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Polarization

A word that has bobbed to the surface quite frequently of late is "polarization." The Nixon Administration is accused of encouraging polarization. Vice President Agnew makes a speech in which he says it might be a good thing. Milton Eisenhower predicts that it will be the dominant characteristic of American society in the decade about to begin.

Polarization — the division of society into two directly opposing camps — is surely not a condition any nation can survive for very long. In our own history, the country became polarized geographically and economically in the mid-Nineteenth Century, and armed conflict was the result.

That discussion takes in a lot more. During the '60s, we have been told by one Presidential commission, the country began moving toward separate racial societies, one white and one black. The phrase "generation gap" became a tiresome cliché, but the division between some college-age youth and their elders seemed all too real and all too great to be discounted.

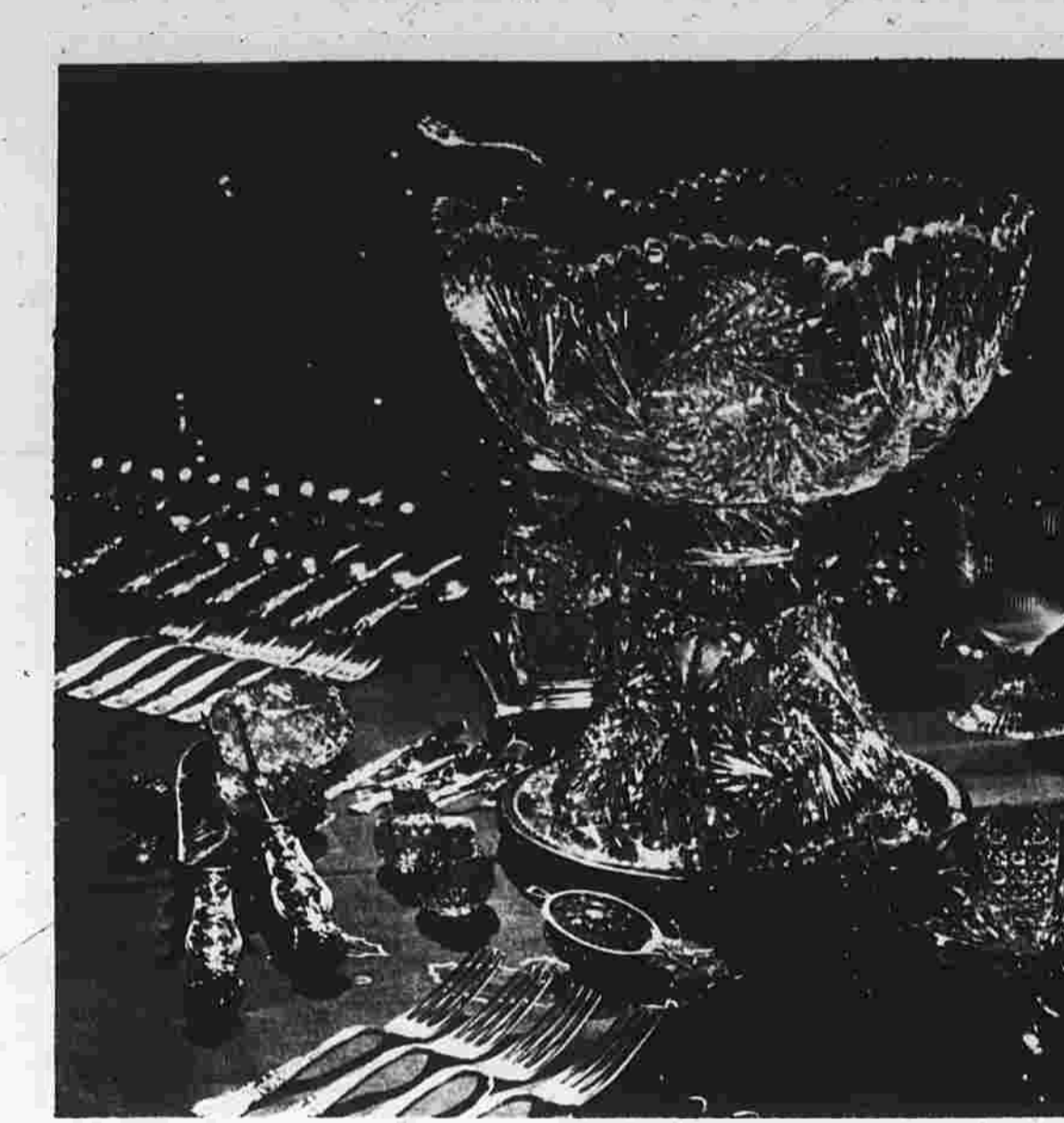
Few institutions were spared. Colleges literally became battlefields. The very places in which Americans chose to live, or found it necessary to live, are now symbols of the great division between city dweller and suburbanite.

To make the outlook more foreboding, so many diverse elements of society seem to be lining up together on a variety of issues. The chairman who is the proponent of a "new theology," for example, is also quick to condemn the nation's "virtually total" opposition to U.S. involvement in Vietnam.

Like-wise, the segment of the population variously known as the "forgotten Americans," "middle America," and "the silent majority" is supposedly monolithic in its "whiteness," its contempt for the young, its hawkishness, its indignation of the plight of the very poor.

The great divisions, then, do seem to be forming into one great division. The threat of polarization does seem to loom large.

But wait. The dire predictions are not always purely motivated. It is no new device of political rhetoric to accuse the opposition of seeking to divide the country. And those whose gloomy forecasts are sincere would do well to pause and take a closer look.

WASHINGTON — When conversation switched to the 1970 Congressional elections at a recent White House breakfast, Sen. Robert Dole of Kansas turned to President Nixon and said: "Next to you, Mr. President, Agnew is the one Republican who can get money for us without carrying a gun."

But no such caution is reining in Agnew. As Mr. Nixon's campaign spear point, Agnew steadily has had a dozen state-wide fund-raising dinners on his schedule, and they include some places where he would not have been entirely welcome last summer.

Agnew's long-postponed decision to star at the Minnesota Republican party's statewide fund-raising dinner in St. Paul on Feb. 20, for example, has stirred only minimal comment from liberal party elements.

Agnew is also being pressed to come into New York state anytime between now and late April to raise money for the Suffolk County Republican Committee.

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Ahern Denies Offer of Job in Cleveland

NEW HAVEN, Conn. (AP) — New Haven Police Chief James P. Ahern says he met with Cleveland officials for two days this week, but he denies that he has been offered a job as police chief or safety director in the Ohio city.

He has denied a newspaper report that two other large cities had offered him top police posts. The New Haven Register said it had learned that Ahern had been offered the \$2,000-a-year post now held by Cleveland Police Chief Patrick Gerety, or the \$25,000-a-year safety director post, which is vacant.

Officials in Cleveland would not confirm that Ahern had been offered a police post in the newspaper said. Ahern, 37, has headed New Haven's 400-man force for the past two years. The Cleveland force numbers 2,400 men.

He would say only that he visited Cleveland Monday and Tuesday as guest of the city for discussion of police problems, and he said recent visits to New Haven by Cleveland officials were for the same reason.

"I am a life-long resident of New Haven and I have no intention of leaving," he added.

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Turns Up As Church Pastor

FRIDAY HARBOR, Wash. (AP) — Ferdinand Waldo DeMars, known as "The Great Imposter," has turned up as the pastor of the San Juan Baptist Church, the Seattle Times said Wednesday.

DeMars is known here as the Rev. Dr. Fred W. DeMars, the Times said. He arrived about a month ago to preside in the 20-member Conservative Baptist Church.

He also has been an evangelist in a Los Angeles Skid Row mission, a postulant in a small interfaith monastery at Weymouth, and operator of a boys' camp near Placerville, Calif.

He was the subject of a 1961 movie called "The Great Imposter," starring Tony Curtis. His discharge from the Royal Canadian Navy and deportation to the United States brought him national notice in 1963 when it was discovered he had impersonated a surgeon and performed successful surgery on a Korean war wounded.

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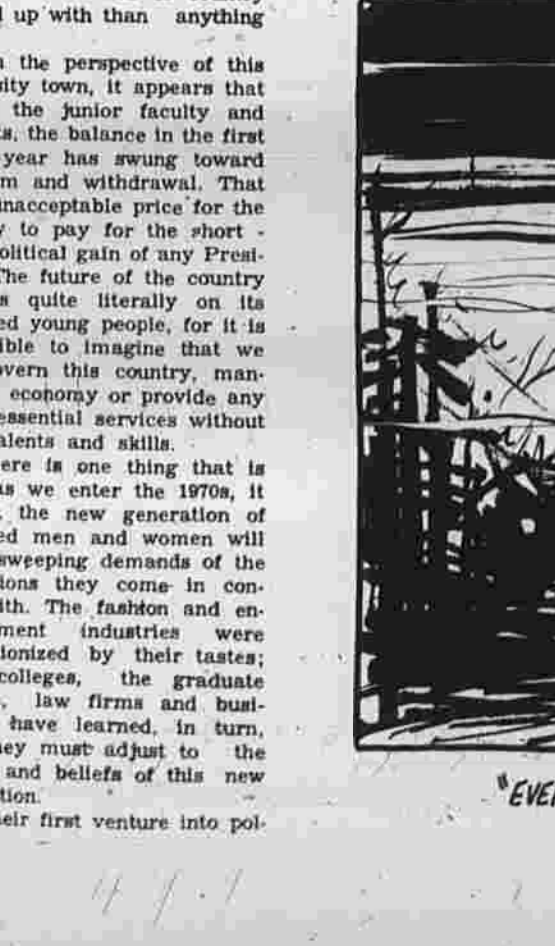

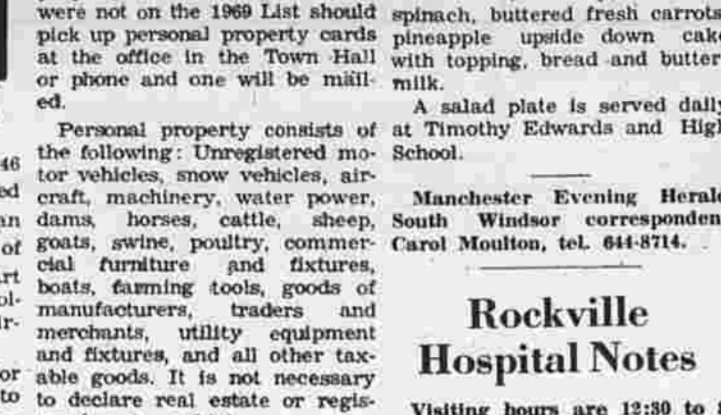

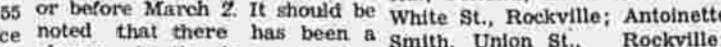
