Mr. Watts has a reputation as a technician and he negotiated the notes last evening in acceptable fashion but without the elan that should go with these display pieces. I suppose he thought he was safe in his shallow pianism. Mr. Watts offered a program chosen entirely from the music of Franz Liszt. Just why, remains an unanswered question. Last has not been looked on with favor as a composer for many years, and has been relegated to the status that occasionally one of his compositions is trotted out as an added virtue to a program by some virtuoso with technique to burn.

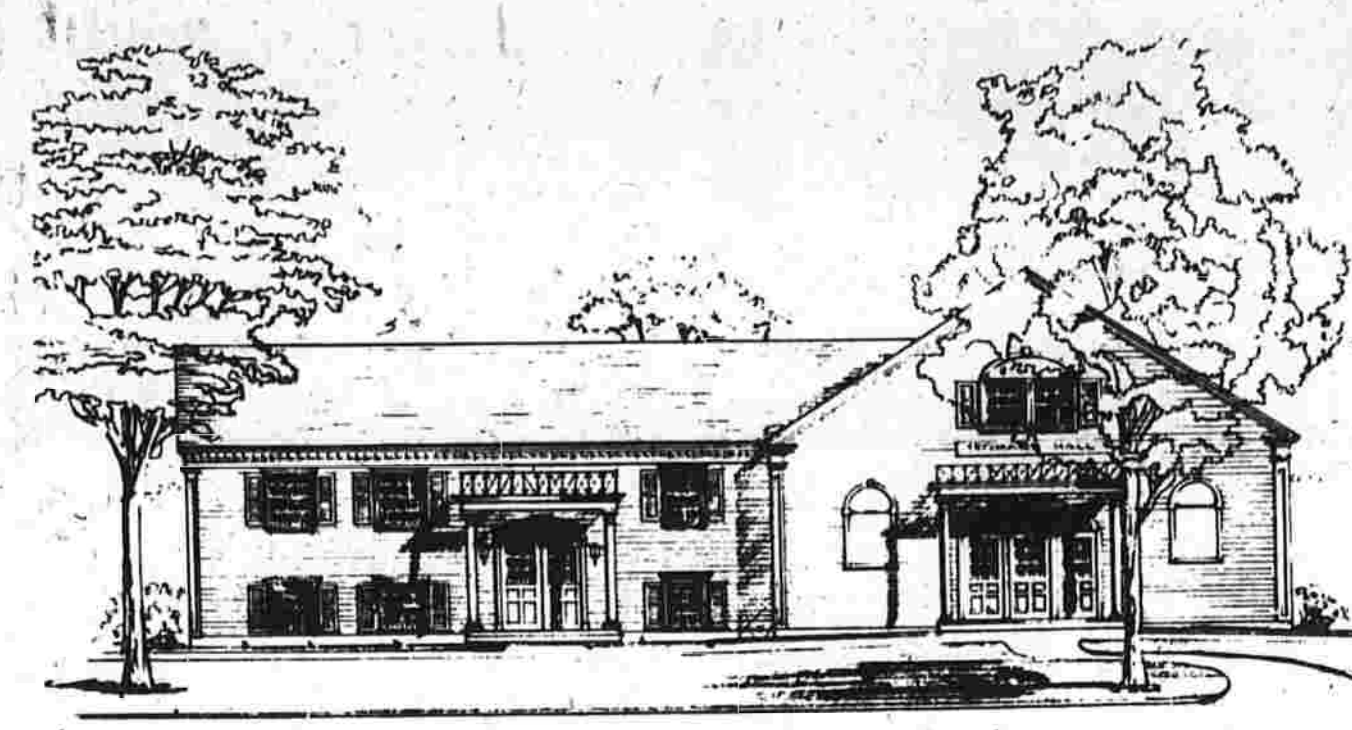

WASHINGTON—The Washington branch of the Women's Liberation Movement (WLM) is one of the most active in the country. Probably only Boston's Women's Lib, which draws recruits from a score of colleges and universities, can claim as many members.

Women's Lib here has picked D.C. General for its abortion policies; it ran a day care center during the November election; it disrupted the November hearing on the birth control pill to protest that only men were listening and testifying about the pill's safety when women were the "guinea pigs."

It has approximately 2,000 "hard core" activists, its pill and abortion protesting has attracted another 250 to its mailing lists. As ongoing activities, it runs an abortion counseling service, offers a free course on women's history and problems and runs a Washington area free university and recently began publishing a tabloid called "OH Our Backs."

One Lib member asserted, "Right now, we're the only really active radical group in town."

Who are its members? The founding members of the Washington branch, like those of other groups across the country, came mostly out of the student, peace and civil rights movements.

Its membership includes students, housewives, government workers, professional women and a contingent from Takoma Park, Md., commuters.

It includes few blacks. "We'd like to have black women in our movement," one member said. "But we understand it when they say they're fighting something of a 'matrimarchy' problem. Black women are currently more interested in building pride in their men, than in asserting their rights as women."

Members here are almost all under 30, and are elsewhere, married and unmarried women.
