Reds May Launch New Laos Offensive

VIENTIANE (AP) — Western military observers in Laos say indicators point to a dry season offensive next month by the North Vietnamese and the Pathet Lao to recapture the strategic Plain of Jars.

They cite increased supply truck traffic, Communist propaganda, announcing or predicting victory and the movement of the country of fresh North Vietnamese regulars, including Jan. 20.

It is beginning in its usual fashion and will pick up in tempo, say Western observers. "The Communists will follow their usual pattern of seizing objectives in five-year increments," military experts say. "The most important so far—excepting pressure by the North Vietnamese against seven forces along Route Seven, a main supply channel from North Vietnam to the plateau in northern Laos which gets its name from huge burial jars there.

Although a dry season offensive is an annual feature of the war in Laos, the government for the first time in five years holds the plain at the onset of the fighting season. Aided by heavy U.S. fighter-bomber attacks, a force of U.S.-advised "Mekong" troops captured the plateau last summer in a surprise counter-offensive. The North Vietnamese abandoned large stocks of supplies as they withdrew.

Now the North Vietnamese are moving forces to the rear, back with the capture of Route Seven their primary objective, according to observers in Vientiane.

Despite the loss of one key position, a rise known as Phou Nong Kook, or Woodpecker Hill, the government forces still control enough strategic points to deny the enemy their necessary logistic pipeline to the Plain of Jars.

Three North Vietnamese battalions attacked one battalion of Gen. Yang Pa'o Moon on Woodpecker Hill, and about 700 of the North Vietnamese were killed in a month of sustained fighting, according to official sources.

"The fight for that hill decided between 1 1/2 and 2 1/2 enemy battalions and 100 of our own," but they didn't quit until they took it. That indicates a great deal about their intentions.

By regaining Route Seven, the Communist could supply continuing operations against the plain. It would be in a position to take over the plain itself.

Some 20,000 North Vietnamese troops reportedly occupy a crescent of territory around the northern rim of the plain. About 10,000 are said to be in forward positions.

The government holds numerous strategic hill positions in the same area, and the fighting most likely would shift to them if the enemy recovers its Route Seven supply artery.

Depending upon action taken by the Planning and Zoning Commission after Monday's public hearings, about 300 new apartment units could be added to the more than 3,000 units either built, under construction, or approved for construction in Manchester.

Four petitions will be heard by the commission Monday night—three of them will concern group dwellings.

The first is for a zone change from Rural Residence to Residential A for a 28-acre parcel fronting on 216 feet on the south side of Wetherell St. near 200 Wetherell St. About 280 apartment units could be put on the land. The application is signed by Michael Swetec.

The expansion of the St. Michael's apartment complex on Oakland St. by some 20 units will be the second item of consideration. Brownstone, owned by Gardner Cigman, is the smallest of the three adjacent apartment complexes on Oakland St. Even with the expansion it will remain the smallest.

The new units will cover a 2 1/2 acre area to the rear of the existing complex.

Whether about 15 apartment units will be built on 1 1/2 acre piece between Hilliard St. and Western St. will be the third matter for consideration.

The applicant is Barney T. Peterman.

Under the same change and the special permits are granted by the commission a total of about 317 new apartment units could be built.

The fourth item concerns a minor change in the regulations pertaining to cross reference. When one section concerning group dwellings was changed, the other section became incorrect.

Hughes argued so little is known about marijuana that even the reduced penalties in the original bill are not justified, but Sen. Thomas J. Dodd, floor manager of the measure, didn't agree.

Dodd pointed his desk with what he said was a marijuana brick worth \$2,000. He contended the law "should make it clear smoking the drug 'is not a schoolboy penalty'."

The Connecticut Democrat said the bill would remove uncertainty of the current law. "It will do away with the youngster who experiments with a marijuana cigarette, but who doesn't ruin him for life," Dodd told the Senate.

"On the other hand, it imposes severe punishment for the professional criminal who makes his living by selling marijuana and other drugs to our young people."

"Generally marijuana is a mild drug," Hughes argued. "It is not a narcotic. It is not the individual or to society with hard drugs has no basis at all."

Authors of the 100-page, administration-backed bill said they had two goals: "To provide new penalties and tools for a crackdown on professional criminal trafficking in drugs and to substitute the opportunity of rehabilitation for jail for young people experimenting with drugs."

The bill would make it a misdemeanor to possess marijuana for a person's own use. A first offender could have the violation erased from his record if he lived up to conditions a court might impose.

A conviction for a second offense would carry a penalty of up to double that imposed on first offenders.

A professional criminal—defined in the bill as a person over 21 who with at least five other persons has acted to organize, supervise or manage illegal drug traffic—would face much tougher penalties. A first conviction could carry a prison term of from five years to life.

The bill sets up a commission to study the effects of marijuana and provides for creation of a listing of narcotics, drugs and substances that would be regulated in the United States and could not be imported.

The 547-page bill would be no-knock provision in the bill was proposed by Sen. Sam J. Ervin, D-N.C., who contended it violated the Fourth Amendment's guarantee against invasion of privacy and unreasonable search and seizure.

Although Ervin lost the no-knock clause was restricted by a floor amendment to allow such warrants only on clear evidence the narcotics would be destroyed if suspects were given any chance at all to do so.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Here are major provisions of the drug control bill passed by the Senate Wednesday:

—Mandatory minimum penalties to be abolished for all except one class of persons convicted of federal drug violations.

—The bill prescribes severe penalties—ranging to life imprisonment and a \$100,000 fine—for "professional criminals" convicted of large-scale narcotic violations.

—Federal magistrates would be authorized to issue "no-knock" search warrants to agents who can show that evidence is likely to be destroyed if they knock before entering a suspect's home.

—A commission would be set up, its members appointed by the attorney general, to recommend the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, by the effect and nature of marijuana.

—The bill provides for semi-annual subsidies regarding the import, manufacture and distribution of specified drugs, narcotics and dangerous substances.

—Manufacturers of prescription drugs deemed subject to criminal trafficking in drugs and to substitute the opportunity of rehabilitation for jail for young people experimenting with drugs.

—Judgments to be made under the bill primarily in the hands of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare experts rather than the Justice Department.

Arms Industry Is Booming For the French

PARIS (AP) — The French arms industry is flying high, and not just with Mirages. France sells arms to 80 countries, against the competition of salesmen from the United States, Britain and the Soviet Union.

The sale of 100 Mirage jets to Libya has dispelled the gloom that followed last year, as France's biggest military customer.

Frenchmen argue the morality of supplying Arab states while refusing even spare parts to Israel, but most agree it's good business.

The defense minister, Michel Debré, has set the tone: "A big arms industry is possible only on condition that there are exports. It is a phenomenon that can be regretted, but it is striking."

Aircraft orders dropped sharply when Charles de Gaulle, viewing Israel as an aggressor in the 1967 war, embargoed shipment of 80 Mirages that Israel had paid for. That led potential customers fear that their orders might be blocked for political reasons.

Now De Gaulle is gone and Libya is turning its call into Mirages. The Sud Aviation company's Marcel Dassault says his capacity is booked for five years. Aviation sources guess that about \$150 million is involved in the Libyan deals.

France's arms customers range from the Irish army to the Pakistani army. Arab accounted for about 5 per cent of exports in 1968, and 22 per cent of the mechanical equipment exported. Fallout from the Israeli embargo caused a big drop in orders last year; but the aircraft industry the loss was about 52 per cent compared with 1968.

But 1968 had been a record year, with orders of \$41-million for aircraft, land weapons, electronics and ships. Estimates for 1969 total \$450 million, about half for aircraft.

If they don't sign a customer, the French argue, someone else will. The Soviet Union, for example, placed its MIG-21 jet fighters in 22 countries.

Mirages have been sold to Israel, Lebanon, Libya, Pakistan, Australia, South Africa, Switzerland, Belgium and Peru.

Others include Iraq, Spain, Argentina, Brazil, Greece.

French helicopters hunt guerrillas in Portuguese Guinea, and New Guinea. Missiles, offered in a wide range, have been sold to Greece and South Africa. A leading sales point is a guarantee the missiles will fire after five years in stock.

The 4.8-ton Panhard armored car is sold to 11 countries. Gunboats faster than those involved in the recent Cherbouge incident are being made for Tunisia and Senegal. Submarines go to South Africa, Portugal and Pakistan.

As a response to Pakistan's three French-built submarines, France, its third, and a 2,300-ton sub from the Soviet Union. It is negotiating for rocket-firing landing craft and patrol vessels. Egypt last year ordered several patrol craft, 10 landing craft, 10 landing craft of various classes, and three rocket-firing destroyers.
