. S. government was "aiding certain Yankee imperialistic companies," which he did not identify by name.

Carbon Monoxide Makes Four Ill
Bridgeport, Dec. 18.—(AP)—August Undersefer, 60, of Stratford, Conn., was present of stroke Monday night, his wife, Mrs. Eneline Ptasnik, and his grandson, four-month-old Walter Pasnik, are in Bridgeport hospital today, suffering from the effects of carbon monoxide which rendered them unconscious at the Undersefer home.

The name of the local all-out baby were on the danger list, although the condition of Mrs. Undersefer, and her daughter, was said to be "fair." Undersefer, however, was said to be in "very poor" condition.

The three adults were found lying on the floor, and the baby was unconscious in his crib at 11:30 p. m. yesterday when Mrs. Eneline Ptasnik, and Mrs. Undersefer's son, Raymond, arrived home.

Police Lt. Harry Dinan and Policeman William Troland reported after an investigation that the four apparently had been followed by gas seeping into upper rooms from the cellar where they found a heater which was not connected with a chimney.

Assembly to Pick Headquarters Site
London, Dec. 18.—(AP)—Choice of a permanent site for the permanent United Nations organization headquarters problem for the UNO headquarters, the Assembly which convenes Jan. 10, will be left up to the Preparatory Commission said today.

A sub-committee, which for the past three weeks has been hearing claims of 60 or more cities bidding for the UNO headquarters, will present its data to the general assembly committee Friday.

The official belief was that the committee would select five or six of the bidding cities and pass the final choice on to the assembly.

Some delegates were of the opinion that even the assembly might not be able to select a site at its first session.

British Delegate Philip J. Noel-Baker suggested informally that it might be desirable to select a temporary site in the United States before the final decision is made.

930 Labors Rewarded
Hartford, Dec. 18.—(AP)—Oliver Ober of New Haven, state chairman of the USO, was presented a certificate for "distinguished service" to the nation through USO's Governor Baldwin yesterday.

Senate Passes Resolution Favoring Free Entry for Jews
Washington, Dec. 18.—(AP)—A resolution calling on the government to "use its good offices" with Great Britain to permit the free entry of Jews into Palestine went to the House today hearing overwhelming Senate approval.

The possibility of a House vote before the holiday recess mounted as the Foreign Affairs committee considered the resolution. The committee heard a long list of witnesses support the measure yesterday.

Debate for Hours in Senate
The resolution has no effect other than to reflect congressional sentiment and the historical precedent in the Senate, however, and approval there came long after nightfall.

Chairman Connally (D., Tex.) of the Foreign Relations committee was the only senator heard to vote "No." He had voted against it in committee and told his colleagues President Truman didn't want the resolution, but he was "pursued" to do so.

Connally said that the president wanted to let a recently appointed committee investigate the situation in Palestine.

Beetles Jewish Persecution
After a preamble reciting Jewish persecution and the historical background of the Palestine immigration question, the resolution passed 77-17.

"That the interest shown by the United States in the problem is hereby commended and that the United States shall use its good offices with the mandatory power (Britain) to the end that the Jewish people shall be able to return to their country to the maximum of its agricultural and economic potentialities, and that there shall be full opportunity for colonization and development, so that they may freely proceed with the upbuilding of Palestine as the Jewish people desire, in association with all elements of the population, Sinuista movement as a democratic commonwealth in which all men, regardless of race or creed, shall be equal before the law," said the resolution.

Senator Hart (R-Conn.) tried unsuccessfully to amend the resolution so that the problem would be worked out with nations other than Britain, including the Arab states.

The resolution was sponsored by Senator Wagner (D-N.Y.) and Tarr (R-Ohio).

Food Found Over Ceiling
OFA Says Most of Merchants in Largest Cities Favor Curbs

Hartford, Dec. 17.—(AP)—The Office of Food Administration (OFA) says an "overwhelming majority" of merchants in Connecticut's two largest cities want OFA regulations continued, but they are not heading them 100 per cent.

Reporting the results of a survey, OFA State Director Stanley Crute said last night that five per cent of the city's retail stores, 27.5 per cent were being sold at higher than ceiling prices.

"Twenty-seven hundred food items were checked in 40 per cent of the stores in New Haven, and 22.5 per cent were being sold at prices above the ceiling price."

A survey of such household items as clothing, shoes, furniture and electrical appliances showed that five per cent of the stores in Hartford were being sold at higher than ceiling prices.

Price Violators Few
The OFA director asserted, however, that "price violations were actually very few, in comparison with the total number of items checked, and he reported that the average merchant is in favor of the continuance of price control, we discovered, although most retailers object to keeping technical records. They are at the same time fully cooperative with OFA regulations than ever before."

OFA officials said they will handle a few of the price violations uncovered by the survey, but the bulk of the violations reported by OFA are being handled by the city's health department.

Washington, Dec. 18.—(AP)—Fire of undetermined origin last night destroyed Leo Wright's three-story farmhouse at Lake Waramung. Fire Chief Clifford Chrosty estimated the loss of the recently remodelled dwelling at \$15,000.

Would Solve Own Problem
Baldwin Asks State Agencies to Aid on Housing Situation

Hartford, Dec. 18.—(AP)—Governor Baldwin asks state agencies to aid in solving the housing shortage in the state. He has asked the State and Forest commission, the controller of the State and State Development, to give consideration to the matter.

In brief, the governor wants to know whether Connecticut, on her own hook, can produce scarce building materials, including lumber, and he wants to make sure that the state isn't using material which could be utilized for housing for anything else.

This was the purpose of letters which had been sent to A. Raymond Kennedy, state forester; John M. Dove, state controller; and William Rogers, development commission chairman.

Four questions in letter: Four questions were contained in the letter to Kennedy which said: "One of the bottlenecks in meeting the housing shortage is the lack of building materials, particularly lumber. It is possible that some of these scarce materials might be produced right here in Connecticut."

Asks Review of Projects

The resolution has no effect other than to reflect congressional sentiment and the historical precedent in the Senate, however, and approval there came long after nightfall.

Chairman Connally (D., Tex.) of the Foreign Relations committee was the only senator heard to vote "No." He had voted against it in committee and told his colleagues President Truman didn't want the resolution, but he was "pursued" to do so.

Connally said that the president wanted to let a recently appointed committee investigate the situation in Palestine.

Beetles Jewish Persecution
After a preamble reciting Jewish persecution and the historical background of the Palestine immigration question, the resolution passed 77-17.

"That the interest shown by the United States in the problem is hereby commended and that the United States shall use its good offices with the mandatory power (Britain) to the end that the Jewish people shall be able to return to their country to the maximum of its agricultural and economic potentialities, and that there shall be full opportunity for colonization and development, so that they may freely proceed with the upbuilding of Palestine as the Jewish people desire, in association with all elements of the population, Sinuista movement as a democratic commonwealth in which all men, regardless of race or creed, shall be equal before the law," said the resolution.

Senator Hart (R-Conn.) tried unsuccessfully to amend the resolution so that the problem would be worked out with nations other than Britain, including the Arab states.

The resolution was sponsored by Senator Wagner (D-N.Y.) and Tarr (R-Ohio).
