

Finch Squelches Order to Report Press Contacts

WASHINGTON (AP) - Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare Robert H. Finch has apparently killed in infancy a policy calling for written detailed reports on all contacts between government and officials of one HEW agency.

Stating "I would like to reiterate my full endorsement of the principle of freedom of information," Finch squelched Friday the month-old National Institute of Mental Health order.

Finch's action rescinded the Jan. 16 directive of NIMH chief Stanley F. Yeltes ordering all officials to identify reporters they talk to, detail the questions asked and information sought and list the specific information requested.

This memorandum was issued without my knowledge and in violation of department policy," Finch said.

Marshals Guard U.S. Attorney After Threats

NEWARK, N.J. (AP) - U.S. Atty. Frederick B. Lacey, who is leading a campaign against organized crime in New Jersey, has closed his family and office guard by federal marshals because of threats.

Lacey said Friday at a news conference that his office had received threats against him and his family in the form of anonymous mail, and when the threats were ignored "my mother's home was robbed."

The U.S. attorney said that later he was approached by a top Mafia figure, under indictment by his office, and told that "certain elements were threatening to harm one of his sons."

He said the meeting followed a letter from the Mafia threatening to harm one of his sons.

Lacey said that as a result of the threats he permitted the U.S. attorney general "to install United States marshals in Newark and Jersey City."

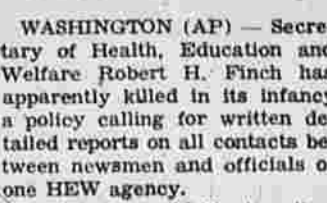

Who'll Be Huntley To David Brinkley?

NEW YORK (NEA) — One of America's august television acts, "The Huntley-Brinkley Report," is breaking up. After 14 years, the Huntley half of the hyphen is leaving.

Since 1956, the supertime faces of Chet Huntley and David Brinkley have flickered information into approximately 20 million living rooms, Monday through Friday. (My grandmother often claimed Brinkley's voice was a digestive aid.) They have lived through triumph and tragedy with housewives and husbands who, from their easy chairs, have watched two young newscasters wrinkle and protrude into middle age.

In rural America, roadways

and bridges and no few pet chickens have been named Huntley-Brinkley and/or Huntley and Brinkley. Now, Chet Huntley, 58, reportedly is going home to raise cattle in Montana and maybe run for senator.

In New York and—as Lowell Thomas used to say on radio—around the world, the report has prompted considerable speculation concerning Huntley's successor.

What man, it is asked, would mesh with Brinkley's personality the way Huntley did?

Brinkley, 49, is a sophisticated, fairly witty fellow, given to grins on occasion. Huntley, is a straight-faced poker player and a cattle rancher who doesn't mind infrequent charges of conflict of interest. (Some legislators say Huntley uses his broadcasts in attack of legislation that would trim the beef industry.)

Variety, the show business newspaper, recently printed a headline which read: "Who'll Replace Chet? New Guessing Game."

Networks Preparing New Shows

By JERRY BUCK

NEW YORK (AP) — In private suites and viewing rooms at ABC, CBS and NBC, network executives are making the final decisions on the program schedules for next season.

They are looking at dozens of pilot films and presentations, from among which they will select next fall's new shows. The selections probably will be announced by the networks next week.

Six shows have already been inked into the new schedules.

NBC is replacing Debbie Reynolds and "I Dream of Jeannie" with a Don Knotts variety hour. CBS has Andy Griffith and Mary Tyler Moore returning in two situation comedies.

ABC is bringing back Danny Thomas in "Make Room for Granddaddy" and has signed Tony Randall and Jack Klugman for "The Odd Couple." A show is being readied for Pearl Bailey, but it may be held over until next January.

Possibly as many as 20 shows may be scuttled by the networks to make room for the new programs.

The most likely candidates are those in the bottom third of the Nielsen ratings, although one or two with potential may be saved.

An active report in the industry is that CBS, which has all but lost the ratings race to NBC for the first time in 14 years, will begin to abandon its rural image. Such shows as "Petticoat Junction" and "Green Acres" may be dropped.

Other shows in danger at CBS include "Lancer," "Get Smart," "When in Rome" and Tim Conway's midseason replacement.

NBC has fewer candidates for oblivion. Besides Debbie Reynolds and "Jeannie," shows in trouble are "Then Came Bronson," "Bracken's World," "Daniel Boone" and "My World

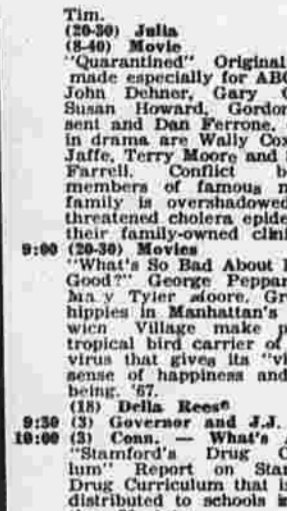

and Welcome to It." The latter may be a show saved by its ratings network in hope that its ratings will improve. It's possible, too, that "The Virginian" may be shaved from 90 minutes to an hour.
NBC also has waiting in the wings 13 completed episodes of a comedy starring Millicent Martin.
ABC has the most shows with academic ratings. Among them are "Land of the Giants," Pat Paulsen, "Paris 7000," "The Flying Nun," "The Ghost and Mrs. Muir," "Here Come the Brides," "The Brandy Bunch," "Love American Style" and Engelbert Humperdinck.
"SPX-San Francisco Airport" is mentioned as a likely replacement for "Daniel Boone" and a Film Wilson variety hour for "Bracken's World."
A number of situation comedies are being shown to the networks, including an all-black version of "Barefoot in the Park."
CBS, in line with reports it will shuck its old image, is looking at a number of one-hour dramas of people who are involved with the times, such as "Storefront Lawyer," "Crisis Clinic," and "Shepherd's Flock." The latter is about a minister involved in social work.

Dick Van Dyke: Looking Ahead

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — A farsighted fellow is Van Dyke. For example: He is now taping a CBS special with Bill Cosby, which will not appear on the network until November.

He is also doing introductions to the CBS showings of "Born Free," scheduled to be a Christmas attraction for years to come, in the manner of "The Wizard of Oz."

He is discussing with Carl Reiner the format for the new Van Dyke television series, which will be on CBS in the 1971-72 season.

Besides these things, Van Dyke is looking ahead to his retirement from films, which he says will occur after he concludes his two remaining commitments with Disney and the Mirisch Company.

All this seems highly visionary, except for the fact that Dick Van Dyke usually ends up

accomplishing what he plans to do. Many a beleaguered city dweller talks about escaping the urban mess. Dick did it.

"Some friends told us about this marvelous country in Arizona," he related. "My wife and I went down there, and we fell in love with the place. It's ranch country 45 miles north of Phoenix and 2,600 feet higher, so it is green though still desert. We bought a place that is 180 acres and has a little creek running through it.

"At first my wife and I thought we would use it as a retirement home. But the kids outvoted us. They wanted to move down there right away."

The Van Dykes sold their Encino home and became permanent Arizonans last June. Two of the sons go to college here, and the daughters, 15 and 8, live on the ranch. Dick said he had no problem keeping busy. One of his past passions is archaeology. He and his wife spend hours digging in the remains of a thousand-year-old Indian civilization which he found on his property.

Until last October, he saw little of the Arizona ranch, since he was making three films last year. The latest was "Cold Turkey." "I play a sanctimonious minister, and if I did the job right, people are going to hate me."

He was scheduled to make "I Do, I Do" this year, but it was canceled amid the panic over costly films. "Why a two-character movie should be so expensive, I can't imagine," he said.

At any rate, he doesn't miss filmmaking: "I've never really felt comfortable in movies. Well, maybe in this last one. I guess after doing so many pictures I stored up in my cortex some knowledge of what to do. But film acting is still some-
